

BIOGRAPHY

WILLARD J. (BILL) BROWN District 37N Hall of Fame Winner

Bill Brown grew up in Pincher Creek, Alberta and received most of his formal Education in Calgary where he received a Business Administration Diploma. He married Lynda in December, 1998 and has one son, Grant. They moved back to Pincher Creek, Alberta from Dun-

das, Ontario in June 2000 and then moved to Lethbridge in May 2006.

Bill is visually impaired, having lost his sight from Retinitis Pigmentosis (RP), which is a progressive eye condition and he now is totally blind.

Bill worked for the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) for over thirty-seven years and accepted early retirement in 1996. His position, at that time, was District Manager for the CNIB in Hamilton, which had over 60 staff members.

Bill joined the Lions organization in 1976 and has been very active in Club and District activities ever since. He was President of the Hamilton Central Lions Club in 1993-94 and President of the newly formed Hamilton West Lions Club in 97-98. He achieved the 100% President's Award for both these terms. He was the Governor for District A-11 in 1998-99. He also served as the President of the Pincher Creek Lions in 2003-2004. After moving to Alberta he again served as the District Governor for District 37-D (Southern Alberta/Northwest Montana) for the Lions year 2001-2002. He has been the District Chair for the Lions Foundation of Canada (LFC) ever since coming to Alberta and he uses a poodle guide dog which was trained at LFC. He has been recognized by LFC who presented him with the LFC fellowship and in 2011 he was made a patron of the Lions Foundation of Canada which is one of the highest honours a Lion volunteer can receive.

Lion Bill has had the distinct honour of being recognized by Lions Clubs International five times by being presented with the International


President's Certificate of Appreciation in 1988, 1992 1999, 2000 and again in 2010. He was presented the Helen Keller award and the Judge Brian Stevenson award in recognition of his outstanding efforts as Governor in Ontario. He was presented with the Melvin Jones award by the Pincher Creek Lions in 2006.

Bill has also been recognized by Communities where he has worked and he was presented with the ACRA award in 1986 while in Markham, ON which is an award that is presented to persons for their outstanding contribution to the municipality in community service.

In 1996 he was presented the Peter Street Inspirational award for his outstanding contribution to the community in Hamilton, ON. This award is presented to individuals who provide inspiration to disabled persons in the community through example.

Some of Bill's hobbies include walking and jogging with his Dog Guide Jax and playing guitar for his own pleasure.

He is a very positive individual and has a good sense of humour.

VISION SCREENING PROJECT

Hello Lions:

It's time for an update on our efforts regarding the Vision Screening Project, using the Plusoptix Vision Screening Devices. This Lion's project has been very successful because of the efforts of a number of Lions around the State of Montana. While getting the funding was a necessary starting point, it is the Lions that have been involved with the actual vision screening that have really made this project a success.

One update is that all of the paperwork has been sent off to LCIF to close out the grant that resulted in the Lions of Montana getting \$29,400.00 that was used to purchase of vision screening devices. This matching grant resulted in a number of Clubs being able to have a vision screening device within their Club or Zone so as to share with other Clubs. This has helped to reduce the commuting distance for a Club to be able to use a screening device. This has resulted in providing vision screening to more communities, either through local schools, day-care centers or other venues. THANKS to the Lions that have been leading the charge in this project. Now is the time for other Clubs to check out the vision screening devices and see how they work and how quickly the screening can be accomplished.

At present there are now 26 vision screening devices located in Clubs around the State. These scattered devices help Lions cover the State and provide vision screening services, especially for young children. In addition a number of Lion's Clubs around the State have stepped up to provide funding so to allow the Montana Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation, as well as other Clubs take advantage of these "matching" funds. Those devices that are "owned" by the MTLS&HF are then placed with Clubs in more rural areas, thus increasing the coverage of this project. This provides for a win, win situation for the Clubs and the communities that they serve.

Another development was to have Lion Doctor Murdoch, from the Missoula Southside Lions, along with Lions Jayne and Bill Pfeifer provide information to the County Nurses at their State Convention in Belgrade this past month. Doctor Murdoch, an optometrist, provided the Lion's share of the information and answered numerous questions regarding the vision screening. As a result of this effort do not be surprised if your Club is contacted regarding the Lions ability to help with vision screening for the schools. The demonstration and discussions after the meeting showed how quickly the vision screenings could be accomplished with the Plusoptix, either the S09 or the S12 and I'm guessing that the schools will be checking to see if they can get help with this important issue.

To that end I've been working with Lion Jerry Leggate, from the Billings Lions on getting more information posted to the website regarding Plusoptix vision screening. That website is www.montanalions.org and once there it is a simple click of the mouse to get to the site having Plusoptix information. In the near future a contact list for each of the Vision Screening devices will be loaded and available for all to view. There is presently some information located there regarding the program.

Dear Lion Monte,

On behalf of International President Barry Palmer, I am pleased to share with you that Lions Clubs International's Board of Directors has approved a special pilot program to waive the charter or entrance fee for U.S. Veterans of all ages.

The *Involve a U.S. Veteran* program is being offered only in the United States. The program waives the charter or entrance fee for any qualifying veteran who joins a new or existing Lions club between July 1st, 2013 and June 30th, 2015.

Eligible veterans include retired U.S. military personnel or honorably-discharged members of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard Services, Marines, National Guard, Navy or Reserves. Those currently serving in the National Guard or Reserves are also eligible. Lions Clubs International will provide an entrance fee waiver of \$25 (\$30 for charter members) to the first 5,000 qualified U.S. veterans that join a local Lions club.

Veterans have made so many great contributions and sacrificed so much to serve our country. As service members are honorably discharged from the military, let's offer them an opportunity to get involved in their communities.

How the Contest Works

Only a Loons club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2013. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Our World, Our Future."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from ar the world.

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are

- · International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to the award ceremony at Lions Day with the United Nations (subject to change). At the ceremony he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardatan) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony. The award ceremony is scheduled for March 2014.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.
