



Lions' dedication to combating this deadly disease

is a clear demonstration of our deep commitment to protecting the health and well being of our most vulnerable children.

We have shown the world that we are not only the Knights of the Blind but protectors of children, as well. LCIF is currently working with the Gates Foundation to chart our future course. The Morden Lions Club wanted to support Lions Clubs International Measles Project, ONE SHOT, ONE LIFE.

As, HOCKEY, is a very important part of the community, the Lions, called the project, Morden Lions Shoot Out Measles Challenge. A partnership with Agassiz Medical Centre, as event Supporter, amd Little Caesars, as event Sponsor, was drafted. The Shoot Out, was held over three days, October 23, at Ecole Morden Middle School, October 24 at Access Events Centre, October 25 at Agassiz Medical Centre.

The Event produced 16 Sharp Shooters, by 15 different participants. A Sharp Shooter was a participant who was able to shoot the street hockey ball through the hole in the board, covering the net opening.




