Our club is really busy serving our community! We all should thank Lion Tony for his vision and direction for the past two years as we have grown with new members and achieved so much in our club and in our community! We have our Gambling License for the Log Drive and over the past two weeks we have been putting up posters and selling tickets. We set up a table at the Farmer's market for Lion Donalda and Linda to sell tickets and in 4 hours they sold 85 tickets. We also have businesses in town selling them for us as well. They cost \$5 each and all you need to do is guess the hours, minutes and seconds it will take to float our red, white and blue log from the Marblemount bridge down the Skagit River to the Sedro-Woolley/Clear Lake bridge. The log will be put in the river at 5AM on the 3rd of July and followed downriver by the Master of the Skagit River, Lion Marc and his fishing buddy.

The very next day is the Loggerodeo Parade!! Lion Rose, Sundarah, and many others have done an amazing job of putting together the parade line-up. We will meet at the Senior Center at 7:30 AM for pastries and coffee while making sure everyone has their assignments of streets. The parade this year will be AMAZING!! Be sure to save some time to check out all the other activities of the Loggerodeo starting on June 30th with carvings and carnival, and then other events daily through the 4th.
