Each received a \$ 1,400 check for their organizations as result of Race Through Rosauer's April 11. Checks were presented by Rod Gillman, Lions Club president, and Mike Chamberlain, Race chairman. It was a three-way split with another \$ 1,400 from net proceeds being used by Kalispell Lions Club to help purchase eyeglasses for Flathead Valley residents. West Shore Food Bank received food worth \$1,292.34 in the five minute shopping spree made by Leslie Knuth. She was delegated by Joyce Greve, winning ticket holder, to do the running/shopping. Tickets purchased by valley residents for \$5 each provided \$ 5,643 funds for first time Kalispell Lions Club project.

Accidental Insurance for Lions Clubs of Southern Alberta

This notice is being sent to the lions clubs of Southern Alberta to update them on information they may not be aware of.

Currently Lions Clubs International does not supply any <u>Accidental Insurance</u> for lions clubs globally. The accidental insurance supplied by them is for 3rd party liability only.

After an incident in which a lion from one of our clubs was severely hurt after working a Bingo for his club it became apparent we needed to research this further.

Lion Bill Krywolt president of the Coleman Club researched and found an insurer that will insure any or all of the 28 Clubs on the Alberta side of our District that wish to participate in this coverage. I have attached the information showing the coverage available, age restrictions and cost to the Clubs. In order to get this group rate two of our Clubs had to sign up initially and thanks to both the Blairmore & Coleman Lions Club coverage is now available as a contract for lions was established by them in June.

I want to thank Lion Bill Krywolt for personally taking on this venture and agreeing to be our liaison between the clubs and the insurer. If your Club is interested in signing up for this please contact him with your requests or any questions you may have at

Client: Lions Clubs

Insureds: Class A – All Board Members under age 75, Class B – All Members under age 75, Class C – All Non member volunteers under age 75.

Coverage: Class A: Bodily Injury caused by an accident occurring while on a business trip for the policyholder. Coverage begins when they leave home or work and continues on a 24 hour basis until they return. Class B & C – Bodily injury caused by an accident occurring while performing their assigned volunteer duties at the volunteer work site. 












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CANADA PAYMENT INSTRUCTIONS

Below are instructions for making Club payments and LCIF donations.

I. CLUB PAYMENTS VIA CREDIT CARD:

Club Treasurers with a valid MyLCI User ID and Password may pay by credit card via MyLCI on the Lions Clubs International website (www.lionsclubs.org). After logging into MyLCI choose CLUB, STATEMENT and PAY NOW. Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express credit and debit cards are accepted.

II. The Association's account in Toronto is chartered to accept either US or Canadian dollar checks drawn on a Canadian Bank.

<u>A. CLUB PAYMENTS</u> and other LCI payments: Please clearly identify your payment (include the statement bottom, write the complete club name and club number on the front of the check, or send an invoice copy). Checks will be credited to the appropriate club account(s) as of the date they are received by the lockbox.

B. LCIF Donation: Please clearly identify your donation.
