



Ross' exchange experience

In February of 2012, Grayson Ross competed and won the Lions Club 5M-13 Youth Speak-off in Shilo.

Awarded a sponsorship from the Virden Lions Club to take part in a Lions Youth Exchange to a camp of his choice, Ross chose to go to England.

The 20 day exchange trip took place July 24.

For the first 10 days, Ross stayed with a host family in Little Hampton, England, on the south coast, a little seaside town. Although, Ross added, it was more like the size of Brandon.

The host family had preplanned activities for Ross including a hike around the countryside and a couple of days in London.

The first day was full of museum tours. The second day Ross toured areas which included Buckingham Palace, Westminster Abby, and the Tower of London. He also went to Arundel Castle, where one of the queens cousin's lives. "It was very impressive," said Ross. "London was definitely a major highlight for me. It was really great to see all of the major attractions that the city offers to the world."

The following 10 days were spent at Lions Youth

Camp in Dorset, England. There were 40 other students from around the world taking part in the exchange.

Ross was the only one from Canada, noting that there were no Americans there either. People came from Mexico, Brazil, Peru, Finland, Iceland, Norway, Spain, Italy, Macedonia, Estonia, Georgia (small country near Russia), Turkey, Israel and Japan. "I was the only exchange participant with English as a first language which was a unique experience in itself," Ross said.

It was an activity camp where there were different things to do every day, such as a rock climbing wall, a 15 mile hike and a couple of days out to surrounding communities.

At the end of the 10 days at camp everyone exchanged their contact information.

Ross says he has brought back a real appreciation for how lucky we are in Canada. "I learned that in Israel, once you are 18 you have to join the army. There were two girls taking part in the exchange from

Israel who had recently turned 18 and once they returned home, they would soon be joining the armed forces. That really made me think - especially about my sister. I'm very relieved that the same situation isn't forced upon her. This made me appreciate the many luxuries and freedoms that we have in Canada."

Next?	Set goals
(45-60 minutes)	Create action plans
	Program review

What will I do in a CEP Workshop? How much time will a workshop take?

Each Lion attending a CEP Workshop will be completing several assignments under the guidance of a facilitator. Two of these assignments are the *Community Needs Assessment* and the *How Are Your Ratings?* survey. Clubs may be asked by their facilitator to complete these assignments before, during, or after the workshop. The program consists of four steps that are approximately an hour each. The program can be delivered in one session or two sessions as opposed to four. Each workshop session can be held at a club meeting, club retreat or other gathering. The entire process should take no longer than 4 months.

Swan Valley Clubs officially open New Recycling Depot

The Recycling Depot Ribbon Cutting took place on Tuesday, August 13, 2013. VLRI President and Swan River Lion Cliff Kooistra (2nd from left) as well as VLRI Board member and Minitonas Lion George Church helped to cut the ribbon with the other Town and RM representatives.

The Valley Lions Recycling Incorporated (who uses the building) is owned by the three Swan Valley Clubs - Bowsman Lions, Minitonas Lions, and the Swan River Lions. VLRI currently employs eight people and has recycled over two million pounds of material since starting and is believed to be the largest operation of it's kind in Manitoba outside of Winnipeg.

The building itself is owned by the Town of Swan River and RM of Swan River and is located at their landfill dump. Operating and capital costs is to be shared on a per capita basis by the nine participating user municipalities that includes the local G7 municipalities (Town of Swan River, RM of Swan River, Town of Minitonas, RM of Minitonas, Village of Bowsman, RM of Mountain, and Village of Benito) as well as the RM of Elthelbert and RM of Mossey River.

The new Depot is 5000 square feet and cost approximately \$700,000. It is a replacement for the old building which had burned down on August 31st, 2011 as a result of arson.

Brandon Lions Club celebrates 75 years

The Brandon Lions Club celebrated 75 years on Saturday, September 14, 2013 with a shindig at Sokol Hall.

Around 145 people filled the hall to enjoy a meal, music and magic, while raising money for the shrinking service club.

"We want people to laugh, we want people to sing, we want them to enjoy the evening," said Ben Ward, the club's treasurer.

The Brandon Lions Club, one of five Lions clubs in the city, is down to just 15 members, a stark difference from 90 members in its heyday.

The Lions manor remains the crown jewel of achievement for the local clubs, a not-forprofit Life Lease housing complex for seniors 55 years of age and older.

The original building was built in 1989 with 65 one-bedroom apartments and 63 twobedroom apartments. Thirty-two suites are fully subsidized by the provincial government and the remaining suites are financed



via the Life Lease method and are operated on a not-for-profit basis.

The addition was built in 1999 and offers six apartment layout options and the convenience of indoor parking.

"There's almost 300 waiting to get in," Ward said. "You look at the cost of a condo or the cost of some of the places they're building in Brandon, they're just too expensive for people."

Like many service clubs in the area, Ward said the Lions haven't been successful in attracting young members, the main reason for its low membership as it celebrates its golden anniversary.

"The club did not bring in members as the years went by, they kind of thought we'd live forever and so as Lions slowly passed away, they become a very old club," Ward said. Most members are older than 75 and the oldest Lions member, Bob Ghedoni, celebrated his 100th birthday on Sunday. He's been a member since the beginning.

"Now we are so old that young people don't want to join us," Ward said. In an effort to remain viable, the Crocus, Keystone and Brandon Lions clubs joined forces this year to put a float in the Traveller's Day parade.

This could be a sign of a potential amalgamation of the region's five clubs, Ward said. "It's a movement in that direction," he said. "It would give us more manpower.

"Each club does their own thing, some sell fertilizer, some sell pumpkins and we usually put on Saturday hotdog sales at grocery stores."

Dauphin, Neepawa and

Portage la Prairie also have clubs celebrating 75 years this year, making them the four oldest groups of Lions clubs in western Manitoba.
