Calling All RED Light, YELLOW Light, GREEN Light Lions UPDATE: OH5 Buckeye Mask Project

It's not too late for YOUR club to have a part in the OH5 Buckeye Mask Project – and earn some points in the District Zone and Club Contest along the way!

To date, 12 clubs in the District have gotten involved in the project, and have produced **1200 facemasks!!!** We have masks of different sizes, colors, and patterns. Each mask has been sealed in a separate plastic bag with a tag the identifies it as coming from the Lions of Central Ohio. We have LOTS of masks!!!

Our goal is to *sell 1000* of those masks and *donate the other 200*. If we can meet that goal, the Buckeye Food Alliance on OSU's campus will receive a donation of 200 masks to be distributed to students who

worry about food insecurity and now worry about their safety, and that of their families, in the midst of the pandemic. Additionally, a donation of \$1000 will go directly to the BFA.

First, though, we have to sell those 1000 facemasks. We are working with several student groups on campus, but we are looking for additional avenues for distribution.

THAT'S WHERE YOU COME IN!!!

We know that many clubs have had to forego their regularly scheduled fundraisers and



service projects this spring/summer because of the pandemic. And we know that many Lions are still hesitant about coming together. Now you can join with Lions from throughout OH5 to be part of a service project that is important not "in spite of COVID-19," but "BECAUSE of COVID-19."

For each contribution of \$125, your club can purchase 25 facemasks to be donated for use by vulnerable members of your community. You may choose to donate them to a local food pantry, or a community center, or as a "thank you" to first

responders in your area who put themselves in jeopardy every day to serve.

Whether you are meeting face-to-face, or by Zoom, or conference call, or staying in touch by email, it is time to contact the members of your Lions club and ask (1) how many masks your club wants to purchase (remember, lots of 25, please!), and (2) where your club wants to donate their masks.

Once you have made those two decisions, please contact Lions Jane Jarrow, 614-571-5681, lionjjarrow@gmail.com to make arrangements to pick up your masks (or have them delivered or sent to you).



The following exhibit has been extracted from "Full Steam Ahead" about building a vision; page 176: "Vision is a lot more than putting a plaque on the wall. A real vision is lived, not framed. The following diagram depicts the 'double click.'"




All of this is caused by the decline of membership in Ohio. We have proposed a membership idea to bring in young people into the Lions. This proposal is for students and former Lions, where they will pay no state or the district dues listed in the MD13 Constitution and Bylaws until they turn age 31.

Of course, that is good for the Lions of Ohio, but it doesn't do anything for the financial issues in the graph above. So, the proposal also includes a \$5.00 dues increase split 50/50 across 2021 and 2022. Once we approve this at the state convention in 2021, our graph above looks like this:

This gives us breathing room to fix our member problems. The Finance and Long-Range Planning Committee urge your club to send delegates to the state convention in May 2021 and vote "Yes" for this proposal.

What do you think? We get members and get time to work on membership. Are you in?
