1200 batteries turn into donation dollars

Virden Lions Club members get satisfaction reclaiming environmentally hazardous discarded batteries, and turning them into dollars to donate to needy causes in the community.

About 15 Lions pitched in to parcel up nearly 1,200 batteries in cardboard containment, to make the second recycling shipment this year.

The morning's work takes place on Garnet Goodridge's land near Virden. He is the Lions Club treasurer and an organizer of the drive, along with president of the Lions, John Carefoot, who is one of the major collectors.

At 50 battery packages, two levels deep per skid Goodridge says emphatically, "We appreciate the use of Bruce Bailey's fork lift," he adds, "Valleyview Co-op loaned us the pallet jack for moving the packages in the trailer."

After the job is done Virginia Goodridge and Shirley Carefoot supplied the lunch for the hungry crew.

The semi load of batteries is hauled to Winnipeg where the lead, zinc and even the acid is extracted for re-use.

The Lions pick-up provides a real service for the likes of farmers, and recycling them is an environmental must.

Ten used radiators also make up the load. Rich in valuable copper, these are more than just junk.

The Club has a fund account for the cash they make. They have donated tens of thousands of dollars over the years to community needs and to cancer research.

Another act of compassion, Goodrich explains is a donation of \$500 from the Lions, to anyone unfortunate enough to have suffered destruction of home or property in a fire, such as the four-plex residents, recently burned out of their residences on Queen Street.

How best to send The Lion newspaper to members?

The 5M13 Manitoba Lion newspaper is beginning its 27th year of publication. In our planning, we are looking for ways to produce and distribute the "Manitoba Lion Newspaper" in a cost efficient and effective manner.

DISTRICT 5M-13

We want to reach all of our clubs and members on a regular basis and this is where we need your help.

Each of the 10 issues for the year cost \$1200.00 to produce and mail to all of our clubs. Revenue generated from the club directory ads (\$100.00/year/ club) and business advertisements totals \$8,800.00 for the year.

We have three options to either reduce costs or generate more revenue, but would like to hear from Lions Clubs for their input as to what they feel would serve their members the best.

> Please give us direction how your club and members would best like to receive and distribute the 5M13 Manitoba Lion. Any comments and suggestions will be most appreciated. If each club and / or member would contact Editor Lion Bill McKitrick in the next few weeks, it would be most appreciated.

- **Option One:** To continue with the same format we would need to increase revenue OR reduce costs or a combination of both. If we increase the costs of the club directory and business advertisements from \$100.00 to \$150.00/year we would have enough revenue to continue printing the Manitoba Lion and distributing copies to clubs for their members.
- **Option two:** We could reduce the number of papers that are mailed to each club to only 2 or 3 per issue. We could also send each issue electronically and have a club member print copies for the rest of the club members as required. This could be done without an increase in advertisement prices.
- **Option three:** Could be to produce an electronic paper only, that would be available for everyone to access on their computer via the 5M13 e-district clubhouse website. This would reduce the mailing and printing costs to the district substantially and might result in a reduction in the advertising costs to approximatley \$50.00 per year. The draw back would be that a club member would have to print copies for their members who do not have access to the internet.
