

# History of our Lions emblem

#### Lions Information Pamphlet District 2-X1 1962-1963

In 1919, when consideration was being given to the adoption of an emblem to represent the International Association of Lions Clubs, there were two groups bringing pressure to bear.

One group felt that the letter "L" should form the basis of the emblem while the other group felt that Rosa Bonheur's famous painting of the lion's head should form the basis of the emblem.

The Board of Directors appointed a committee to work out the design issue. From there, it went to the Secretary-General for additional deliberation.

It was then decided to incorporate into the emblem both the lion's head, the letter "L", and the words, "Lions International." A circle or chain was also added denoting that all Lions Clubs are linked together in common bond.

Maurice Blink, a commercial artist and member of the Central Lions Club in Chicago, worked with the Secretary-General to develop the official emblem.

It was presented to the Board of Directors, accepted, patented, and on December 31, 1921, became the official emblem of the International Association of Lions Clubs.

# Are You Searching for the Lions of Tomorrow?

Last year, I attended the USA-Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Omaha, Nebraska.

The forum featured many outstanding speakers for the general

assemblies and a large number of smaller sessions which addressed areas of concern and interest for Lions.

Although there were several small sessions that piqued my interest, one in particular stood out, "Recruiting Young Lions."

This session had a lot of relevant information and

featured a panel composed of young Lions who were very candid in response to our questions.

It is evident that we need to attract younger members given the increase in the average age of Lions members today. However, there are many questions abound as to how to attract younger members.

Just who is this "target group" we want to address and what are some of their characteristics?

Although this article is too short for an extensive examination of this question, the "Millennial Impact Report" presents some very interesting observations:

- 1) Our "target group" is known as the "Millennial Generation," young people born between 1980-2000, who are very active, and who will be 50% of the workforce by 2020 and 75% by 2030.
- 2) This is a very generous group with 84% making financial gifts to organizations in 2014 and 70% having done volunteer work that year. 45% of those who did not volunteer said they simply were not asked to volunteer.

Questions posed by an audience of mostly older Lions to the panel of

young Lions elicited some interesting responses:

- 1) The most effective way to attract younger Lions is to invite them to a service project first and then to the meeting. Let them have their "Lions Moment" first.
- 2) Younger Lions want to be involved in projects that have visible, tangible results.

(Projects to increase funds in the club treasury have little or no appeal but clean-up projects, working at a food bank, assisting in projects to improve education definitely do.)

3) The major peeve of young Lions is not having anything to do once they volunteer or join a club. (Being expected to stand by and be quiet because "they don't know anything" is demeaning and an

invitation to leave.)

4) The formality of many "traditional" clubs with major emphasis on titles, abbreviated titles, and protocol is often detrimental to attracting younger Lions.

I realize that this is a very brief overview of a very important topic. Lions International has recognized the importance of attracting younger Lions.

Through the publications, "Your Club, Your Way!," "Blueprint For A Stronger Club," and others, Lions International is presenting new formats for clubs and is encouraging all clubs to assess themselves and to think about the future.

Has your club begun the process and are you "Searching for the Lions of the Future?"

#### Lions' International Meeting Opens Today

From the Dallas Morning News Monday, October 8, 1917

#### DELEGATES ARRIVING HERE LAST NIGHT FOR FIRST ANNUAL CONVENTION

Mayor Joe E. Lawther will officially welcome about forth delegates to the first annual meeting of the International Lions Club in the palm garden of the Adolphus Hotel at 10 o'clock this morning.

Delegates to the meeting began arriving last night. Dr. W. P. Woods, president of the club, has been in Dallas for several days, preparing for the convention. Last night, he and a number of other delegates were dinner guests of L. H. Lewis of Dallas at the Adolphus.

Ed N. Kaercher, former president,

and R. J. Dawson, present president of the St. Louis Lions Club, and others are here from St. Louis. Melvin Jones and James Trienens, prominent in the Chicago Lions Club, arrived last night.

Although this will be the first international convention, delegates said the gathering will be more in the nature of a meeting than a convention. The meetings today, tomorrow, and Wednesday will be to perfect the organization and make plans for its expansion.

Since Texas is so huge, it is our job as Lions to continually share the word about this wonderful FREE camp for kids with special needs. This includes physical challenges, Down Syndrome, and Type 1 diabetes.

I'm sure you have known a child that could benefit from attending TLC.

As time goes by, these children in our schools, churches, and neighborhoods become older and we lose track of them.

Therefore, we need to make a special effort to approach adults in



every walk of life (i.e. the grocery store, day cares, school events, doctors' offices, city social events, the mall, etc.) to share information about TLC.

It is not always evident that a child might have a special need, so we need to open up discussions and friendships with all adults to explore the possibilities of identifying these children. Besides, this gets us talking about Lions in general. You might get a new member while you're at it!

At press time, there is one TLC work weekend remaining before the start of the 2017 camping season.

This is a great opportunity for your club members to roll up their sleeves and have a hands-on project benefiting our camp. The work days are well organized and supplies are provided. Just call (830) 896-8500 in advance to let them know how many are coming and they'll set you up. You'll meet Lions from all over Texas who have the same heart for Lions that you do. It's real fun.

I also encourage you and/or your club to plan a visit to your camp this summer to see the magic!

Every Friday night at 7 p.m. is the closing ceremony in the TLC Outdoor Amphitheater.

I guarantee you will leave there with a joyous heart and great pride in being part of an organization that provides a camping experience at no cost to these less fortunate children and their parents.

You will see tearful parents who released their precious child to unknown counselors and staff for the week and now who have confidence that their child is capable of growing independently forward in their life.

You will see counselors clad in all sorts of bizarre outfits, cheering each and every child.

You will see a blind child or a child in a wheelchair venture down the aisle to accept his/her award.

You will see other Lions Clubs presenting stipends to the counselors.

You will see children who have had a week like never before: arts and crafts, fishing, horseback riding, rock wall climbing, skits, sleeping in a barracks without their parents, and swimming—just to name a few activities.

More importantly, some learned to care and monitor their diabetes. Some made long-lasting friends with perhaps greater challenges than themselves. All learned that they are not the only ones who are "special".

You'll see counselors whose life directions are forever changed because they shared time with a special needs child.

What good is having a camp without campers? It is our responsibility to seek out these children and send them to Kerrville.

District 2-T2 provides free bus transportation for the second camping session.

On June 11, campers will board our bus around 6:30 a.m. from the Long John Silver's parking lot at 50th Street and I-27 for the trip to Kerrville.

The bus returns to Kerrville on June 17 to pick up the campers for the trip back to Lubbock.





# Be sure to report 2017-2018 officers as soon as possible

The Standard Lions Club Constitution and By-Laws requires a Lions Club's officer nominating committee to meet in March and that election of officers be held in April.

Immediately thereafter, the newlyelected 2017-2018 officers are to be reported to Lions Clubs International using the "My LCI" web portal or the paper PU-101 form.

Reporting this information in a timely manner will help the incoming District Governor prepare the District Directory so that it may be published prior to the first Cabinet Meeting in July.

It also begins the communications process between Lions Clubs International, District 2-T2, and the newly elected officers.

"Timely reporting allows club officers access to the "My LCI" portal beginning April 1," said Cabinet Secretary PDG Carmon

McCain.

"As the 2017-2018 Lions fiscal year nears, it is important for clubs to be aware of future meetings and goals. Knowing the right persons to share this information with is vitally important," he added.


