

Motion made to review the Constitution and By-laws to change the date and location of the WLF Annual Meeting starting year 2020.

Appreciation patches will be changed to all have the same colored border to save costs in creating them.

Lions Camp for Kids raffle tickets are available to be distributed. Drawing will be September 13, 2019 at 1 pm at the WLF office.

Birch Sturm golf outing will take place July 20, 2019.

Deer hides were still coming in as of our last board meeting. Last date to turn in hides was January 18, 2019.

Visitor days reservations began January 9, 2019. An additional visitor day has been added Saturday, August 24, 2019.

Eye glass recycling report – from July 2018-November 2018 we have collected over 310,000 pairs of used eyeglasses. Minnesota Lions delivered 109,850 pairs of used eyeglasses on November 1st. Minnesota Lions have collected and donated over 11,026,818 pairs since 1993.

Vision Screening – since July 1st, 33,782 children have been screened. 3,224 of those children were referred.

Phase 1 of the challenge course is complete and the 2nd phase is being worked on. A resolution will be submitted to be voted on at the State Convention to spend over \$100,000 to work on the zip line and other parts of the Challenge course.

A new furnace was installed in the Dining Hall on December 7th.

27-E2 HEARING COMMITTEE REPORT
Cabinet meeting: March 31, 2019

Four requests have come in for hearing aids since July 1st of which two were approved for an aid, and another was approved at the 140-200% of poverty level, whereby they can receive aids at their expense at a much reduced WLF-negotiated cost. The other was disapproved because of income considerably above the 200% of poverty level.

Because of the low number of applications received the past several years, we currently have funds to cover about twenty-nine additional aids, at \$900 per aid. As stated on my previous report, because of the large amount of reserve, if clubs have a better use/more urgent need for their contributions, I suggested reducing their hearing aid fund contributions for this year.

Accordingly, as shown on the attached record of individual club contributions for the past twelve years, contributions for the year are ~\$2,000 less than last year, as many clubs have reduced or stopped their contribution. I continue to recommend reductions until our reserve is down significantly..

I recommend that Lions Clubs make efforts to reach out to their communities to inform the hard-of-hearing in their area of our assistance for those who are financially needy.

Lion Aschliman gave a report from 2020 Tournament Host, Bear Creek/Caroline Lions. Tournament dates are set for February 15, 2020 through April 5, 2020. Doubles & Singles Shifts will run Saturdays, 11am and 3pm. Team Shifts on Sundays will be 10am and 2pm.

Merrill Lions have submitted the necessary application forms to host the 2021 State Tournament. Lion Christianson has visited Lincoln Lanes in Merrill and completed the site inspection. All necessary requirements have been met. Lion Voight will contact the State Elections Chair and State Convention Chair to add Merrill to the State Election Ballot for Bowling 2021.

Lion Voight distributed a draft of a new 1-page Tournament Entry Form. After some discussion it was decided that a "non-sanctioned" average should be added to the bowling application. Lion Voight will make that change and forward copies to the Committee. Committee members are asked to review the new form and it will be discussed at the May meeting.

PDG Jim Noll provided a draft of the Proposed Policy Manual changes for the Bowling Committee to review at the Winter Meeting. Committee members reviewed and decided that everything was in line with the current Bowling Committee procedures. Lion Voight will respond to PDG Noll.

We are now just under three quarters into our Lions year. I would suspect that all clubs have done some form of service by this time. Unfortunately, that is not the case per reporting via MyLion App and MyLCI.

For 2018-2019 as of 03/24/2019:

32 of 46 Clubs have reported 540 service activities for 15,397 Lion hours serving 53,513 people.

With 1,672 Lions in the district, this is an average of 1 lion serving 32 people for just under three quarters of the year.

Lions of E2 have planted 1 tree, raised \$216,602, and donated \$86,830.

The big thing in our multiple is Lions Planting Trees in Wisconsin. Each club is asked to plant at least one tree between May 1st 2018 and May 1st, 2020. We want to keep track of the quantity planted. There are approximately 523 clubs in the state, so, that's a nice total. There are upwards of 18,000 Lions in Wisconsin. How fabulous to have a tree planted by each Lion!! You can report trees planted to me, tia1937@yahoo.com or to your club secretary.

Trees can be planted on public grounds or on private grounds. Make sure you get permission to plant either way. Suggestions are planting at hospitals, parks, day care centers, Main Street projects, libraries or in your own back yard. We will have a limited supply of bare root trees at the State Convention in May or you can get your own through your local forester or The Arbor Day Foundation. This is not a labor intensive or expensive project. Maybe you want to partner with others, i.e. Boy or Girl Scouts, Boys or Girls Clubs, school projects etc.
