District Governor Message

Greetings to Lions, Lioness, and Leos!

We had another great year in District 37N and I want to thank each of you for helping to make this a successful year of service and fellowship. It was not without some disappointment. The closure of clubs in Bigfork and Crowsnest Pass was a big one. But there was also a success in the chartering of the Eureka Tobacco Valley club. Club officer training was also successful with over 40 Lions attending sessions in Lethbridge and Seeley Lake.

As with every year there are challenges. This year it was the redistricting proposal. The challenge was to create it and inform all the clubs of the good and bad of that proposal and to encourage them to vote at the district convention. All district convetions and the MD Convention have passed the redistricting proposal by the required two-thirds margins. The proposal that the council created in March has been sent to Lions International for their review and approval. The decision will be made at the International Board meeting in October. If approved the work will begin in earnest for Montana to become a single district and the Canadian side to become a two district multiple. The Montana Past District Governor's Association has been meeting periodically to begin the transition to a single district and the District Governors in Canada have been in touch with each other to begin the process for their side of the border. If you are interested in participating in the process please contact me or VDG Pauline Cooper as appropriate.

Thank you for the privilege of serving you this past year as your District Governor. I have made many new friends in my travels of Alberta and Montana and I look forward to seeing you again at future Lions conventions and events.

A generous donation from the Lions Club has allowed for the purchase of new laser equipment at the Laser Eye Clinic, and this will mean more comfortable treatments and less need for patients to travel to Calgary.

The Pascal Laser — costing \$125,500 — will specifically benefit patients with diabetes that has resulted in eye issues such as diabetic macular edema, says Linda Tessmann-Potvin, Alberta Health Services director of the surgical suite and ambulatory care at Medicine Hat Regional Hospital.

"About 15 to 20 patients a week are expected to benefit from the Pascal Laser," said Tessmann-Potvin, "It will reduce the number of times patients have to travel to Calgary."

For the Lions Club of Medicine Hat it was the perfect fit for an organization challenged

decades ago by Helen Keller to support eye care. In 1925 at a convention Keller asked Lions Clubs to become Knights of Blind.

"The number of laser bursts in one or two treatments with this equipment is significantly less than what has been available in Medicine Hat," said Kim Simpson, secretary for Lions Club of Medicine Hat, "There are some patients who were not prepared for multiple treatments that included one or two laser bursts at a time."

The only other option patients had was to travel to Calgary and for those who were not able to drive themselves it meant having to arrange for family members to assist them, said Alan Bergen, Lions Club

"This piece of equipment will change peoples' lives," said Jason Melhoff chair of the Medicine Hat & District Health Foundation. "We respect all that the Lions Club does for the community."

When the foundation understood how Lions Club wanted to see its donation used, it became a case of research to determine the best fit to achieve those goals, said Melhoff.

The Lions Club has been a significant part of the community since 1950 and has over the years contributed more than \$330,000 through the Medicine Hat & District Health Foundation.

<u>2014-2015 District 37-N Cabinet</u>

The following table shows the Cabinet positions (and incumbents) for District 37N for the Lionistic year 2014 -2015.

As you can see, there are some vacancies:

- <u>District Advisor</u> is usually a Past International Director (PID), and since we do not have a PID who belongs to any club in our district, this position will remain vacant.
- **2ndVDG**: the District actually needs two 2ndVDGs the elections for both will take place at the District Convention the first will fill the vacancy that currently exists for the Lionistic year 2014-2015, and the second will be expected to be 2ndVDG in 2015-2016, subject to redistricting results/process. If you are interested, please submit your name with your club endorsement to DG Pauline Cooper, 1st VDG Cathy Anderson, or District Secretary Ardith Tjornelund.
- **Global Membership Team** and **Global Leadership Team**: please contact either PDG Laura Dickerson or PDG Sharon West if you are interested.
- **Zone Chairperson**: There are currently 3 Vacancies one in **Zone 4** (Bow Island, Brooks, Irvine & District, Medicine Hat, Medicine Hat community View and Redcliff), one in **Zone 6** (East Missoula, Hamilton, Hellgate, Lolo, Missoula, Missoula Southside and Seeley Lake), and one in **Zone 7** (Charlo, Hot Springs, Plains, Polson, Ronan, Superior). You must have been a Club President in order to accept the duties and responsibilities of the Zone Chairperson. This is an important position because the Zone Chairperson is closer to the individual clubs and has a better 'feel' for what is going on. He/She is the liaison between the club and the District Governor. Help!
- We need to have representatives on both sides of our District to keep the Lions Clubs informed. Please be part of the success!
- Youth Exchange/Lions Quest/Peace Poster: PCC George Takashima and Lions Arnold and Edna Nelson are taking on the challenge of reviving the Youth Exchange Program in our District. I expect there will be other 'Youth-related' issues that will come their way. Lions Quest and the Peace Poster Contest are other wonderful programs and valuable tools in developing and engaging our youth. They deserve to have individuals promoting them to clubs on both sides of the border! Please consider getting involved!
- There are several other programs that have traditionally had Chairperson positions on Cabinet.
