Her assignment was to develop a business plan and budget for the Taita Taveta Women Mining Group (TTWMG) near the city of Voi. The county of Taita Taveta has one of the richest deposits of gemstones on earth.

In support of this initiative, the **Gloucester Lions** donated \$920 to be given to the TTWMG for the rental of an excavator and purchase of equipment and supplies.

Lion Theresa presented them with the **Gloucester Lions** monetary gift at the end of the assignment. She also bought them about two weeks' worth of groceries.



To honour the donation from the **Gloucester Lions Club**, the TTWMG president, Editha Lewela, asked if she could keep Lion Theresa's vest so they may fly it like a flag marking the newly excavated mine. Lion Theresa is planning on going back to Kenya in the summer of 2023 to follow up with a marketing plan for the TTWMG and to continue carrying out the Lion motto, "We Serve".

"Report Past Activities", you will find service projects from around the world. Take some time to see what others are doing and perhaps how you might replicate it in your community.

Another resource available to Lions is the "Service Launchpad", which is found at Lionsclubs.org. Lions are asked to answer a few questions to help identify what type of activity they are looking for. Then suggestions of possible projects are provided with a pdf for each. The pdf will outline a step-by-step approach for each service project.

A great resource is also other Lions. Conversations with other Lions and discovering what they are doing can inspire a new idea for your club. Be daring and try new ideas, you never know how you can impact your community.
