

Montana Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation Vision Screening Project

Hello Lions:

I want to take a few minutes and provide you with an update on the efforts regarding the Vision Screening Project, using the Plusoptix Vision Screening Devices. While the project is being spearheaded by the Montana Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation, the real work is being accomplished by the Lions in their local communities. Lions are presently performing vision screenings at schools, day cares, and local head start locations. This has resulted in over 2,000 youngsters being screened so far and the project is just getting started. Children as young as 5 months can be safely and easily screened using the devices.

At this time there are 12 devices within the State from Baker on the East side to Missoula and Kalispell on the West side. This is a result of Clubs making a commitment to this project and a successful matching grant from LCIF. The funding provided by LCIF provided enough funding to purchase four devices. This has helped to jump start the program across the state. Now Clubs are funding devices and getting the training and setting up vision screening within their communities. The most recent example of this is Lion Anna Griffith from the Baker Lions. While attending the District 37S Cabinet meeting (26 Jan) she took the time to attend the scheduled training for the Great Falls Lions and made the decision to purchase a device to be used to screen children in the eastern portion of the State.

It is that kind of enthusiasm that Lion Jayne and I have seen as we continue working this project with a variety of Clubs around the State. During the week of January 13, we conducted training or assisted with screening/training at Belgrade, Helena, Missoula, Lolo and Great Falls. At each of these locations the Lions involved were amazed at how quick the actual screenings were accomplished or in the case of training how quick and easy it was to learn to use the equipment and practice screening other Lions. All of this has combined to make the training and screenings thoroughly enjoyable. Towards that end Jayne and I have been demonstrating the screening devices and providing support and/or training as needed. We even travelled to District 37O's convention to do a presentation on the vision screening devices. Thanks DG Bruce for the invite!

In February Lion Jayne and I have scheduled training at Huntley, Laurel, Baker, and Billings and have setup a potential screening in the Gallatin Valley at the Three Forks School. We're also coordinating with Seeley Lake Lions to do the training for the screening device that that Club purchased.

Finally, as the project gathers momentum we need to keep in mind the need to maintain some data. This is helpful for a couple of reasons. First, Montana Lions need to ensure that we capture and establish as well as maintain accomplishment data for the Montana Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation. Second by gathering data it will help to ensure that the project leaders are able to coordinate the needed coverage for the entire state. Lastly, we need to provide data to LCIF as it relates to our accomplishments and the specifically to the grant that both Districts were able to use in procuring the vision screening devices.

Lion Jayne and I continue to be committed to this project and to seek additional funding to keep this project moving forward. We have been successful in getting not only the LCIF grant, but grants from various foundations and organizations throughout the State of Montana to help with funding the purchase of screening devices, and the accessories that are need to make this project a success.

The following are the qualification for the position for you information:

ARTICLE 5 QUALIFICATIONS FOR PROVINCIAL DIRECTORS

Section I: To qualify as a Candidate for Provincial Director on the Lions Foundation of Canada Board, he or she must;

(a) Be a Lion in good standing; and

(b) Any one of the following:

(i) Served as a District Representative for the Lions Foundation of Canada as appointed by the Provincial Director

(ii) Served as a District Representative for the Lions Foundation of Canada as appointed by the District Governor

(iii) Served as the Multiple District Representative for the Lions Foundation of Canada as appointed by the Council Chairman

(iv)Has served as District Governor, and has participated in the Lions Foundation of Canada's orientation program;

(v) Has served as a Representative, appointed by the Lions Foundation of Canada Board promoting and supporting one of the Lions Foundation of Canada projects.

(c) It shall be the duty of the sitting Director to advise the selecting body of the qualifications required to be nominated as a Provincial Director.

Section 2:

(a) All nominations as a candidate for the position of Provincial Director shall come as the result of whatever process has been adopted by each individual province for selection of its Provincial Director, and all such nominations, together with a resume of the candidate's Qualifications, including but not limited to his/her Business Experience, Community Activity, Lionistic Record and Current Involvement, must be received at the Foundation's Head Office in Oakville, on or before December 31st, of the year immediately preceding the year the Director would be elected to office.

(b) It shall be the duty of the current Director to notify the Corporation in writing of the name and address of the candidate for Director for his or her Province &/or Territory.

Section 3: All nominations received by Lions Foundation of Canada for the position of Provincial Director are subject to final approval, without prejudice by the Board of Directors of the Lions Foundation of Canada provided the nominee meets the qualifications set out in Section #1. Such approval shall be at the mid-winter meeting held each year. (See Policy Manual: Appendix 1, for Provincial Selection Procedures).
