### KLEF PATRON'S FUND PROVIDES CATARACT SURGERY

Sharon Gladson will tell you the most important thing in her life is caring for her five grandchildren. But when cataracts impaired her vision, she sought the Laurel Community Lions out to help her. Sharon is one of those people who was caught in between. She had no insurance, couldn't afford it, and did not qualify for disability. She has worked all of her life, and was about to get laid off along with a large group from a data processing company in London. She was getting desparate because she knew she could not afford to pay for the surgery she needed.

Fortunately for Sharon, Kentucky Lions Eve Foundation Patron Fund considered her application because she had the support of lLondon Eye Surgeon, Dr. James Huffman, who was willing to provide the surgery for free, and Dr. Amy Henson, of Huffman and Huffman Eye Surgeons, who did a very thorough eye exam detailing the extent of her

Mortimer and Past District Governor Mike Pawula, and the Laurel Community Lions, also worked with the KLEF Patron's Fund.

During Sharon's lay off from her job, her vision was so bad she found driving and reading very difficult so it would have been hard for her to do her job. Her surgery expenses were approved by the Patrons Fund and Sharon received her first surgery and then the second. Both eyes healed successfully and she got called to a new job just as she was ready to go back to work. Sharon will be the first to tell you how grateful she is to Dr. Huffman, Dr. Henson, KLEF Patron's Fund and the Lions. "I felt like the Lord was in this the whole time."

### Patrons Fund Assistance

#### Fellow Lions, Lionesses, and Leos

Thirty five to forty of our neighbors need our help in giving them back the miracle of sight unimpeded by injury or disease.

In the Mid 80's the Past District Governors Association accepted the challenge of providing funding to help are neighbors who were in need of medical attention relating to eye disease or injury which impacted their vision and could not be taken care of by assistance from local Clubs. Thus the Patrons Fund was born. The ultimate goal is to raise \$1,000,000 thru donations making both Lions and Non-Lions Life Patrons for donations of \$100, Silver Patrons for donations of \$500 and Gold Patrons for donations of \$1,000. These donations would be added to the principal of the Fund with the stipulation that only interest drawn off the principal would be used treating eye related injury or disease for those who could not afford such treatment.

*Now the problem.* As you are aware the economy has taken downturn over the last two years. As interest rates plummeted, so did the amount of money on hand. Simply put it has become a matter of supply and demand. Unfortunately, the supply, funding, does not meet the demand, neighbors needing help.

*Now the solution.* In October 2012, the Past District Governors Association took the stand that as the Patrons Fund was created by the Past District Governors it was our responsibility to find a way to take care of the people in need of assistance. Thus the concept of a raffle was born. Its' purpose was simple to raise funds separate from the contributions to the principal of the Patrons Fund for the express purpose of treating those people needing and waiting for medical assistance. The project is simple enough 1,000 raffle tickets will be sold at \$100 per ticket.

If all tickets are sold \$100,000 will be raised. Now in addition to helping our neighbors in need, cash prizes will be awarded with a first prize of 20% of the tickets (up to \$20,000), a second prize of 4% of the tickets sold (up to \$4,000), five prizes of 3% of the tickets (\$600 each) and ten prizes of up to 1% of the tickets sold (up to \$100 each). The remainder of the funds will go to help our neighbors. The drawing will be held at KLEF at 6 PM on October 21, 2013. You do not need to be present to win.

*How can you help?* To make vision free from illness or injury for our neighbors, buy a ticket, it that simple. This raffle is open to all Lions and Non-Lions alike who want to help those in need. There are several options, a Club may purchase a raffle ticket or tickets. Individual Lions, PDG's, Districts, friends, businesses, anyone can purchase a raffle ticket. In order to help with the sale of the tickets one person in each district has tickets available for sale. In District 43K your contact is PDG Noel Hardwick. In District 43E your contact is PDG Gerald Wedding. In District 43N your contact is PCC Chuck Danison. In District 43T your contact is PCC Kew Taybi. In District 43C your contact is PDG Bob Swett. At the time of this email, I am not sure of a district contact for District 43. If District 43Y has a contact the sale of the raffle tickets, please let me know so I can get the word out, otherwise please contact PCC Kew Taybi if you wish to purchase raffle tickets.

Again, our neighbors are counting on us. As lions we have a time honored tradition to step forward when need arises. Now is that time. Thank you in advance for your support for our neighbors in need.

## Diabetes Awareness

Take it! Share it!

On March, 26, 2013, the American Diabetes Association will be encouraging the public to take the Diabetes Risk Test, as well as to share the test with **everyone** they care about - friends, family members and colleagues. With each person that takes the test and knows their risk, the Association is that much closer to stopping diabetes.

American Diabetes Association Alert Day®, which is held every fourth Tuesday in March, is a one-day, "wake-up call" asking the American public to take the Diabetes Risk Test to find out if they are at risk for developing type 2 diabetes.

The new Diabetes Risk Test asks users to answer simple questions about weight, age, family history and other potential risks for prediabetes or type 2 diabetes. Preventative tips are provided for everyone who takes the test, including encouraging those at high risk to talk with their health care provider.

#### **Diabetes by the Numbers**

Diabetes is a serious disease that strikes nearly 26 million children and adults in the United States, and a quarter of them— 7 million—do not even know they have it. An additional 79 million, or one in three American adults, have prediabetes, which puts them at high risk for developing type 2 diabetes. Recent estimates project that as many as one in three American adults will have diabetes in 2050 unless we take the steps to Stop Diabetes®

#### Are You at Risk?

Everyone should be aware of the risk factors for type 2 diabetes. People who are overweight, under active (living a sedentary lifestyle) and over the age of 45 should consider themselves at risk for the disease. African Americans, Hispanics/ Latinos, Native Americans, Asian Americans, Pacific Islanders and people who have a family history of the disease also are at an increased risk for type 2 diabetes.

Unfortunately, diagnosis often comes 7 to 10 years after the onset of the disease, after disabling and even deadly complications have had time to develop. Therefore, early diagnosis is critical to successful treatment and delaying or preventing some of its complications such as heart disease, blindness, kidney disease, stroke, amputation and death. The American Diabetes Association has made a strong commitment to primary prevention of type 2 diabetes by increasing awareness of prediabetes and actively engaging individuals in preventative behaviors like weight loss, physical activity and healthful eating. Alert Day is a singular moment in time in which we can raise awareness and prompt action among the general public – particularly those at risk.

#### **Take Charge of Your Health**

Studies have shown that type 2 diabetes can often be prevented or delayed by losing just 7% of body weight (such as 15 pounds if you weigh 200) through regular physical activity (30 minutes a day, five days a week) and healthy By understanding your risk, eating. you can take the necessary steps to help prevent the onset of type 2 diabetes. You can be part of the movement to Stop Diabetes® and get your free Diabetes Risk Test (English or Spanish) by visiting the Association on Facebook, stopdiabetes. com or by calling 1-800-DIABETES (1-800-342-2383). Although Alert Day is a one-day event, the Diabetes Risk Test is available year-round.
