District Governor's Corner DG Dave Roberts

Hello Leos, Leo-Lions and Lions of Connecticut!

As District Governor for District 23B, membership is always at the top of my mind. Recently, Lions International informed me that I was one of the top recruiters of new members in Constitutional Areas 1 and 2. GAT Chair Jerome Thompson asked me to share my views on recruitment and retention for an upcoming video they are making to showcase IP Brian Sheehan's theme of "out of the box" thinking. PID Jerome asked me to showcase the many success stories that Lions International is hearing from our District.

So let me share a few of our membership highlights. Overall, we have positive membership growth with +27 members this Lions Year. One of my personal joys is inducting new members into Lions for them to begin their own Lions journey of service, fun, and fellowship. So, if you have new members you would like me to induct, just call and arrange it with me.

After Lions International allowed us to relaunch our 54th Lions Club late last year; recently LCI approved the preferred new name for this club which is now to be known as the *Connecticut United Hearts and Hands Cyber Lions Club*. This new cyber club was the direct result of *Lions Day with the United Nations 2021* and this specialty club focuses on United Nations' sustainable development goals. Club President Amit Kapadia journeyed with me to *Lions Day with the United Nations 2023* which will be held at the United Nations on March 2 and 3. Speaking of LDUN, while there, we learned of the tremendous interest in our newest Lions Club Branch; the *Connecticut 988 Lions Club Branch*, sponsored by the Northwestern Connecticut Cyber Lions Club. This branch is focused on mental health awareness and education; thus the "988" in the club's name. 988 is the newly established three-digit call number to immediately access mental health services. Lion Kim Becker is chairing this initiative which grew out of the horrific police ambush in Bristol last year. While at LDUN, we learned that LCI is considering adding "mental health wellness" as our sixth global cause, possibly in 2024, and we know that our Branch will be part of this new outreach initiative.

So, positive membership growth, relaunched 54th Lions Club, our new Club Branch focused on mental health, and my final membership update in the works is launching at least one new Lions Club here in this District this Lions Year. On Friday, March 10th, we hosted an Informational Meeting for the proposed Riverton Lions Club, a new specialty club focused on preserving the historical character of the village of Riverton and working closely on events with the Riverton Merchants Association. This initiative is being sponsored by Barkhamsted Lions Club with the support of Judy Doyle, Sue Boilard and Dave Boilard. IF this club launches, it would be the 56th club in our District! In addition, we hosted a virtual informational meeting on March 9 on a possible Hartford Somali-American Lions Club. So, thanks to outstanding support from the Cabinet, and especially GMT Alan Hill, we continue our strong focus on membership recruitment and retention.

With strong Cabinet support, we appear to be on track to meet all our LCI established goals. Service is the hallmark of Lionism, and service is being reported every day; and thanks to GST Phyllis Perry, we had an extremely successful children's pajama drive at Mid-Winter Conference. I am also proud of Lion Judy Doyle and the leadership she is demonstrating leading our state-wide Marketing and Communications Committee and the MD-23 Marketing Grant which she helped steer for our State to promote Lionism in communities throughout Connecticut. I couldn't provide a District Status Report to you without commenting on the very successful Mid-Winter Conference we held last month in Southbury. The training was outstanding (thank you PCC Kathy Randall and your team), the hospitality was exceptional (thank you 2nd VDG Raj Shrestha), and the opportunity to have fellowship with fellow Lions and Leos were impactful. Our very own Leo Sophia Marangoudakis was named MD-23 Leo of the Year, our District 23-B Peace Poster Contest Winner sponsored by Windsor Locks Lions Club was honored as the MD-23 Winner, and we nominated Lion Pete Cianciolo of Enfield Lions as our next candidate for 2nd Vice District Governor. Thank you to all the Lions and Leos who volunteered to make this conference so successful. And to cap the weekend off, Lion Judy Doyle was honored with an International President's Certificate of Appreciation; Zone Chair John Spatcher was honored with the International President's Leadership Medal for his work; and 2nd Vice District Governor Raj Shrestha was honored with the International President's Medal. Congratulations all! Before I conclude my column, I want to ask you to keep Zone Chair Frank Longo, PDG Steve Daigle, and Lion Jackie Martin in your thoughts during their recoveries from health challenges. We need each and every Lion and we want all our Lions to be health and active again.

So, to conclude, I want to emphasize that Lions is not about any one person. As IP Brian Sheehan says: Together We Can; Together We Will! We all joined Lions to work with like-minded individuals because we know that by working together, we can accomplish so much more than we can by working alone. So, there are FOUR more months left in this Lions Year before we transition to 1st Vice District Governor Peter Nevers. Let us all "Seize the day"! 


