# **District Governor Message**

It is important that all clubs submit it on time so that the incoming District Governor can put together the directory in a timely manner. Club officer training will be in Seeley Lake on June 7th. So please fill out the registration form attached to this newsletter and get it in as soon as possible. The Seeley Lake Lions have scheduled some social activities to make the training fun as well as educational. Every Lion is welcome to attend and there is **no cost** to the attendees.

I have completed 47 of my 51 club visits with Butte, Deer Lodge, and Anaconda scheduled for April 22nd and Vauxhall scheduled for May 28th. As with my previous term as DG in Wyoming 20 years ago, I have found there are as many ways to serve a community as there are clubs. Each does things a little differently, but the goal is the same: to serve our communities in the best way possilbe. I would like to thank each club that I have visited for the warm hospitality shown to me and also their generosity to my charities of choice.

All districts have had their conventions and have passed the redistricting proposal by the required two-thirds margins. One more vote is needed at the Multiple District Convention in May. It is expected that it will pass. The council met March 1st and 2nd to create the proposal. It is being reviewed by council members and advisors and a final version will be approved in Calgary to be submitted to LCI in July. The Montana Past District Governor's Association has been meeting periodically to begin the transition to a single district and the District Governors in Canada have been in touch with each other on the process for their side of the border. Don't forget the Multiple District Convention in Calgary, May 1st and 2nd. It's not too late to register.

But we still had the fear of Joel running away or bolting without us knowing. Also with his limited speech, we see that it is hard for Joel to make friends and is also often alone. So we applied for a Dog Guide Service Dog. We have been told that the bonding process will take 6 months to a year but as you can see from the pictures, we already see some bonding happening. Joel is never alone any more, he has a shadow and a loyal friend. Soon we hope Joel will take to being tethered to Verdi, but this will take time too. By the fall of 2015 we hope to send Joel and Verdi to 1st grade togeter. Hopefully they will learn to support each other and succeed in Joel's educational career.

Again, we would like to say thank you for supporting a Dog Guide. Without your support, getting Verdi would not have been possible and life would be different or limited for Joel. But now he will have an unconditional friend and we (his parents, Paul & Jill) will have the confidence that Joel will be safe as long as Verdi is with him.

## LCIF's Response to a Major Catastrophe

Over the past 10 years, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) has provided more than US\$100 million for disaster-relief programs worldwide. When a major catastrophe happens, like the recent typhoon in the Philippines, Lions around the world are quick to support fellow Lions and their communities.

When you give a donation to LCIF's Disaster Relief fund, your contribution may be used for many different types of needs. Not every disaster is the same but typically there are three different phases of a major catastrophe.

#### Immediate Needs

Donations from Lions and friends around the world provide immediate basic needs such as water, food, clothing, and medicine to the affected area. Lions Clubs in the local area begin applying for Emergency Grant assistance to fund immediate needs projects such as food distribution at a community center. Many times Lions will work alongside religious institutions and fire stations to deliver these basic needs.

#### Mid-Term Needs

Once recovery planning begins, a local committee of Lions is established to begin the process of evaluating the mid-term needs and identifying appropriate relief projects to implement. Following SuperStorm Sandy that hit the East Coast of the United States in 2012, the Lions of New Jersey received funding from LCIF to make basic home repairs for low income individuals who did not have insurance and did not receive any Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) funds to make homes habitable again. Donations may go to fund a mid-term need project such as this when you give to support Disaster Relief.

## Long-Term Needs/Rebuilding

Once a clear plan for recovery has been put in place by the government, local communities, and other community organizations, Lions begin participating in the rebuilding process. Lions have been very instrumental in the rebuilding process in Haiti following the earthquake in 2010. LCIF provided US\$1.4 million to construct new homes for 600 Haitian families who were initially housed in Lions tent cities following the earthquake. Donations may fund rebuilding projects like this significant project in Haiti. Other examples of long-term needs are rebuilding of schools and construction of hospitals and health centers.

Financial support provided by Lions and friends around the world is disbursed to the affected area incrementally. Funds go directly to the Lions Relief Committee to support their disaster related projects. Financial reporting is required with each grant and must be submitted to LCIF following a project.

Support following disasters and major catastrophes around the world are funded through LCIF's Disaster Relief area of giving. This month, consider making a donation to Disaster Relief to help support Lions and LCIF respond to disasters throughout the world. ## STROKE HAS A NEW INDICATOR

Stroke has a new indicator! They say if you e.mail this to ten people, you stand a chance of saving one life. Will you send this along? Blood Clots/Stroke - They Now Have a Fourth Indicator, the Tongue

I will continue to forward this every time it comes around!

STROKE: Remember the 1st Three Letters.... S. T. R.

#### STROKE IDENTIFICATION:

During a BBQ, a woman stumbled and took a little fall - she assured everyone that she was fine (they offered to call paramedics) ...she said she had just tripped over a brick because of her new shoes.

They got her cleaned up and got her a new plate of food. While she appeared a bit shaken up, Jane went about enjoying herself the rest of the evening.

Jane's husband called later telling everyone that his wife had been taken to the hospital - (at 6:00 PM Jane passed away.) She had suffered a stroke at the BBQ. Had they known how to identify the signs of a stroke, perhaps Jane would be with us today. Some don't die. They end up in a helpless, hopeless condition instead.

It only takes a minute to read this.

A neurologist says that if he can get to a stroke victim within 3 hours he can totally reverse the effects of a stroke...totally. He said the trick was getting a stroke recognized, diagnosed, and then getting the patient medically cared for within 3 hours, which is tough.

#### RECOGNIZING A STROKE

Thank God for the sense to remember the '3' steps, STR. Read and

Learn!

Sometimes symptoms of a stroke are difficult to identify. Unfortunately, the lack of awareness spells disaster. The stroke victim may suffer severe brain damage when people nearby fail to recognize the symptoms of a stroke.

Now doctors say a bystander can recognize a stroke by asking three simple questions:

S \*Ask the individual to SMILE.

T \*Ask the person to TALK and SPEAK A

SIMPLE SENTENCE (Coherently) (i.e. Chicken Soup)

R \*Ask him or her to RAISE BOTH ARMS.

If he or she has trouble with ANY ONE of these tasks, call emergency number immediately and describe the symptoms to the dispatcher.

New Sign of a Stroke ----- Stick out Your Tongue

NOTE: Another 'sign' of a stroke is this: Ask the person to 'stick' out his tongue. If the tongue is

'crooked', if it goes to one side or the other that is also an indication of a stroke.

A cardiologist says if everyone who gets this e-mail sends it to 10 people; you can bet that at least one life will be saved. I have done my part. Will you?

# Making Measles History

In November 2013, one of the strongest typhoons ever to make land devastated parts of the Philippines. Tens of thousands became homeless overnight and thousands more lost their lives. Lions around the world responded with generosity, raising more than US\$1 million in the first two weeks following the disaster. Yet there is another disaster that takes place each day that may not make headlines, but it takes the life of 335 children every day – more than 122,000 a year. And it's completely preventable. This disaster is measles – and Lions have vowed to continue the fight against it. Measles is one of the most infectious diseases known to humankind, and people who aren't protected have a high risk of infection. When one person has measles, 90 percent of the people they come into close contact with will become infected, if they are not vaccinated or have not previously contracted the disease.

For US\$1, a child can be vaccinated against measles making it one of the most cost-effective health interventions available. Vaccines have the power not only to save but also transform lives by protecting against disease – giving children a chance to grow up healthy, go to school, and improve their lives. In many parts of the world, parents do not have access to immunization services that could protect their children from measles. Factors such as poverty, poor health systems, and a lack of information can make it difficult for families to secure preventative vaccinations for their children.

Through our partnership with GAVI Alliance, Lions have committed to raising US\$30 million by our 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 2017 towards the fight to eliminate measles. The funds raised by Lions will be matched through the GAVI Matching Fund, which is financially supported by the United Kingdom's Department for International Development (DFID) and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, bringing the total to US\$60 million. Through our joint efforts with GAVI and other partners, we will help immunize more than 114 million children and increase access to quality immunization services to benefit children throughout the world.

World Immunization Week is April 23-30, 2014. Throughout the month, Lions in measles priority countries will be out in their communities encouraging their neighbors to participate in vaccination events and serving as volunteers at vaccination centers. Lions are essential partners in immunization campaigns throughout the world helping to make measles history and the results are remarkable. Since 2010, Lions have helped to contribute to the vaccination of 200 million children against measles.

In celebration of World Immunization Week and Lions social mobilization efforts around the world to eliminate measles, all donations for measles during the month of April will be matched dollar for dollar by Lion Aruna Oswal and her family, up to a total gift of US\$500,000. This means that during the month of April, your contribution will save four times the number of children from the potentially devastating effects of measles.
