





Mid-South Lions Spring 2024 NEWS

Fellow Lions and Friends:

As we head into another year of service to those in need, there's lots of important news I need to share with you. Some of it involves addressing our matching LCIF grant request, some of it involves more fundraising activities, and some of it involves events that are coming up. My apologies for the lengthy email but I wanted to get all this important information to you today. Please read all the way through for an inspirational quote at the end. Thanks.

1) We are in the midst of trying to raise \$80,000 to match a potential LCIF grant. We are getting closer as we have already raised over \$60,000. If we are successful in this effort, we'll be able to purchase a new Autoclave (about \$50,000). But the most exciting and important news is that we'll be the first center in the world to receive the newest technology for retina and cataract surgeries. The new Alcon Unity will help our surgeons provide the most up-to-date technique in addressing retinal detachments and cataracts with ONE piece of equipment. Our partner Dr. Steve Charles is the pioneer in this field and will be the first recipient of this new device...IF we can raise the funds to purchase it. Once it's in house, the surgery center will provide our patients with \$160,000 in surgeries—OVER150 patients can be treated with this agreement! 
