

PID Wayne Heiman presented a check for \$150,000 from the Lions Pride Endowment Fund, Director Dave Abstetar presented a check for \$14,4012 from the New Berlin Lions Corn Roast proceeds at the State Fair, and Director Jim Fletcher presented a check for \$300 from the Monticello Lions Club. The Monticello Club's contribution was from a special project initiated by the club President.

The five WLF Project budgets, along with the combined WLF budget, for 2023 were discussed in detail and passed. 



LEBW Report

Cabinet Meeting January 29, 2023

The LEBW Board of Directors met virtually on January 24. Overall, 2022 was a good year for the LEBW. The number of donors was back to the pre-Covid 19 level, with 1,030 donors. A total of 2,058 corneas were recovered and 1,616 were placed for transplant. 722 were transplanted in Wisconsin, 155 in other U S locations. 739 were shipped internationally to 45 different countries.

The number of Transport legs in 2022 was 1,732 by 358 Lions Clubs vs 1,394 and 294 in 2021.

The LEBW is proceeding with the interactive Donor Wall Recognition Project which will highlight financial donors, cornea donors, and spotlight recipients. This is scheduled to be operational around July 1. The current system of having small plaques on the wall will soon be limited by space available.

The Memorial Garden committee is meeting with an architect to develop a proposal for a memorial garden to be located near the building and adjacent to the street. The plan is expected to be developed over the next few months.

Club donations have been slow. Six clubs in the District have donated to date. We are at 22% of the District 27-E2 goal of \$12,000. Please encourage your clubs to continue to contribute.


