We await Spring to continue our Multiple project of "Lions Planting Trees in Wisconsin." Our count hovers around 10,000 trees planted. Thanks to Lions who reported their counts and to clubs who have reported. Our Multiple will continue to plant trees into the Centennial Year so get on board with us. Report any trees planted to me, tia1937@yahoo.com or to your DG or to your District Environmental Rep.

World Earth Day will get a nod at the State Convention. We will feature a seminar about the history of the origin of Earth Day in Wisconsin. The luncheon table decorations will be natural and table gifts will be rock paper weights, painted by each district. Some districts are having day care help painting the rocks as well as kindergarten classes and library projects. Lions, Lioness and Leos are participating too. For ideas, Google 'painted rocks' and investigate what you or your group are capable of. Keep it simple and colorful. Thank you for doing this. Let me know how you are doing for numbers of rocks painted. We need 600 so each district should provide 60. Rocks are available at craft stores or landscape areas or perhaps from a farmer friend who will share a field with you or on the internet.

Don't forget our pollinators, the bees. Leave the first lawn mowing for an extra week. Dandelions are the first source of food for bees in the Spring. Rethink how much pesticide you need around your property and use it sparingly, preferably in the evening so the morning dew can dissipate some of it. Try using the vinegar solution for getting rid of weeds. 1 gallon of vinegar, 1 1/2 cups of Epsom Salts and 2 Tablespoons of blue Dawn dishwashing liquid. I have good luck with this. Put in a hand sprayer and use it all summer.

Keep feeding the birds. They are beautiful. Use a heater in a bird bath so they can drink all winter and bathe themselves. The Baltimore Orioles will arrive in no time. If you feed them, be ready. They are heavy feeders and love grape jelly. Kudos to whomever sees the first Robin and all the other feathered friends we love to see.

Consider planting a butterfly garden. You can become an official butterfly garden or you can plant flowers that attract butterflies. Choose a spot. It doesn't have to be big. Be sure to plant a few milkweed for sure. It is the only food monarch caterpillars eat. Also zinnias, lantanas, Phlox, Black Eyed Susan, Pot Marigolds, verbena, to name a few. I have a 4x8 foot area with nothing but zinnias and it is always full of butterflies in summer. I can work close by and they are not threatened. Wonderful.

Please recycle. It's the right thing to do. Wisconsin does a good job of making recycling available to the citizens. All municipalities, counties, villages, etc., have a recycling spot near to citizens.

Be good stewards of our world, our Earth. It's the only one we have. We need clean waterways, good soil, and fresh air. Everyone do their part.

This the report to the cabinet meeting of MD27 E2, held March 8 2020.

I had a Zone meeting for R2Z2 on February 25, 2020 at The Cove in Buffalo City at 6:30 pm

We had 3 clubs attend (Cochrane Buffalo City, Fountain City, and Fountain City Farm Fest) with a total of 9 people include lion Judy and myself. This was the first meeting where we had a good number of lions together in order to understand what their needs are, and they were very upfront about what they wanted and the problems that they are having.

We talked about Champaign 100, about vision, Childhood cancer, as well as other programs that LCIF and LCI have. We talked about the District and then about the club level too. There was also discussion on both the District and State Golf outings this year, Fountain City Club asked about applying maybe next year at the convention for hosting a District Golf outing.

At the Club level the clubs are all looking for new members younger and we talked about different ways things to try in order to active those goals, with all clubs saying they do have new prospects but just haven't got them to make the final step of filling out the application. They also were asking about Leo's clubs and how they are our future in Lions and wondering if anything was being done to help start more in order to help them move in the future into lions to help us grow. Handed out my report that I presented at the cabinet meeting. We discussed how I did my report, and how I evaluated each club. We discussed ways to recruit new members and how to keep members, and to make sure that you report to your MMR, and service activitys.

Any problems or issues facing your clubs? All clubs said Membership is number 1 and trying to figure out how to use the new website. All Clubs said it's very frustrating and hard to use.

Childhood Cancer: Talked about the room at Marshfield Hospital we as Lions clubs are helping set up for kids with pediatric cancer. Told zoon members about the matching grants that have been applied for

and that this area will have a sign that says it was donated by the Lions of 27-E2. Encouraged clubs to donate if they could.

Diabetes Awareness: Dr Bob has received \$3325 in contributions for camp Needlepoint/Daypoint. Lion Beth Okas and Lion Nan Dolphin (Our new co-chairs for Diabetes Awareness) they will come to any club and do a presentation if you would like.

District Convention: Will be held March 20-21 at the Lismore. The theme for Friday night is ugly Christmas sweaters. Registration is \$15 for Lions and guests. Leos fee is \$2. And first timers will be \$10. Saturday, lunch is \$16, banquet is \$23. District pin is \$3, and rooms are \$119. Guest speaker will be International Director Michael Banks. Seminar topics are still in the works.

Please save hotel size shampoos and lotions as well as soaps for the Salvation Army and the Sojourner House. We also need combs, socks, toothpaste and toothbrushes, bandaids and individual wipes. There will be 150 gift bags put together at the District Convention for sick children at 3 Eau Claire Hospitals. 150 blankets are needed. Each club is asked to donate 3 of them. Blankets can be knitted, crochet, quilted or polar fleece. Approximate size is 28 to 36 inches. We also need 150 coloring books, 150 boxes of crayons and 150 children's books. 100 handmade teddy bears were made by the prisoners to be put in the bags.

Environmental: "Lions Planting Trees in Wisconsin". In our multiple we are edging up to 5,000 trees planted. Each club is asked to plant at least one tree between May 1, 2018 and May 1, 2020.

2020 Marks the 50th anniversary of Earth Day, founded in 1970 by Governor Gaylord Nelson in Wisconsin.

Earth Day will be celebrated at the state convention in May. Each club is asked to do one thing to compliment the earth. We need Leos and Lions to help paint small rocks as paper weights to be given as gifts at the noon luncheon at the State Convention. Hearing Preservation Awareness & Action: Reminded clubs to collect used cell phones, eye glasses and hearing aids. We have enough funds to cover the next 29 aids at \$900 per aid.

PDG Dan is recommending that clubs suspend their usual contribution for hearing fund for several years as we have plenty of money right now. PDG Dan would like clubs to direct those funds to the Children's Cancer Fund.

LCIF: Campaign 100 is looking for clubs and Lions to donate. They seek to raise \$300 million by June 30, 2021. If your club would like to learn more, PDG Bradley Barth is willing to visit your club.

Lions Eye Bank: Lions eye bank in June saw 96 donors compared to 62 a year ago. This may be due to the arrangement with Aura Health care where we receive corneas alternate months with Blood Center of Wisconsin. I would still encourage loved ones to let your doctors know that you want your corneas to go to Lions eye bank.

Public Relations: Lion Laurie is still waiting for responses from clubs in regards to having her reach out to different medias about having them come to their event or getting it published.

Restoring Hope: Restoring Hope Transplant House is thriving, with building plans to add 10 more guest rooms and elevators. This will take the house from 6 to 16. Building is planned to start in 2020. A transplant surgeon visited the house and said that the patients that stay here do 50% better than the rest. Financial support is very important. Club donations provide food, staff, cleaning supplies and utilities to support the mission. Lion Marcia Hagen can come to a club meeting and do a short presentation if your club is interested. If you know of a window company or furnace company etc., that could donate materials or of a community or health facility that would support this mission please let Cindy Herbst know. 1-608-831-1726.

Wisconsin Missions: There will be about 30 Lions from Wisconsin and Minnesota that will be traveling to Guatemala City on February 15th, 2020 for an eyeglass mission. On the 16th these lions will be traveling to the city of Chimaltenango where the people will be served.

On October 25th Wisconsin and Minnesota Lions did an eyeglass mission to Pine Ridge Indian Reservation. Two days were spent in Wanblee SD where eyeglasses were given to students who were screened last November. Also 2 days were spent at Pine Ridge where we were in May. About 800 people were served in those two locations. Thank you to all 10 Districts in Wisconsin for your responding in an amazing way for the request of clothing, beds, mattresses, bedding, furniture, food and many other items. 10 truck and trailer loads have been delivered to the Families Working Together warehouse in Wanblee for distribution.

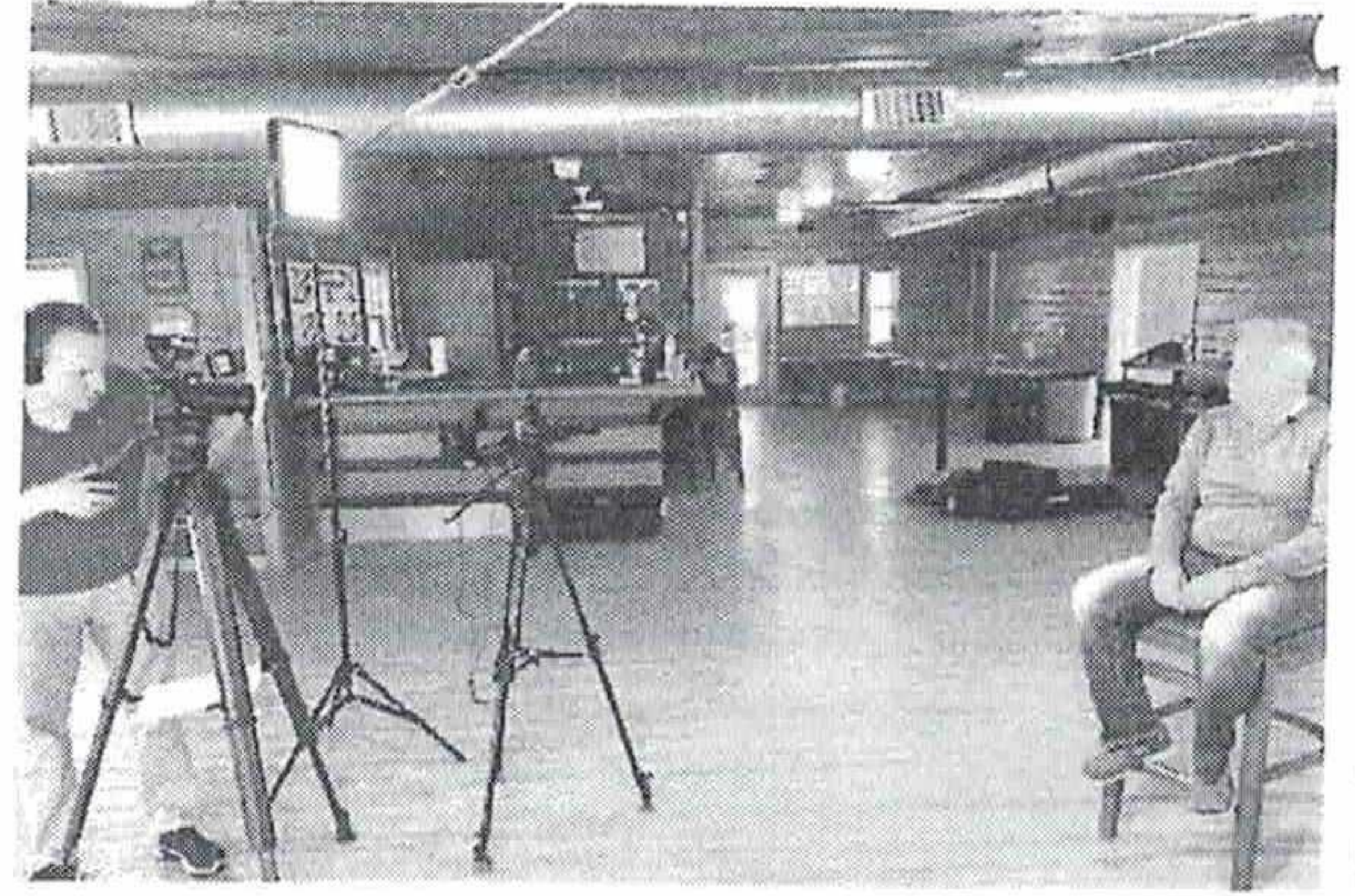

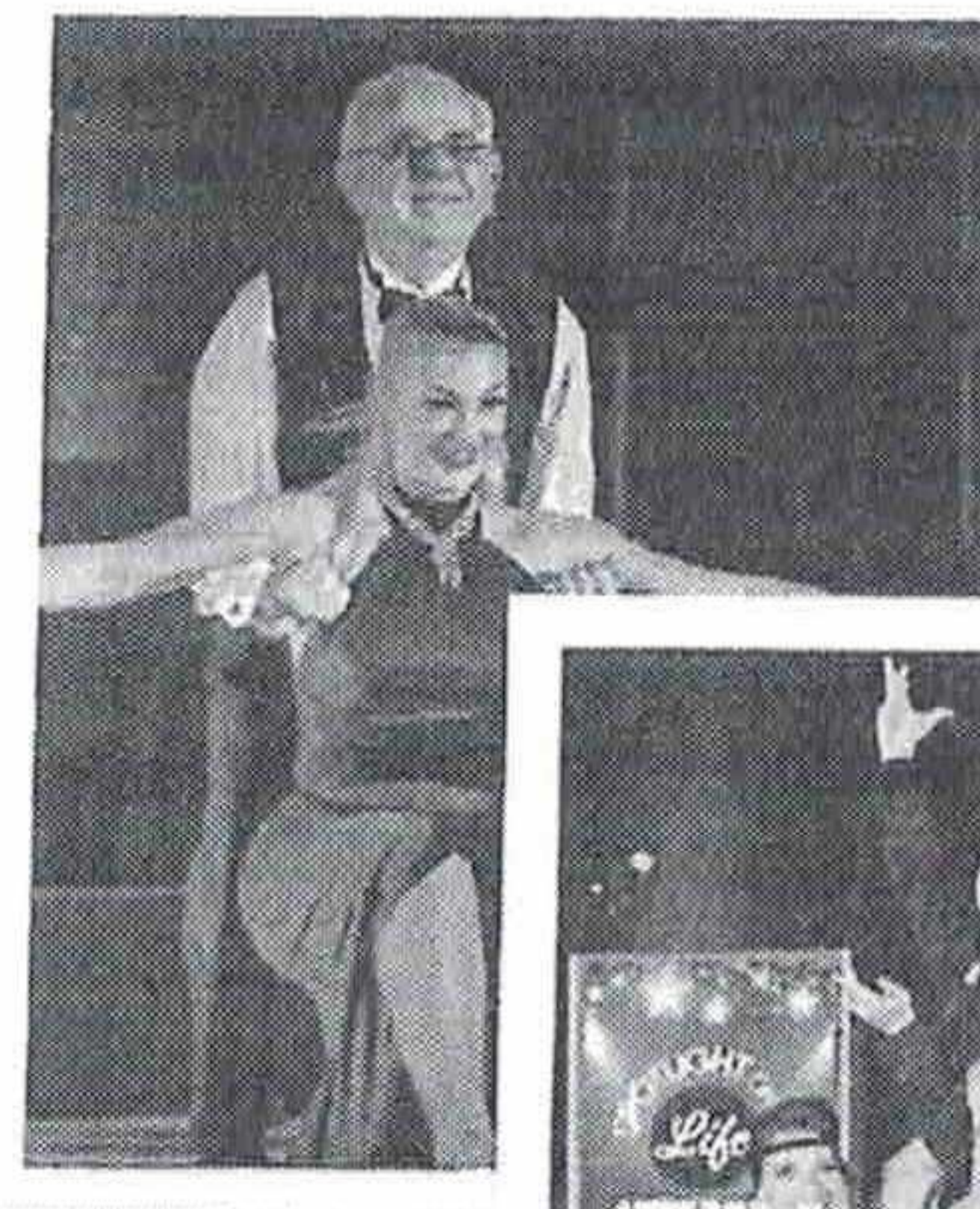

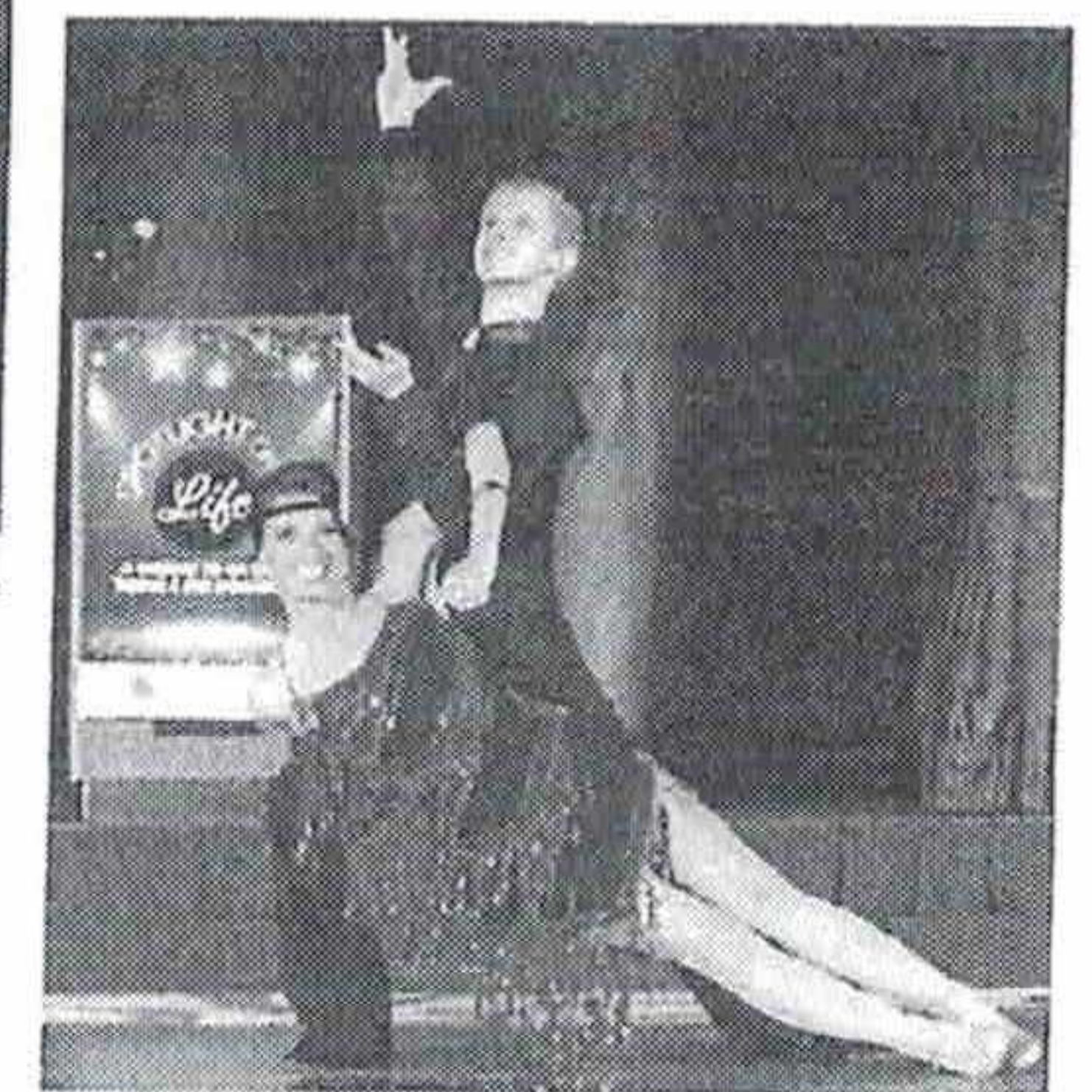
