



"Children Know Peace" 2011-2012 Grand Prize Winnerin Lions International Peace Poster Contest

Trisha Co Reyes, a 13-year-old girl from Manila, Philippines, has been named the grand prize winner in the 24th annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest. "In my painting, the hidden child is me," Reyes said. "Exhibited are children from all over the world who have love, freedom, unity and peace." Reyes' poster was chosen from the 126 posters from 60 countries that made it to the international level of judging after being narrowed down at local levels. Annually, more than 350,000 entries are drawn by children ages 11 to 13.

As the grand prize winner, Reyes will receive US\$5,000 and a trip to a special awards ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations in New York City.

Helena Middle School student wins peace poster awards

Hailey Henrikson, a Helena Middle School seventh-grader, recently won two awards for her peace poster, designed for an International Lions Club contest.

At a Wednesday night awards dinner, she received a plaque, certificate and cash awards totaling \$350 for winning both at the district and multi-district level. They were presented by Lions District No. 37 Governor Sharon West of Lethbridge, Alberta.

Henrikson's design, "Children are the Pathway to Peace," depicts a dove's wings hugging the Earth. In its beak, the dove holds ribbons that turn into banners, becoming a path made of the flags of the world, with people of all ethnic backgrounds and animals converging into a smiling crowd.

"Some of the children are holding books about plants of the world to learn more about the environment," said Henrikson.



Erikson called her peace poster design Children are the Pathway to Peace.

"I felt she did an exceptional job," said West. "She did it when she was just 12 years old. We were extremely impressed with it."

Henrikson said she had about 10 days to come up with the design, after hearing about the contest from HMS art teacher Victor Daniel.

"I knew a dove had to be in there and flags have to be in there," she said of her design ideas. And, of course, children were a major focus because this year's theme was Children Know Peace.

The Lions International Peace Poster contest for 11- to 13-year-olds has been held for 27 years, said Leo Medina, president of the Helena Lions Club. However, this is only the second year his club has participated in it. Medina approached Victor Daniel last fall about HMS entering the contest and sponsoring their entry. More than 100 HMS students created posters

Henrickson's poster was the one submitted to West from Helena Middle School. West selected it as the top design from a group of six submitted from schools in Lions District 37, which includes

Western Montana and Southern Alberta. Henrikson's poster then went on to the multidistrict competition, made up of five districts, where it also won the

Youth from more than 100 countries participat-ed in the annual international contest, and this year's top winner is from the Philippines. The names of the 24 merit finalists have yet to be released.

"I think I'm pretty lucky," Henrikson said of her awards. "I'm pretty proud of myself."

At 13, she already thinks of herself as an artist and has sold her works in a local gallery. She loves to create in a variety of media — pen-cil, color pencils and chalks, clay, fabric, col-lage — and is looking for-ward to entering the next peace poster contest that's already under way. She's also self-publishing her first book, 'Guardian Wolves," an adventure story about a she-wolf.




