We filled them with markers, paper, toys, stuffed animals, stress balls, clay, pens, color books, colored pencils, and more. We have delivered most of them to hospitals to replenish their supplies. All facilities tell us how grateful they are for the Smile bags. We would love to continue this service project in the future.

At our last Cabinet meeting we voted to help a family who had a child with cancer in Fairchild. PDG Ronda was finally connected to the mother of the child, Connor, this past Monday night. They are in need of some help. We will be working with them to assist. She did mention they could use help with a mortgage payment. PDG Ronda explained our protocol with payments.

PDG Ronda was also notified about a person in the Ellsworth area that is dealing with cancer. UPDATE: we have been told that the Ellsworth Club is helping that person.

We have also have been notified of an Elk Mound teenager who is 18 years old with cancer. The Elk Mound Club is assisting us to see where help maybe needed.

PDG Dave Lee is the new Childhood Cancer Chairperson for the State. He is proposing we do an accruing fund for the state and will be bringing his proposal to the Council of Governor's meeting on July 22, 2023. We will give more information on this proposal at our next cabinet meeting in October, if not before.

Currently in Wisconsin 1 in 14 people (427,380 people) are facing hunger and of those 1 in 9 are children (142,050 children). Hunger is definitely an issue in our state, but the needs and challenges of each community vary. Even in large cities the needs can be different from neighborhood to neighborhood.

When we look for ways to serve hunger needs, volunteering and donating to food banks and pantries immediately comes to mind. But I hope to challenge clubs to go a step further and become educated on the unique needs in their own community. Then find creative ways to make a positive impact to meet those various needs, such as:

- Raising awareness to dispel stereotypes, stigma and misconceptions about hunger and poverty
- Leveraging social media or other outreach tools to provide information for food distribution dates/times, and information on other nutrition programs in the community
- Support the local grassroots movements of other groups or individuals working to fight hunger issues
- Develop plans for a community garden
- Identify food waste situations and reduce waste with food rescue plan






Lion Dennis Sykora's District Governor pin ... "Lend a Helping Hand"
