District Governor Monthly Message



Dear Club Presidents and Lions,

Four months ago I made my oath in front of our International President Dr. Jung-Yul Choi.

"Will you accept the office of District Governor together with the rights, opportunities and obligations? I will.

Will you uphold the Constitution and ByLaws of Lions Clubs International and the Policy of the International Board of Directors? I will.

Will you support the purposes of this association and the Lions Code of Ethics? I will.

Will you work harder to inspire, lead and extend the purposes of Lions Clubs International and its programs in your District and in the world? I will."

However, when I started my adventure as DG, I knew it would have been difficult. Everything was against me. District Membership low as never before, Clubs' activity reporting close to zero, number of clubs 31 (-4), District events Clubs' attendance 30% and, on top of all this, a pandemic killer that froze most activities. But 40 years in the military gave me the spirit and the skills to try to adopt the only successful strategy available: "turning all challenges into opportunities".

Lions Presidents, I ask you to do the same. You have a unique, peculiar situation to operate in. What worked well 6 months ago doesn't now but your community still needs you even more.

This is a great opportunity to review your activities and find out what you can do safely to serve your community, improve your club members with good training and find new members for your club. These are the three critical areas to be addressed. Your members need activities and responsibilities to feel that they are useful to either their club or their community or all of humanity. This is what Lions Clubs International is offering them through your club and your leadership as President.

During these first four months I have had some disappointments but also several successes with clubs that decided to give me a chance. While disappointments are not going to worsen the situation, successes are improving some clubs and those are my rewards.

The secret for progress and success is to set up goals, follow LCI's guidelines, never be satisfied, and never give up.

DISTRICT'S GOAL STATUS

- **Lions See** District Chair Ralph Fasano sent you an invitation to join in the achievement of the eye-screening goal with the appointment of a club Eye screening coordinator. Please respond, so he knows who is on board and who needs training on the screening camera.
- **New Leader 10 session training** started as scheduled on Aug. 17. We have had 5 sessions and another 5 are scheduled. There is still time and room to sign up.
- As usual, during the first quarter we experience a loss in **membership**. This year, however, the drop was less relevant than previous years. This month of October we started to have a positive net growth. It is essential that all clubs focus on membership throughout the entire year. Please use the "recruiting wheel" at page 13.

The suggested goal for all clubs is to recruit 1 new member for each 10 existing members. Clubs below 18 members are encouraged to set a goal of reaching 20 members. Total support from the district is available. If you do not have a Membership Chairperson, please appoint one and have her/him contact PDG Ron Delo (GMT).

- LCIF Campaign 100. This year District goal is to reach \$31,000 in donation. To date, only 2 clubs in the district have been reported donating to LCIF (total \$3,000). I encourage you to make a least a minimum yearly club donation based upon your membership count and your donation program. Lions' Personal donations are also encouraged and considered coming from the club. A donation will entitle you to be part of the unbelievable achievements of LCIF.

Official Visit of the District Governor

Dear Club Presidents.

As District Governor I am required by Lions Clubs International to visit every club within the district at least once a year. Although this is a duty, for me it is also a joy and I would be honored and very happy if I could meet all of your members. It will be a unique opportunity: for me to learn about your club, your services and your success stories; for you to get updated on the most recent LCI's and District's initiatives and goals. It would be very useful to know what you expect in general from the District and which difficulties (if any) you are facing and how the District can help. However, due to the current pandemic we need to comply with NY State Authorities. I suggest a visit in person limited to the Club BoD in order to easily adopt safe social distancing and a zoom meeting with all members. 

MD 20 ALERT FOUNDATION

A few years ago, many of you may remember, super storm Sandy hit Long Island and NYC particularly hard and Lions all over the world were very generous with their donations to the rebuilding effort. LCIF was also generous with grant money. We are using that money to build a warehouse and stock it with emergency supplies. After many years, the MD20 council finally agreed to build a warehouse at Camp Badger to house supplies for any future emergencies. That building was completed almost four years ago and we have been working since then to put supplies into the wonderful space that we have in Spencer, NY. DG Rick Brisee from District W



has been spearheading the job of purchasing equipment and supplies. He inventories the purchases, stores them safely in the building and he has worked up a plan for distribution of items should the need arise. We have also purchased and wrapped a small trailer (thanks to ID Gary Brown for finding us a bargain). We have also

ordered a larger trailer that will be wrapped once we take delivery.



Currently we have many different items in stock, for example blankets, generators, dehumidifiers, shop vacs, brooms, gloves, tarps, emergency lighting, extensions cords, tents, shovels, cleaning buckets, etc... If anyone has more ideas of items to stock on our shelves, please let us know.

In addition to all of the activity at the building, we have been forming a MD20 Alert Foundation to hold the assets of the committee and shield the MD. We are in the final phase of the Foundation set up and so we hope to

have people join the team as directors from all over the state. We need more help and we will be holding formal elections at the MD20 convention in Syracuse May 14-16, 2021.

Please monitor the MD20 website for a link to the MD20 Alert Foundation. We hope to have this up soon and the information will include a complete inventory of the warehouse as well as the procedure to request emergency supplies.

We hope that every MD20 Lions member will consider whether this may be their passion for service to the whole
