
FLAGS FOR FIRST GRADERS

DO YOU SHOP AT FRED MEYER?

Oregon Springfield Lions Foundation, our club's 501c3, is now part of the Fred

Meyer Community Rewards Program. Our Foundation can receive a small amount of money from Fred Meyer when individuals who have enrolled in the Fred Meyer Rewards Program, and have designated the Foundation to receive rewards, make purchases at Fred Meyer.

- Here's how it works:
- Customers must have a registered Fred Meyer Rewards card. If you don't have a Rewards card, you can register for one at the Fred Meyer customer service desk.
- Then visit https://www.fredmeyer.com and log into your account. New users will first need to create an account. Once you have an account and are logged in, you can scroll down to the bottom and go into the Fred Meyer Community Rewards section. From there you can link your card to an organization, and either search for Oregon Springfield Lions Foundation by name or type in NX987, which is the Foundation's NPO (non profit organization) number for the program. Then click Enroll. If you are already supporting another organization through the Rewards program, you can switch to the Oregon Springfield Lions Foundation program if you choose.
- **IMPORTANT:** At check-out, you must either swipe your registered Fred Meyer Rewards card, or enter the phone number that is attached to that Rewards card, for your purchase to count toward the Foundation receiving any money.
