

Montana Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation

I have had an experience the past two days that you might want to put into the monthly bulletin. On Sunday (2nd) my wife and I were at the local Great Falls Wal-Mart and I decided to check and empty the used eyeglass, hearing aid, drop box there. It was almost full. Later that afternoon I decided to sort out the glasses and I found a zip up case that had Regional Medical on it plus a sticker with a ladies name, date of birth, etc. I opened the case and there was one pair of glasses and when I took out the glasses there was a zip plastic bag with an identical sticker on it folded up in the bottom. When I pulled out the bag I could see that there was a ring in it and sure enough it was a very nice diamond ring.

When I Googled the ladies name I got an obituary from the Billings Gazette and the Great Falls Tribune. The lady, age 84, had passed away in Rapid City, South Dakota on the 11th of August from complications from an accident. The obituary showed some relatives in Montana but none in Great Falls. The last people mentioned in the obituary were a sister- in law and brother-in-law but there was no address. Her ashes were buried in the Manchester Cemetery and it showed a Great Falls mortuary had handled the services. I called them and explained the circumstances and they told me that the last people listed on the obituary were in the Great Falls area and because they were not listed in the phone book they could not give me their number but that they would contact them and give them my number to call. A short time later a very nice lady called me and I asked her if she had donated a pair of glasses for the deceased and she said yes and I asked her where and she told me Wal-Mart in Great Falls. I then told her what I had found and she broke down and cried. She told me she was executor of the estate and that she was to receive 3 pieces of jewelry and she had two but they had searched every where and never found the ring. This ring meant a lot to her as it was her brother who was married to the deceased and had given her that ring Her brother passed away in 2005. It was the decease's second marriage and that was in 1980. About an hour ago the sister-in-law stopped by the house and picked up the ring. She said that she could not believe that she had the ring all along and then gave it away. She was grateful beyond words and right now she thinks the Lions are the greatest organization in the world. This one really made me feel good.






Call For Nominations from the Canadian Lions of MD 37

At our MD 37 District Convention to be held in Helena, Montana on May 17 – 18, 2013, there will be an election for the following office:

Alberta Provincial Director for Lions Foundation of Canada (Dog Guides) for 2014 – 2017.

Nominations for this position are to be received by the MD 37 Office on or before March 1, 2013. They can be sent by email to cst.tim@gapproductions.com or mailed to MD 37 Office, 147 Rocky Ridge Bay NW, Calgary, AB, T3G 4E7

The following are the qualification for the position for you information:

ARTICLE 5 QUALIFICATIONS FOR PROVINCIAL DIRECTORS

Section I: To qualify as a Candidate for Provincial Director on the Lions Foundation of Canada Board, he or she must;

- (a) Be a Lion in good standing; and
- (b) Any one of the following:
 - (i) Served as a District Representative for the Lions Foundation of Canada as appointed by the Provincial Director
 - (ii) Served as a District Representative for the Lions Foundation of Canada as appointed by the District Governor
 - (iii) Served as the Multiple District Representative for the Lions Foundation of Canada as appointed by the Council Chairman
 - (iv)Has served as District Governor, and has participated in the Lions Foundation of Canada's orientation program;
 - (v) Has served as a Representative, appointed by the Lions Foundation of Canada Board promoting and supporting one of the Lions Foundation of Canada projects.
- (c) It shall be the duty of the sitting Director to advise the selecting body of the qualifications required to be nominated as a Provincial Director.

Section 2:

- (a) All nominations as a candidate for the position of Provincial Director shall come as the result of whatever process has been adopted by each individual province for selection of its Provincial Director, and all such nominations, together with a resume of the candidate's Qualifications, including but not limited to his/her Business Experience, Community Activity, Lionistic Record and Current Involvement, must be received at the Foundation's Head Office in Oakville, on or before December 31st, of the year immediately preceding the year the Director would be elected to office.
- (b) It shall be the duty of the current Director to notify the Corporation in writing of the name and address of the candidate for Director for his or her Province &/or Territory.

Section 3: All nominations received by Lions Foundation of Canada for the position of Provincial Director are subject to final approval, without prejudice by the Board of Directors of the Lions Foundation of Canada provided the nominee meets the qualifications set out in Section #1. Such approval shall be at the mid-winter meeting held each year. (See Policy Manual: Appendix 1, for Provincial Selection Procedures).
