Fellow Lions of District 13 OH5,

It is an honor and privilege to serve the 2018-19 Lions year as the district governor.

We have many challenges ahead of us. I have focused on three that I think are the most important:

Membership: In July 2016 OH5 had a membership of 1708. July 2017 it was 1626. I started my term with a membership of 1533. These are not sustainable losses. We need to turn the corner THIS YEAR, and it needs to involve everyone. Ask people. Promote asking people with every Lion you see. Encourage membership nights. Have club brochures and applications with you wherever you go. There are no strangers in life, only potential Lions!

Compliance: We have the IRS, Attorney General, and the Secretary of State, all stepping up and making things much more difficult for clubs that go OUT of compliance. To stay in compliance is relatively easy and not really time consuming. If you lapse, you have a problem. We need to get ALL clubs in compliance and work hard to keep them there.

MyLion: As of July 30, out of 1533 Lions, there were 37 registered users for MyLion. As of June 30, 2019, there will be no more LyLCI, except for reporting membership – all service will be reported on MyLion. There is a HUGE learning curve, promotion, and emphasis in general that is going to need to take place to keep from our district not dropping off the map in reporting. I will be working with PDG Jeff Sweeney, who is our MyLion district trainer, to see what we can do to educate 1500 Lions in 11 months.

Don't hesitate to use them, but at the same time, be persistent! I try to respond to everyone in a timely manner, but it doesn't always work out that way. Between work, visitations, and life in general, I sometimes don't get to my email as often as I would like. For faster response, phone calls are the best way to go.

I end with these thoughts: International President Gudrun Yngvadottir's slogan this year is "Beyond the Horizon." Don't look to the horizon, she said in Las Vegas, but look beyond to what we cannot see, and make that our mission to attain. I echo that sentiment. We cannot sit back and rest on our laurels; we need to constantly look for new opportunities to grow, to find new avenues to serve, to re-energize ourselves and our fellow members. Stagnation is the beginning of the end.

District Project for the Homeless—We have been getting plenty of hard eyeglass cases from all of you. Thank you so much for the outpouring of support in this great endeavor in such a short period of time! We probably have 500 or more cases. While we'll still take those cases and continue with this project in the upcoming years, we are now in need of donations to fill these cases and we are looking for donations of the following items:

- Band-aids (big and small)
- Wet Wipes
- Antibiotic Ointment
- Sample size meds—Tylenol and Aspirin
- Chapstick
- Toenail clippers
- Tissues (small hand pack)
- Sewing kits (small travel size)

Some of our cases are larger than others and those cases we can get all these items in we'll put them in. Other cases are smaller and we'll cut back on things like tissues packs so we can get all the other items in the cases. We'll label the cases as a "First Aid Kit" and put our Lions logo on the sticker. If we can get enough donations to fill the cases we can begin distributing them to the homeless in January. You can bring these items to your zone meetings and turn them over to one of the officers, or we can pick them up from you when we visit your club.



Lions throughout OH-5 can answer the call for action from LCI by learning how to screen for diabetes in their own community. To date, Lions from 11 clubs through the district have stepped up to go through training and prepare to serve their communities by raising awareness of the dangers of diabetes, and screening glucose levels. Another District-wide training is scheduled for Sunday, August 26, from 3:00-5:00 PM, at the MCL Cafeteria, Kingsdale Shopping Center (Upper Arlington, near OSU's campus). Full information will be provided to those who sign up for the training.

The training takes less than two hours, does NOT require any medical knowledge or experience, and it is neither scary, nor complicated (honest!!!). Those who participate will leave prepared to conduct screening, with all materials provided by the Central Ohio Diabetes Association. As we begin a new Lions year, why not get your club involved in a timely and important service project that can be done by a club of any size -- at no cost to the club!

Hands-On Activity: Who Do You Know With Diabetes?

Because our fight against diabetes is personal, it's important to understand how diabetes affects our communities—including our fellow Lions Club members.

In this two-part group exercise, club members will reflect on their personal connection to diabetes, then brainstorm ideas for service activities to generate diabetes awareness, encourage prevention, and help people with diabetes get access to life-saving treatment.

Part One:

What You'll Need:

- Sheets of paper or card stock
- Markers
- Space for club members to sit in a circle

Facilitator Instructions:

1. Organize participants in a circle.
2. Give each participant a piece of paper/card stock and a marker.
3. Ask participants to reflect on their personal connections with diabetes. Ask questions like:
 - "How are you personally connected to diabetes?"
 - "Who do you know who is living with or has lived with diabetes?"
4. Ask participants to write down their connections and turn their paper/card stock face down on their laps when finished.
5. When all have finished writing, go around the circle and ask each person to hold up their card for all to see.
6. Summarize themes and lead a discussion about how diabetes affects many lives in different ways.

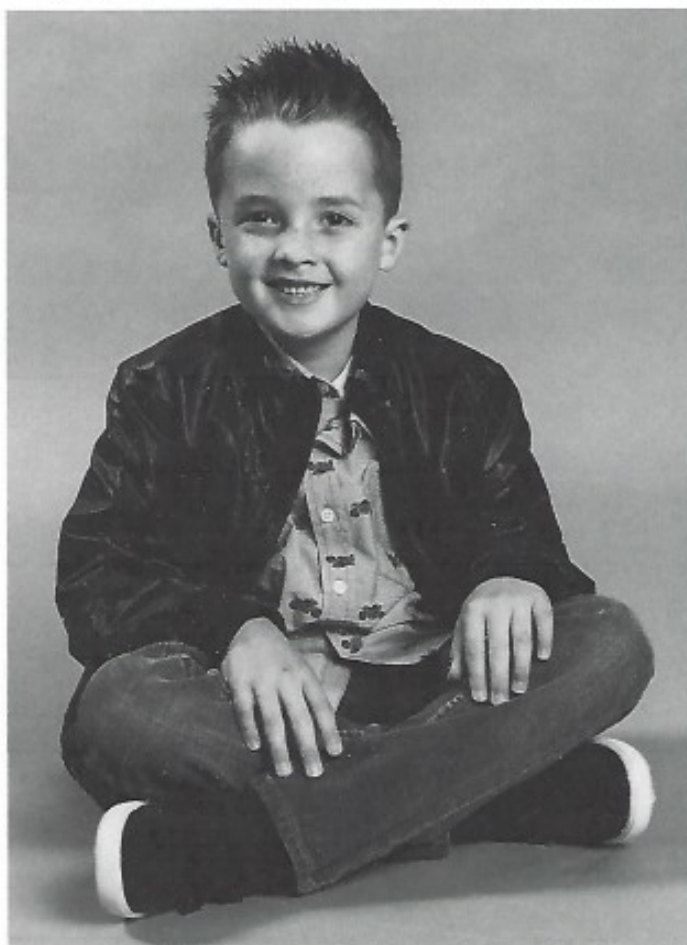
