Tours



There are two guided tours scheduled for Friday morning. One will be with the **Hershey Trolley Works** at a cost of \$18. The trolley bus will pick you up at the convention hotel and take you to Hershey, PA for a 75-minute Hershey history tour. Highly knowledgeable and entertaining conductors will take you through the Hershey of today, then jump back all the way to a time before there was a town, or a chocolate factory, or even chocolate in America for that matter. You will then journey through the inspiring life of Milton Hershey, visiting the historical sites of town he created, and tasting the chocolate that made him famous. The tour will end with an exclusive, spectacular view of the Sweetest Place on Earth from the "Welcome to Hershey" Hill. **Make sure to sign up on the registration form or online.**

The second guided tour on Friday morning will be to **Vision Resources of Central PA (VROCP)**. **Vision Resources** is a 100-year-old community benefit organization with a mission to facilitate independence, enrich the quality of life, and empower individuals who are visually impaired or otherwise disabled through prevention, employment, and educational awareness programs. The agency serves Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, and Perry counties. **There is no cost for this guided tour.** A bus will pick you up at the convention hotel for a short drive over to VROCP for a tour of the agency. VROCP is unique for a non-profit agency. To support their services, between 80% and 85% of their income is generated by their VR Business Services division through carpet installation, housekeeping, pen production, printing, and PA Driver's License services. You will leave saying, "I never knew they offered that." **Although there is no cost, pre-registration is required.**

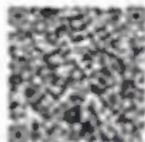

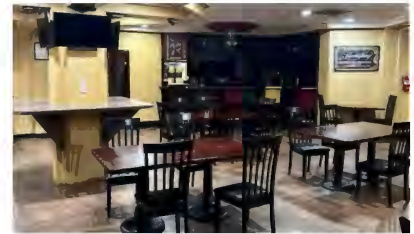

Messages from Beacon Lodge

"Dear Lions,

The recognition of the need for a camp for blind people of Pennsylvania was extensively discussed at a meeting of a group of blind people in Philadelphia on November 9, 1947. After several meetings, a corporation was formed in Millersburg and approved by the Millersburg County Court in 1948 to establish "Vacations for the Blind" camp. In 1953, the name was changed to "Beacon Lodge Camp for the Blind" and in 1994 the name was changed to "PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp" to reflect the support of the camp that comes from the Pennsylvania Lions and to indicate that the camp serves more than just the visually impaired.



PA Beacon Lodge Camp is situated on 563 beautiful acres in the natural woodlands along the Susquehanna River in Central Pennsylvania, near Mount Union. It is where children and adults with visual, hearing, mental, and physical disabilities gather from all over Pennsylvania and surrounding states for a relaxing and fun vacation.

The camp is divided into the Adult Camp and the Children's Camp. Project New Hope, the camp for Veterans and their families was established in 2014. Each camp is run separately. Campers can participate in fishing, bowling, swimming, wall climbing, zip lining, archery, miniature golf and much more. The camp emphasizes what the camper can do and not what they cannot do. The camp, being a non-profit, depends on funding from the Lions of Pennsylvania and other sources for donations.

The Project New Hope program offered at the Beacon Lodge camp is an opportunity for disabled Veterans regardless of branch of service or era in which a Veteran has served. All PA disabled Veterans and their immediate families are welcome.

As a Lion in Pennsylvania, I know firsthand the impact this camp has had on children, adults, and Veterans each year, and I humbly ask for your organization's support in any of the following ways:

- Help us recruit disabled Veterans and their immediate family to attend one of our 5-day summer retreat camps at 40 cost (June 15-19 and August 3-7, 2024)
- Help Project New Hope with Veteran campers' fees (approximately \$1200 for family of 4)
- Help the camp with their wish list of items (attached)
- Help the camp with financial assistance for some much-needed repairs

With the ongoing fundraising efforts of Lions across Pennsylvania, PA Beacon Lodge Camp needs your help to keep going. I ask for your organization's support to assist the PA Beacon Lodge Camp in providing specialized recreation for our disabled Veterans. It is an honor to offer Project New Hope to the elite group of PA disabled men and women who have served our country! (Visit www.beaconlodge.org for more information.)

The Coventry Lions Club Challenges District 14-P Clubs to Help Fund the KidSight Program

The Coventry Lions Club first staged the Chester County Blues Barbeque in 2010. Members of our club provided the venue, and one of our members was well-connected with the Blues scene in our area. The event proved so successful that we made it an annual event. In 2011, we used the bulk of the proceeds to purchase equipment to help kickstart the [District 14-P KidSight](#) program. The KidSight program uses Lions volunteers to screen preschool-age children for vision problems that, when detected early, can often be successfully treated. Over 33,000 children have been screened in District 14-P over the last 12 years, and about 2600 have been referred to eye care professionals.

Fast forward to 2023 - the Chester County Blues Barbeque continues to be a successful fundraiser, and the District 14-P KidSight testing equipment is aging and needs to be replaced. Therefore, the Coventry Lions Club is allocating \$10,000 towards **matching the donations of all other District club's dollar for dollar**. We look forward to the other district clubs rising to the occasion and costing our club the full amount!

Please forward your list of Delegates and Alternates for the upcoming District 14-P convention to be held on Saturday, April 13, 2024. The convention location will be at Holiday Inn Morgantown, 6170 Morgantown Rd, Morgantown, PA 19543

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. ***Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to qualify.***

Example: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates along with their membership number needs to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 31, 2024, so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. **Credential will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Thank you for assistance and cooperation.**

Elder Abuse: "Silent No Longer"

What is Elder Abuse?

Elder Abuse is a term used to describe any knowing, intentional, or negligent act by a caregiver or any other person that causes harm or a serious risk of harm to a vulnerable adult. Elder abuse can come in various forms:

Physical/Sexual Abuse

Hitting, pushing, kicking, punching, pinching, biting, unnecessarily restraint, intentionally causing pain, intentional misuse of medication, sexual abuse/exploitation, etc.

Verbal Abuse

Calling names, put-downs, making fun, embarrassing/humiliating, criticism, etc.

Emotional Abuse

Threats of harm or abandonment, manipulation, mind games, gaslighting—making you feel crazy, isolation, non-communication, intimidation, control, etc.

Financial Abuse

Pressure to make or making undue changes to legal, financial documents, theft of or withholding of funds, identity theft, etc.

Neglect & Self-Neglect

Deprivation of basic needs: food, water, housing, clothing, hygiene, medical care, emotional/social engagement, etc.

Self-Neglect involves an older adult, living independently, who is unable/unwilling to care for themselves leading to an environment threatening to health and safety.

Risk Factors for Elder Abuse

There are some factors that can put an older adult at increased risk for experiencing abuse including:

- An adult child who is still dependent on their older parent for financial assistance or housing—especially in cases where the adult child suffers from mental illness or a substance abuse disorder (addiction).
- A history of domestic violence in the home or family—as families grow and age, present problems of domestic violence often continue.
- Living with others in isolation—prevents likelihood of reporting of abuse.

PA Statistics on Elder Abuse

In national statistics, 1 in 10 adults 60+ have experienced some form of abuse. In Pennsylvania, since 2016, we have seen a **32% increase** in number of reports of elder abuse—with a **38% increase** in substantiated, or proven, claims of abuse.

- The age group most reported to be in need of protective services in PA were those between the ages of **81—90** and **almost half** of them lived in their own homes.
- **46.8%** of perpetrators of abuse were between the ages of 30—59 and **16.7%** were identified as family members.
- The most common substantiated forms of abuse were: **self-neglect, caregiver neglect, financial exploitation, physical, and emotional abuse.**

Reporting Abuse

In the state of Pennsylvania, if you work with and suspect abuse of an individual over the age of 60—you are mandated to report it to the appropriate authorities.

- If you believe an adult is being abused and their life is in imminent danger, call 911 immediately! Then report directly to protective services.

To make a report you may need to know:

- Age of the victim
- Address of the victim
- Victim's level of physical/mental capacity
- Date of the incident
- Whether or not there are weapons present in the home, if there is a history of drug/alcohol abuse or domestic violence in the home.
- How the alleged perpetrator might react to a worker coming to the home
- What the best times to visit may be

**Failure to report suspected
abuse is a crime.**
