## LEBW Q1 2020-21 Council of Governors Report

LEBW is happy to announce that LEBW CEO, Stacey Troha, is serving as Vice Chair of the Lions Eye Banks Core Team. LCI established Lions Eye Banks Core Team to provide leadership to a larger Lions Eye Banks Global Working Group through facilitating discussions and webinars on topics that strengthen Lions Eye Banks worldwide. The purpose of Lions Eye Bank Working Group is to help Lions Eye Banks thrive, bring visibility to the Lions brand, and provide vital services to their communities. There are currently 43 Lions Eye Banks worldwide. The Core Team and Working Group had their first Global meeting in June since 2004 and will be launching four committees in September that will address key areas of need for eye banks. Stacey will Chair the following two committees:

## Committee for Eye Banking Operational Support and Emerging Eye Banks

This committee will examine the current Lions resources available to Lions Eye Banks (LEB) and determine what additional resources LEB may require. The committee will focus on developing a network of support for the LEB who seek guidance to improve operations, build partnerships or require assistance and support during a crisis. The committee will also develop a formal program for onboarding new LEB and ensuring their success.

## **Committee for Purchasing and Logistics**

This committee will investigate the feasibility of developing a cooperative purchasing-consortia. Cooperative purchasing is an approach to procuring goods/services where organizations work together to combine requirements and pool buying power to secure more favorable pricing, terms, and conditions. If the committee determines that the project is feasible, the committee will move forward developing a purchasing-consortia for the LEB. Additionally, the committee will work to understand and provide guidance regarding logistical issues related to the transport of tissue and needed supplies locally and internationally.

Committee for Advocacy and Legislation—led by Co-Vice Chair, Lion Lyle Goth, Lions Gift of Sight in Minnesota
This committee will work on developing an advocacy program to be provided to all LEB. This program could be utilized by LEB personnel and eye bank supporters to engage Lions, community leaders, businesses, elected officials, philanthropic organizations, and the general public. The program will touch on what an eye bank does, eye donation promotion, the financial impact a LEB provides to the region, and providing support opportunities to individuals, groups, and organizations. Additionally, the committee will incorporate into the program a legislative aspect for engaging elected officials regarding issues pertaining to a LEB.

Committee for Marketing, Branding and Mission—led by Chair, Jason Brosious, Executive Director/CEO of Central Ohio This committee will determine what marketing materials and resources needed to support and promote the mission and services of LEB's worldwide. The committee will be responsible for overseeing the content of materials to help eye banks raise awareness and provide education in their communities and clubs. They will also support the marketing needs of the other committees as they develop.



## **Childhood Cancer Report**

DG Ronda and myself met at the Hudson Hospital with Tom Borowski, the President of the Hospital, Tessa Boury, Director of the Foundation, Brenda Hall, Director of Care Services and Tom Dodge, RN of the infusion center. They gave us a presentation on what the pediatric cancer unit looks like and what they would like changed. They have 7 patient rooms for infusion. They see over 3000 patients a year. They have patients from Amery, Baldwin, Osceola, New Richmond, Knapp and Children's Hospital. They also have a Dr. from Children's come to the hospital to see patients so that they do not have to travel into the cities. We did get to take a tour of the infusion center. They could use some updates and brighten up the area. Some of the pictures on the walls are from a nurse that works there. It is not kid friendly. DG Ronda did get some pictures as we took our tour.

Also DG Ronda and I are revamping the gift bags for the kids at the hospital. The infusion center said they could use some of the bags, but not to over do it, that makes the parents feel bad.

We are also working on making cards to go in the care packages or sending cards to the Assisted Living facilities.

We are also working on people checking their closets for clothes that they no longer need, children's clothing can go to the Foster Closet or nice newer clothing for adults can go to the hospitals or assisted living.
