




### CANADIAN COIN SAVERS FOR SALE FOR YOUR CLUB FUNDRAISING PROJECTS

#### What is Measles? The Lions Solution!

Every year, tragedy strikes families all over the world. The newspaper and the news doesn't report it but it happens all the same. Measles kills 380 children every day or 139,300 children every year. Those that survive suffer complications such as vision loss, hearing loss, brain damage, pneumonia, Vitamin A deficiency or encephalitis.

Measles is a HIGHLY contagious viral disease that is spread through close contact by infected individuals. The infection rate for non-vaccinated individuals is a staggering 90%! Measles is a very heavy public health burden in developing countries where there is no access to vaccinations that will protect children. Additional factors such as poverty, poor health systems and a lack of information make it very hard for families to access preventative health care.

#### There is a solution!

The Measles Initiative emphasizes mass vaccination campaigns, the process of vaccinating all children in a defined age range in a short period of time, as the best strategy to ensure wide coverage. Campaigns are usually countrywide, but may take place in multiple phases. On average Lions campaigns reach over 90% of children targeted. Each countries Ministry of Health department is responsible for organizing and conducting the campaign with support in technical and financial areas from the Measles Initiatives partners. This year, campaigns will take place in 31 countries!
