I received my Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from West Texas State University (as it was known at the time).

I received my Doctorate of Education Degree in 1992 from Texas Tech University. I retired six years ago as the Superintendent of Schools for Plainview ISD.

Ι spent my entire 40-year educational career in the Plainview school system. I began as a Math and Biology Teacher at Plainview High School in 1973. I was named as a Dean of Students (now known as Assistant Principal) in 1977 and served in this position until 1981 when I was named the Principal of College Hill Elementary School and this is when I became a member of the Plainview Lions Club. (I first joined the Plainview Evening Lions Club in 1975, but I had to resign from this Club two years later when I was named as a Dean at PHS.)

I was in this position for 16 years and in 1997 I was named as Director of Special Services. In 2001 I became the Assistant Superintendent for Administration and Personnel and served in this position until I became the Superintendent on December 1, 2002. I retired on January 31, 2013. I also had the opportunity to serve as Interim Superintendent for Lamesa ISD in 2015.

When I first joined a Lions Club, our main global cause was basically centered around Vision.

As the years have passed, Diabetes, Hunger, Environment, and Childhood Cancer have been added to our "visions."

As you know Campaign 100 is being implemented and this will be a focus for us in the next couple of years.

We are 1.4 million strong worldwide as we serve our individual communities to improve those situations which are in need of help.

When serving our communities we know that "it begins with a single step" and from this single step we gain the insight to help improve people's lives.

Grindstaff served as City Attorney of Ballinger from 1957 to 2018. He has been a devoted Lions Club

member since 1954. During his tenure as President

of Texas Lions Camp, he promoted camping sessions for juvenile diabetics.

He served a two-year term as International Director from Texas in 1972-1974. Many will remember the small boxes of Tide detergent with the "Ride The Ebb Tide" slogan that were distributed at the Mexico City Convention in 1972.

He was elected President of Lions Clubs International at the 65th annual convention in Atlanta, GA.

Past President Grindstaff traveled through 50 countries and met many influential leaders. Some of them include President Sadat of Egypt;Prime Minister Begin of Israel; Mayor Jacques Chirac of Paris, who went on to become the President of France; Presidents Lyndon Johnson, Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, George H.W. Bush, and George Bush; as well as Pope John Paul II.

Survivors include wife, Jeanette (Jay); son Jeff; daughter Michelle; and four grandchildren.

Past District Governor Tom White of Lubbock passed away May 21. He was 68.

He was born Oct. 11, 1951 in Lub-



bock. Tom attended Lubbock High and Hardin-Simmons University.

Tom married his childhood sweetheart, Peggy Dennis, on July 15, 1972. They were partners in Dennis

Brothers Printers from 1976 to 2012.

He was active in his church and the community.

He was a deacon at Indiana Avenue Baptist Church and went on more than 25 mission trips with university students to rebuild churches in California, Louisiana, Utah, and Wyoming.

Lion Tom served as District 2-T2 Governor in 2006-2007. Lion Peg followed in 2012-2013.

PDG Tom attended several Lions Clubs International Conventions. They include San Diego, Hawaii, Thailand, Germany, and Canada.

He was also an "Ambuc of the Year" for the Downtown Chapter of the American Business Clubs as well as a Board Member of the Boys and Girls Club of Lubbock.

He loved to play golf, hunt, and watch baseball--especially the Texas Rangers.

At his May 25 memorial service, the family shared PDG Tom's favorite candy (A Reese's Peanut Butter cup attached to the bottom of each chair); his favorite family Christmas Eve tradition (reciting *"The Crooked-Mouth Mouse Family"* story before singing "O Tannenbaum" at the stroke of midnight); and his favorite bit of advice to family and friends ("Do Your Best")

Our thoughts and prayers are with PDG Peg; sons Ben, Joshua, Andy, and Matt; and seven grandchildren.


