2020-21 District Goals

Dear Club Presidents,

I thank you for your inputs in identifying meaningful District goals for this lionistic year 2020-21. The following Goal Statements are the result of a mediation of your inputs, the LCI's suggestions and my personal aspirations. In order to achieve these goals the participation of **ALL** clubs is essential.

- 1) MEMBERSHIP: By the end of June 2021 the district will achieve Net Growth of 30 in membership.
- 2) SERVICE 1: By the end of June 2021 the District will eye-screen all age 3-6 children in Rockland, Putnam and North Westchester counties.
- 3) SERVICE 2: By the end of June 2021 the District will contribute a total of \$31,000.00 to LCIF Campaign 100.
- 4) LEADERSHIP: By the end of April 2021 the District will identify and thoroughly train 10 new leaders.
- 5) MARKETING AND COMMUNICATION: By the end of April 2021 the District will improve Clubs' marketing capability by: developing a marketing plan template for the clubs and conducting a club Marketing and Communication training event.

Congratulation on being the 2020 recipient of the Brewster High School's Harold Knapp Award dedicated to Mr. Harold A. Knapp, from the Brewster Lions Club of the Town of Brewster, New York.

Mr. Harold A. Knapp was born on October 24, 1897 and passed away at the age of 64 on August 17, 1962 where he lived at 50 Oak Street in the Village of Brewster, New York.

Mr. Knapp studied at Columbia University and received his Bachelors and Master's degree at NYU.

In 1932 Mr. Knapp came to Brewster, NY where he began his long fruitful career in teaching at the Brewster Central School District's department of music. Mr. Knapp had provided the Brewster High School students with many years of service in the musical academic department through his years at Brewster High School. Mr. Knapp was memorialized by the Brewster Central School Administration and Board of Education as symbols of guidance and authority making it possible for the students to have gained in the form of knowledge possible with his wise and unselfish leadership. As the Board of Education mentioned in past years, Mr. Knapp was gentle, friendly, tolerant, considerate, courteous, sympathetic, obliging and helpful till his last days in the halls of Brewster High School.
