#### City, Service Clubs Win Award

The City of Medicine Hat, the **Medicine Hat Lions Club**, and the Saamis Rotary Club have been recognized with a provincial award for their efforts in making sure all children in Medicine Hat have a place to play. All three organizations are being recognized with the **Premier's Council Award of Excellence in Community** for the role they played in creating four handicapped-accessible playgrounds within the city. This summer, grand openings were held at the Strathcona Lions Playground, Saamis Rotary Playground and the Family Leisure Centre Playground.

Work has also been nearly completed at the Ross Glen Towne Centre, though a grand opening will not be held until spring.

Leslie Jerry, community inclusion coordinator, said the newly developed playgrounds have made a big difference in the lives of many Medicine Hat residents. "It's not just kids in wheel chairs or kids with mobility impairment who need the opportunity to play. There are so many other people who benefit from these playgrounds," Jerry said. "Now you have parents or grandparents who haven't been able to take their children to the playground before who now can."

While the city decided in 2007 that it wanted to have an accessible playground in each sector of the city, it couldn't have reached its goal as quickly as it did without the support of the two service clubs.

#### The Lions Club was successful in accessing \$145,000 in grant money for the Strathcona project, in addition to putting in \$20,000 of its own funds.

"It was a very worthwhile project, and we feel really good about it," said Monty Kunz, Lions Club president. "It's certainly doing a lot for the community ... There were lots of kids enjoying it this summer and that's what it's about."

The Saamis Rotary Club paid for basically the entire project at Saamis Rotary Park, putting in \$650,000 of its own money.

"This is the biggest project our club has ever taken on," said Rotary Club member and project manager Lyle Walsh.

Each of the new playgrounds includes a fully accessible splash park, and the Family Leisure Centre playground includes an outdoor fitness circuit. In total, the amount of money put into the accessible playground projects amounts to nearly \$3.5 million.
"It's really about the great partnerships the city was able to have, both with the Lions Club and Saamis Rota-

"It's really about the great partnerships the city was able to have, both with the Lions Club and Saamis Rotary," Jerry said. "They just took these projects on and were very committed to them, and that's a big part of why those parks are there."







#### Lions and Luxottica

Fellow Lions I have received several request regarding our partnership with Luxottica and thank you for your inquiries. I am happy to answer your questions. The information below should give you some understanding on the history of the collaborative relationship between Luxottica and Lions Clubs International.

A collaborative relationship with *Lenscrafters Give of Sight Foundation* was introduced over 20 years ago through the Public Relations Department at LCI. That foundation is now known as the *One Sight Foundation*. Lenscrafters is one of a group of retail stores owned by Luxottica. In the early years of the collaboration, Lenscrafters had sent shipments of used eyeglasses to our official Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers. Years later, Luxottica established the OneSight Foundation which conducts its own global eye care missions and global clinics. It also established a network of its own recycling centers and promotes the collection of used eyeglasses in its own Luxottica retail stores,

LensCrafters Eyeglass Collection: Luxottica retail stores (LensCrafters, Pearle Vision, Target Optical, Sears Optical and others) accept donations of gently used eyeglasses. The glasses are no longer collected for exclusive distribution to Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centers; most are diverted to One-Sight Foundation recycling centers for processing for OneSight global clinics. The OneSight Foundation is a foundation of Luxottica. No Lions official eyeglass collection boxes are displayed in Luxottica retail stores, as per the Luxottica policy. OneSight utilizes its own branded eyeglass collection box in the retail stores.

One Sight Eyeglass Recycling Centers: OneSight has established 15 Global Eyewear Recycling Centers located in Australia, Italy and North America to process eyeglasses for OneSight Global Clinics and optical missions.

**Public Assistance Requests:** Luxottica retail stores have referred members of the public to local Lions clubs in cases of financial need to obtain eye care and corrective lenses. There is no link to LCI from the OneSight Web site. However, LCI does provide a link to the OneSight "Special Price Vouchers" program brochure, to provide information to USA and Canada Lions for terms of use (\$50 per pair in USA and \$70 per pair in Canada). Also note that the LCI Web pages does not promote or refer to collaborative eyeglass collection efforts between LensCrafters and LCI.

#### SOUTHERN ALBERTA LIONS LEADERSHIP RALLY – WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT

St Paddy's Day is coming and that will be the theme of the 3rd Annual Southern Alberta Rally "Leaping into Leadership" co-hosted by Districts 37N and 37O on the weekend of March 16 - 18 in Brooks.

I've seen many of you at previous rallies but there are others that may be asking, what the heck is a Rally? A good question considering they are relatively new. Consider a rally to be a mini leadership forum. The annual officer training school provides great training for incoming presidents, secretaries and treasurers and orientation for new Lions but the Rally will provide tools that all Lions interested in growing their club and the organization can benefit from.

The rally starts Friday night with registration and a St Patrick's Day themed social with a no host bar.

Saturday morning starts with a short opening ceremony followed by the first two of a dozen break out session. District Governors Sharon and Rose have suggested some excellent topics for your enjoyment and edification.

Each breakout period will have a choice of two sessions. The first pair will be "Goal Setting" and "Give Your Club a Facelift". Many times we talk about our club problems and never get around to doing anything about them. This session will give you tools to take back to your club that will let you determine what programs will let you improve your club and what resources you need to accomplish your plan. The other session give you ideas to help retain your existing members and make the club attractive to new members.

After a short break the next sessions start. "Build the Best Club Ever" explores the new Club Excellence Process. The Club Excellence Process helps a club look at community needs, analyze the make-up and operation of their club, look up valuable resources and work on action plans to make a club stronger. "Find Your Way Through LCI's Information Technology" will walk you through the many tools available on the LCI web site. There should be WIFI available at the hotel so bring your laptop or iPad and follow along with the instructor.

After a short break delegates will have a choice between "Club Public Relations / Your Club and the Media" or "Solving Common Club Problems". Something I hear over and over is that people don't know about Lions or the great things we do. The first session will give you tips on how to publicize the work your club does and perhaps generate some new members. The other session will explore problems faced by many clubs and look at ways to overcome them.



Lunch will be served in the conference room and we are going to be entertained by Past International Director Ted Fusco and his wife Lion Rita on "Putting the Fun back in Lionism". We are here because we believe that we make a difference in our communities but fun and fellowship play a large role in keeping us fresh, dedicated to the work of Lions and wanting to come to meetings.

The afternoon sessions start with "Fundraising" and "The Importance of Attending Rallies, Conventions and Forums". Fundraising is a constant challenge with so many organizations competing for the public's dollars. District and Multiple District gatherings are important not only to conduct the business of Lions but to make connections with other club members, share experiences and learn.

The following sessions will be "Managing Club Meetings / Logging into the Lions Training Courses" and "Mentoring – The Key to Retention". Meetings can and should be a lot of fun but often are pretty boring. There are many tips on the LCI website for supercharging your meetings. The objective of the Lions Mentoring Program is to help every member achieve the goal of better serving his or her community. It does so through a program of personal development that helps members realize the potential that their unique skills and knowledge offer.

The final pair of sessions is "LCIF – Our Lions Foundation / Get a Grip on LCI Grants and Resources Available" along with "Attracting and Keeping Younger Members". Lions owe it to themselves to learn about the amazing work that we do around the world. The process for applying for a grant is straight forward and this session will prepare you for making an application. As many of our club members age it becomes more difficult to recruit new members from coworkers and family so this session will help you set up a recruiting plan that works for your club.

The Saturday evening banquet will include guest speaker PIP Judge Brian Stevenson. Those who have heard him speak know why he is in demand by Lions around the world and if you haven't heard him you owe it to yourself to come to the Rally.

Sunday morning will have a two hour workshop on "Business Plans for Clubs". This hands-on session will help you prepare action plans you can take back to your club and begin the process of improvement.

This event will benefit both experienced Lions as well as those new to the organization. I urge every club to send at least two members to the Rally. This will not only ensure the success of the rally but will provide tools to start the process of club improvement.

The early bird registration ends at the end of this month.



#### **Participant Qualifications**
