You manage all of the financial operations of the club--including invoices and payment of dues, recording and processing receipts and payments for both the Administrative and Public Service accounts.

Welcome to District 2-T2!

Let's look for the light at the end of the tunnel!

Last fall in my Windmill column I wrote about planting trees.

Well, now it's springtime and time to really get busy after many of us have already received our one or two shots in the arm and the



Second Vice District Governor Doug McDonough Covid-19 pandemic begins to abate.

As you might recall, I used an old Chinese proverb to enfellow courage through-Lions out District 2-T2 to get busy in recruiting new Lions and striving to retain the members we already have.

That old saw observes, "The best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago. The second best time is now!"

The message should be clear to all Lions – when striving for success and growth in the future, the best time to act is now.

In a recent newsletter, PDG Chris Gunstream who serves as MD-2 NoAMI Champion offered this quote from International President Dr. Jung-Yul Choi.

"I believe that everything we do as leaders should start with a question: How can I help you? Whether it's your leadership team or a local Lion, you are the one showing them the way and helping them reach their goals. Because encouraging and inspiring them to be their best will be your greatest success,"said International President Choi.

Unfortunately, due in large part to the Covid pandemic, our district has seen its membership numbers decline since the start of our fiscal year.

Overall, we've lost 63 Lions in the past eight months, from a starting balance of 1,172 Lions on July 1, 2020, to a District 2-T2 membership of 1,115 on April 7, 2021.

Thus far this fiscal year 15 Lions in District 2-T2 have died, including several as a result of Covid-19, while others were stricken from the roll due the cancellation of four once viable Lions Clubs.

Those four clubs accounted for 41 members themselves, including 12 in the Littlefield Lions, seven in Lubbock First Responders Lions Club, 20 with Lubbock Tech Lions and two with Post Lions Club.

Since the first of the Lions' year, 19 of our clubs have added 78 new Lions to their rolls.

On the flip side, 22 clubs have dropped a total of 135 Lions from membership. The resulting decline of 94 from those active clubs along with the 41 Lions lost to the four canceled clubs add up to our current membership decline of 57.

Now that spring has arrived, what can we do fellow Lions to get busy planting trees and reverse that troubling trend that has seen our district's membership decline from 1,875 members in 63 clubs just 16 years ago?

We need to take this opportunity to seize the moment, as PID Jerome Thompson suggests.

The GAT Constitutional Area 1 Leader explains that it is time for Lions to rally our clubs in an effort to retain our valued members, identify community needs, and expand our capacity to serve.

PID Thompson offers this proactive time line for Lions throughout MD-2 and Constitutional Area 1 for assisting clubs in turning on the light after a long year of Covid darkness:

• Use April to catch up on service reporting.

• Use May to focus on adding members to our existing clubs.

• In June, do whatever is necessary to meet our club and district goals in areas of new clubs, members added to existing clubs, retention and service.

As part of this effort to encourage growth and new beginnings with the arrival of spring, the MD-2 Global Action Team is introducing "Texas Tuesday Connections," a learning opportunity for all Lions of Texas.

Working with Lion leaders across Texas, MD-2 Global Action Team is offering several learning opportunities in April 2021.

The topics will be presented in both slide show format and as a round table discussion.

They will last no more than one hour each – 40 minutes for the presentation and 20 minutes for questions.

The Texas Tuesday Connection Series got under way April 6 with IPDG Larkin Smith of District 2-S3 explaining a successful membership recruitment program employed by the San Marcos Lions Club. A link to that presentation should soon be available online at TexasLions.org.

Sofia has attended TLC for the past 3 summers including Texas Lions Camp's online camping program TLC2U for 2020. For Sofia, TLC is the best thing that has happened to her as a Type 1 diabetic. Sofia is 13 years old and loves to play tennis, the violin, watercolor painting, and being involved in church activities. She has an older sister, Victoria and parents, Walt and Selina Elder.

Sofia's diagnosis came as a big shock to the family, since no one in the family has Type 1 diabetes. They found themselves suddenly thrust into uncharted waters. Life underwent many

changes. Selina, Sofia's mother said, "Often, we would awake Sofia in the middle of the night to correct low sugar levels which caused her to wake up exhausted the following morning. In addition, Sofia underwent a very difficult transition as she was forced daily to adjust to multiple insulin injections and carbohydrate counting. At times, she would


refuse to eat, just to avoid receiving extra injections."

Sofia also worried about being unable to continue playing tennis. Little did her family know that her tennis coach, Erin Bynum, a former Texas Lions Camper, was also a Type 1 diabetic. Erin immediately jumped into action to help Sofia transition to living with diabetes. She shared her experiences at Texas Lions Camp and encouraged Sofia to attend. Through Erin's input, encouragement from an area lions club member, and through prayer, Sofia's parents knew the experience of attending camp would provide her with much needed



reassurance in facing Type1 diabetes with confidence and the challenges it would bring.

Selina noted, "Initially, Sofia was hesitant of the unknown, yet more curious and excited about the possibility of making new friends with the same diagnosis. One of the things Sofia particularly loved at TLC was personalizing her sleeping area, horseback riding, fishing, camping out under the stars, farm life animals, swimming, and carnival day." TLC has had a positive impact on Sofia by empowering her to accept her Type 1 diabetes diagnosis and the challenges and changes it has



of managing diabetes. She desires to return and serve as a cabin leader someday to pass on to others what she learned and experienced at TLC.

Selina went on to say, "We remember the first day of camp and how welcome we felt by all the camp leaders. It was difficult driving away from TLC, and we felt guilty for leaving her there. Surprisingly, upon our return to camp to pick her up, seeing her smiling face and watching her joyful singing during the closing ceremony, we were reassured that we had made the right decision. It was amazing

the positive impact one week at TLC made on Sofia. As we drove home, Sofia talked non stop about the fun she had, new experiences, and things she learned to improve her Type 1 diabetic care. She came home empowered. As months went by, she progressed to requesting an insulin pump and a Dexcom like her friends at camp."

When asked what you would say to parents considering sending their child to TLC, Sofia's mom answered quickly," We would share why sending Sofia to TLC was one of the best decisions we made and specify the positive impact it had on her. I would reassure them that the life-changing experiences would provide their child with a sense of confidence in facing the challenges of life. We truly believe God brought TLC into Sofia's life and has been a blessing to us."

Sofia and her family are excited to be a part of the 28th Annual Harry Wickersham Golf Tournament and sharing her story. She wants others to know how important TLC is for kids like her and to promote its growth so that it is accessible for years to come. For more infor-

Plainview Lions ramp up support for local family

On Oct. 9, 2020, Plainview resident Tommy Young was diagnosed with Covid-19 and sent into a 10-day quarantine.

Just a week before, he'd begun treatment for a wound on his foot that was not healing. By the time his quarantine was over and he now had the ability to return to wound care, the damage was already done.

"I called an ambulance to transport Tommy to the local ER since his foot was looking very bad and we were having an ice and snow storm in town," related his wife, Teresa. "The next day, he was moved to Lubbock and the next day he was having surgery to amputate his left leg below the knee. It all happened so fast."

Friends and family knew that Tommy had a long road ahead of him with recovery and rehabilitation before he could even return to his Plainview home. But when that happened, there was another challenge in the works: the Young family home has four steps on its front porch.

"Our house is a 1925 model built on one of Plainview's older streets, and we love it. But it is definitely not ADA-friendly with its stairs and narrow doorways," Teresa noted. "I knew it would be a challenge for Tommy to get around in a wheelchair and he would likely be in one for 5-6 months after he got home. I had no idea what it cost to put a ramp on our home but it didn't sound like an inexpensive project."

fortunately, the Plainview Lions Club was already working behind the scenes.

Mike Melcher, with whom Young works in advancement at Wayland Baptist University, had already been talking to club friends about the possibility of helping out. When he approached Teresa about a ramp, she welcomed any help and offered to pay for the project.

"While Tommy convalesced in Lubbock – then endured another three small surgeries to remove

the stubborn infection from his leg – the Lions were already hammering out a plan.

A week later, Teresa was actually part of the lunch club's program presenting about the Plainview Area United Way campaign, for which she is serving as chair for the 2021 drive. As the program concluded, 1st Vice President Landon Hughey called Teresa back up for an announcement.

"He presented us with pens to thank us for speaking, then he added that the club had voted to build a ramp for our house and the cost had already been covered," Teresa recalls. "I didn't even know what to say. We were prepared to help pay something but the club would not accept the money. They just wanted to help.

"Probably the most amazing thing is that neither Tommy nor I are in the Lions Club. I serve in Soroptimist, and Tommy has not been in a service club since going into full disability several years ago. We know many of the members personally from various places, but we are not members. So to have this club take on this project for us was incredibly overwhelming. We are so very thankful."

A few weeks before Tommy returned home to Plainview on Dec. 19, club members Travis Thornton and John Bertsch spent a day welding the metal ramp which came out to around 22-feet in length in order to cover the steep rise of the porch and remain ADA compliant. Melcher then joined them to load the ramp on a flatbed trailer and deliver it to the Young home. Teresa was at Tommy's side in the rehab facility when the text message arrived showing the new ramp in place.

Tommy has been so moved by the gesture that he hopes to either join the club once he gets his new prosthetic leg in the spring or at least become a solid supporter.

"I find it hard to find the right words to express my gratitude to the Lions Club. We've never really been involved with this organization and yet when they hear of the need, they came running to our aid," said Tommy. "And that's the true definition of service."
