

Our Journey Through Hallowed Ground I guess there's no room in today's news to mention that July 1st begins the 160th Anniversary of the three day Battle of Gettysburg. Maybe it would offend someone. That July of 1863, the little farming community of Gettysburg became the turning point of the Civil War and the history of our nation.

tragic, yet necessary event in our history to remain ONE NATION UNDER GOD!

On to another successful year for our Lynden Lions Club!




