We must work with the Burlington Parks Department with plans for upgrades. We plant flower bulbs, spread bark, trim flowering Rhodys. For most of our holidays Lions place 50 American Flags the full length of the park. This is absolutely a beautiful site. Hopefully some planning ideas will take place this fall.

District Governor Joel Haggen has called for 100% of our district membership to donate to our Lions International Foundation. Our foundation serves as beacon of hope to millions of people around the world. Whether a crisis arises from climate, Forest fires, storms, or war our Foundation is there to serve. Our club has supported the Lions Foundation through yearly donations in our club's budget. At a meeting very soon maybe, we can bring in a Melvin Jones Fellowship plaque and, on our agenda, name our fellowship members.
