What an amazing place! I was able to tour both training facilities in Oakville and Breslau. The breeding program is located at the Breslau facility. The puppies are so cute!!

The mission of the Dog Guides School is to assist Canadians with medical or physical disabilities with a dog at no cost. Dogs are now provide assistance in six areas: vision, hearing, seizure response, special skills, autism assistance, and now this fall the first class in diabetic alert dogs will graduate.

Programs like this are so important because it helps those with need to become independent productive members of society while getting their self-respect back. But, just as important is the free from worry that recipient's family gets because a specially trained dog is watching over loved ones.

This program is worthy of any support you can give it. It is funded entirely by donations from individuals, service clubs, foundations, and corporations. No funding is received from the government. MD 37 REDISTRICTING 2013-14

Hello fellow Lions, you may have heard by now that some Lions from the State of Montana have expressed an interest in breaking away from the Multiple District to form their own single District with-in the borders of Montana. This idea was brought to the 2012-2013 MD 37 Council in January and a committee was formed to explore possible ways to redistrict the Canadian part of MD 37. At the council meeting in Helena the committee presented 2 plans, one a 3 district plan and one a 2 district plan, Council voted at Helena to explore these options and the best way to do that is to vote on a re-districting resolution.

At an on-line Council Meeting in August, Council discuss the resolution that was needed to see if redistricting would be feasible, at this online meeting the DG of District 37-O suggested an alternate 2 district plan (the details are in resolution below) and after some discussion a vote was taken and the result was unanimous to accept the alternate 2-district plan.

After council had accepted the redistricting plan a resolution was developed and voted on. The result of the vote was unanimous to go with the following resolution at all district conventions and at the MD convention.

"Be it resolved that the Lions Clubs of Montana separate from Multiple District 37 to form their own single District 37 within the borders of Montana, and the Canadian Clubs of Multiple District 37 be re-constituted as a new Canadian Multiple District C, with two sub-Districts. The redistricting would take place at the beginning of the 2015-2016 fiscal year.

The two Canadian sub-Districts to be constituted as follows:

District A to be the merger of current Districts 37-L and 37-I.

District B to be the merger of current District 37-O with the Canadian Clubs currently a part of District 37-N."

The timeline for this process would be: voting at all district conventions during 2013-14; voting at the Calgary MD 37 Convention in May 2014; submit proposal to LCI in time for their October 2014 board meeting; if approved by LCI, redistricting would take effect July 1, 2015.

As this redistricting process affects the entire Multiple District it is our responsibility as Lions in MD 37 to understand the process and that all clubs ensure that their voting delegates attend your district convention and MD Convention to vote your clubs wishes.

Remember this is not a decision that a few Lions should be making for the MD it is one that all Lions in the MD should be making through your voting delegates.
