With the formal opening of the MD-2 GMA Café on Nov. 30, all Lions of Texas, including us in District 2-T2, now have a unique opportunity to participate in this smorgasbord offering an abundance of membership, leadership and service tips that we can take back to our own clubs as well as the district in general.

And all it costs is the time it takes to fire up your computer or other internet-enabled device such as a tablet or smart phone and log-in.

If you miss the monthly Zoom meeting, you can always get a sampling of what was on that evening's menu via YouTube.

The GMA Café – those initials stand for Global Membership Approach which has evolved from the North American Membership Initiative – is open to Lions throughout Texas as well as GAT Area 1A.

As our MD-2 GMA Champion Chris Gunstream explains, "The great thing about the MD-2 GMA Café is that you can drop in at any time and leave at any time.

This is like any other café, it is open to everyone and you can come and go as you please."

Just as the Global Membership Approach evolved from NoAMI, the GMA Café has replaced our monthly NoAMI Champions Zoom meetings which were held on the last Tuesday of each month.

While the NoAMI sessions were open to District Governors, First and Second Vice District Governors, Lions International Family and NoAMI District Champions, the GMA Café is open to all Lions.

The live GMA Café Zoom meetings begin a 6 p.m. on the last Tuesday of each month and generally last for about 60 minutes.

Our first GMA Café session attracted about 25 participants and featured PID Jerome Thompson as special guest along with MD-2's own ID Ernesto "TJ" Tijerina of San Antonio and PID Joe Al Picone of Brenham. And over the course of just over an hour, we were able to cover a wide gamut of topics driven by the interests and concerns of the participants themselves. It truly was a free flow of ideas between Texas Lions representing clubs both large and small.

Our next visit is scheduled for 6-7 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 25, 2022. Our special guest will be Lions Clubs International 1st Vice President Brian Sheehan.

Another great source for worthwhile information about Lionism is the Texas Tuesday Connections.

As in the case of the MD-2 GMA Café, there is no fee to participate, and no registration required. All you need to do is log-in.

The Texas Tuesday Connections is a product of the North American Membership Initiative. The MD-2 GAT began the Texas Tuesday Connections series in April 2021 and because of its popularity and

obvious value, the MD-2 GAT made the decision to continue the programs through the 2021-2022 Lions Year.

Already there are nearly seven months of Texas Tuesday Connections online and posted on the Texas Lions.org website. Just click on the Programs Tab and you'll see that the Texas Tuesday Connections is first on the list.

From there you can access all the previous programs.

Among the numerous topics include Being Effective an Zone Chair, Club Goal Setting, Community Needs Assessment, New Member Orientation, Using MyLion, Responsibility of a New Member Sponsor, History and Role of an Effective Tail Twister, District Chaplains, Social Media Platforms, Kid Sight II, Peace Poster, Member Satisfaction, Rebuilding and Reactivating Clubs, Mentorship Program and Engagement, Public Relations, Motivation through Recognition, Using Service to Drive Membership and much, much more.

Although the Texas Tuesday Connections took a short hiatus at the end of 2021 to conduct a SWOT analysis on the program, and then to develop a new infrastructure, goals, guidelines and so forth, the series is scheduled to relaunch Tuesday, Jan. 18, 2022. And speaking from experience, it's well worth an hour a week to devote to this particularly worthwhile Zoom meeting.

I encourage you to be on the lookout for updates to your MD-2 Texas Tuesday Connections, and spend some time viewing previous programs.

Switching subjects, now is the time to submit your application for the April 2-4, 2022, ELLI session in Austin, Texas.



It's a training session for those who have not yet achieved the position of Club President. It is designed to provide skills that will help those Lions lead their clubs in the future.

ELLI graduates are expected to pursue additional leadership roles and responsibilities in their respective clubs; serve as a leadership resource in their respective clubs; and share their institute experiences with members of their club and encourage other qualified Lions to apply to future ELLI Institutes.

The deadline for applications is Feb. 11, 2022, so it's important to act fast.

There is a non-returnable \$150 participation fee which covers the hotel (with an Institute-assigned roommate) and meals during the Institute. Your application must be signed by your club president, our District Governor and GLT District Coordinator Second VDG Chris Edwards.



District 2-T2 club membership as of Dec. 12, 2021


