LIONS OF MICHIGAN WHITE CANE SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, the state Sight Conservation/White Cane Committee awards three \$3000 scholarships to students who are seeking a higher education degree and are blind or visually impaired. This year, with the approval of the Council of Governors, the committee has been authorized to award a fourth scholarship of \$3000. The scholarships are funded through the Grace Lang Memorial fund, set up in the 1970's to assist blind and visually impaired students achieve their academic goals. The basic requirements for the scholarship are to be a Michigan resident, acceptance to a higher education institution (university, community college, etc.), and have a diagnosed visual impairment. Other requirements are detailed on the application form.

The Sight Conservation/White Cane committee met during January to evaluate White Cane Scholarship applications from 11 applicants. This is more than we have seen in the past and made the award decisions that much harder. Apparently, we have been able to reach more teachers of the blind and visually impaired this year, who have helped pass the information along to their students. We also awarded a \$500 stipend to a 5th student, with funds taken out of the state Sight Conservation Fund. There are several criteria to meet to qualify for the scholarships, which all the recipients met, as well as articulating their plans for how they would use the money.

The winners of the \$3000 scholarships were:

Nasko Cleland - Battle Creek, MI Alyssa Groenveld -Byron Center, MI Kyle Kelly – Wells, MI Julia LeGrand - Grand Rapids, MI The winner of the \$500 stipend was Brenna Hayward - Waterford, MI

The winners were introduced at the Michigan Forum and two of the recipients, Nasko Cleland and Alyssa Groenveld were in attendance at the luncheon to receive their scholarships and say a few words about their educational and/or life goals. The other recipients will be awarded their scholarships at Lions Club meetings or events in their local area.



LIONS OF MICHIGAN FOUNDATION

Did you know...?

District 11-B1 has two trustees on the Lions of Michigan Board: PDG Dave Hill & PDG Terry Walters
The Lions of Michigan Foundation has awarded 3 Emergency Assistance Grants to Clubs in our District so far this year. These grants include helping with bills for a man awaiting a transplant (\$2500) and buying an Orcam for a lady with retinal issues to help her read (\$1700).

- The Foundation has assisted with VSP vouchers and money to help individuals obtain glasses, going on a dozen so far this year in 11-B1.

- The Foundation has provided over 200 Hearing aids to individuals in Michigan this year.

- KidSight is run by the Foundation. This has been a very successful project by the Lions clubs, providing early vision screenings and issue detection for youngsters. This can enhance a Lions club's image within a community. If you need a camera, a KidSight trailer, a tent, or training please contact your District Chairperson (11-B1 chair is Teresa Gest). Get involved!

In order to provide this support, fundraising efforts are on-going. You can help!

- The Lions of Michigan Foundation sent out 20,000 tickets for the Sight and Hearing Sweepstakes, 30 tickets to each club in Michigan. Everyone's assistance is needed to sell these (for \$10 each). Many clubs use this as a fundraiser since your club gets a rebate once you sell 30 or more tickets. Clubs have made as much as \$4000 in selling the tickets. Many clubs buy the set of 30 tickets that were sent to them and consider that their donation to the Foundation. The drawing is held in May. <u>Ticket stubs should be mailed back by April 20th.</u>
- 2. Cook Books- The Lions of Michigan Foundation has put together a great cook book which they have as a fundraiser. The cookbook sells for \$15. Contact Terry or Dave if you would like to order 5-10 cookbooks for your club. They make great gifts for members or speakers at your meetings.
- 3. Get involved in the Lions Mint Program. Set up dispensers in your community. The Foundation now has the Wintergreen mints!
- 4. Mints for the Military The Foundation provides a case of Mints for individuals in your community who are serving in the military.

WINTER CAMP

The 52nd District 11-B1 Lions Winter Camp for the Blind was held Feb. 3-5, 2023 at the Battle Creek Public Schools Outdoor Education Center (Clear Lake Camp). 35 campers from across the state, Indiana, and Iowa attended this year's camp, the first since our 2 year (virtual) break due to Covid. The campers were glad to be back together and over 50 volunteers helped them to have a safe, fun weekend. The Michigan Youth Job Challenge Associates provided assistance with our camp operation and this partnership is valued. It is a winwin situation as we get great help and the young adults have meaningful experience of service to blind and visually impaired campers. They are ready to volunteer next year as "civilians". Many indoor and outdoor activities including white cane repair, bingo, technology demonstrations, and crafts kept the campers busy, along with side-by-side offroad vehicle rides, horse and wagon, snowshoeing, and outdoor nature hikes.

A highlight on Saturday afternoon was the Charter Event for the newly formed Clear Lake Virtual Lions Club, made up of mostly blind and visually impaired individuals, who have been long term campers, or newly acquainted due to our virtual programs over the last two years. It was a great event, with Immediate Past International Director (IPID) Justin Faber installing officers and inducting the members officially into Lions Clubs, with assistance from 11-B1 DG Kelly Lubbe and IPDG Terri Huffman. The Jackson Host Lions are the sponsoring Club, and Lion Bea Furman is the Guiding Lion. Within the first year of formation, the club has gone from 26 to 30 members, with interest expressed by several others.

We look forward to our next Winter Camp for the Blind in February 2024. There will be an informational table at the 11-B1 District Convention.

THE FORMING OF CLEAR LAKE VIRTUAL LIONS BY GUIDING LION BEA FURMAN

In 2020, I challenged then Vice District Governor David Anderson to work as a volunteer for the Winter Camp for the Blind at Clear Lake Camp. He readily agreed. I remember hearing him ask campers if they wanted more coffee on Saturday morning, as naturally as if he had been working in a fancy diner at one time in his life. I remember hearing from Peggy Allen, who was the dorm monitor, how she roused him from falling asleep during the Friday night entertainment to help with snacks. (I'm not sure I would have done that, as I knew he had come directly from work.)

Some time later, when David and I were discussing Jackson Host club business, he told me how much he was struck by the sense of community he had seen among the blind adults who attended Winter Camp. He mused on how it would be great to start a virtual club of campers as a base. I'm not sure who approached Roger Bosse, the camp administrator. I know it was after the virtual Winter Camp event in 2021. (Held via Zoom due to Covid)

For the next few months, then District Governor David Anderson, Roger Bosse, and I became the nucleus of putting together the Clear Lake Camp club. We received help from other Lions who were campers, Tyrone Hamilton and Rosemarie Facilla, and district Lions, Dave and Mary Ann Robinson, Kelly Lubbe, and Terri Huffman. We began talking to the campers about the club idea, and many came on board.

The club was formed in 2022 and has been meeting since July. But the club members wanted to have their charter event take place at the Winter Camp in 2023.

As Winter Camp 2023 drew near, all of us were hoping and praying that the event would take place. We were concerned that Winter Camp might go into a third year of hiatus, due to concerns about Covid for one, and we needed someone to come on board who would be able to plan the charter event. That someone was Jesse Bolinger who, although not a camper, was able to grasp the vision that those of us who had put the club together had and worked diligently with his committee to plan.

I think the thing that struck me at the event was, although there were some rough spots, our club was well represented. Dick Colony, our Jackson Host Club President, Bob Mc Creery, our Treasurer, David Anderson, and I sat at a table together and could not have been more proud of sponsoring Clear Lake Virtual Lions. This club has a lot of growing to do. Yet, we vowed that we would continue to serve them as they strive to be a club of value to our district.

I cannot say enough about David Anderson, and I know he probably doesn't want me to say this. However, this project was one of the highlights of my two-year club presidency, and one of the projects that caused me to want to tear my hair out. He would not let me do that. His gentle but blunt way of pulling me in when times got tough helped me to stand in good standing and to become the Clear Lake club's Guiding Lion. Thank you, David, for having this dream and letting me share in it with you.

President Dick Colony has also been a rock as I took on Secretary of our Jackson Host club while working as Clear Lake's Guiding Lion. Many has been the time he has reminded me to take my time and take it slow.

Those who came from the district clubs to attend the charter event at Winter Camp 2023 made me proud to be a Lion. I especially appreciated Lion Jim Baum from the Cereal City club for leading us in the good old Lions songs. The fact that my charter event speech was a song had nothing to do with the example he set. But, having him lead us all in song calmed me down enough to enjoy the event.





CANDIDACY REQUIREMENTS FOR ELECTED OFFICES

CANDIDACY REQUIREMENTS FOR LIONS OF MICHIGAN TRUSTEE SHALL:

(1) Be an active member of a Lions Club in good standing in his/her District.

(2) Have served as President or Secretary of a full term or major portion thereof or as a member of the Board of Directors of a Lions Club for no less than three (3) years.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH INTERNATIONAL CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS, FOLLOWING ARE THE CANDIDACY REQUIREMENTS FOR DISTRICT ELECTED OFFICERS:

A candidate for the office of district governor shall:

(a) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or subdistrict.

(b) Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.

(c) Currently be serving as the first vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

(d) Only in the event the current first vice district governor does not stand for election as district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of first vice district governor exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of second vice district governor as set forth in these bylaws or constitution and who is currently serving or who has served one (1) additional year as a member of the district cabinet, shall fulfill the requirements of subsection (c) of this section.

A candidate for the office of first vice district governor shall:

(1) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or subdistrict.

(2) Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/ her single or sub-district.

(3) Currently be serving as the second vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

(4) Only in the event the current second vice district governor does not stand for election as first vice district governor, or if a vacancy in the position of second vice district governor exists at the time of the district convention, any club member who fulfills the qualifications for the office of second vice district governor as set forth in these by-laws or constitution shall fulfill the requirements of subsection (3) of this section.

A candidate for the office of second vice district governor shall:

(1) Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or subdistrict.

(2) Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/ her single or sub-district.

(3) Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:

(a) As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and

(b) As zone chairperson or region chairperson or cabinet secretary and/or treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.

(c) With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

My name is Lillian (Lilly) Diuble and I am the Walk Chair for the Michigan VisionWalk, the annual fundraiser for the Foundation Fighting Blindness (FFB). FFB was established in 1971 and has a continued goal to be the driving force behind research for those affected by retinal degenerative diseases.

Since then, we have raised over **\$890 million**, and are proud to say that we are the world's leading private funder of retinal disease research. While this is incredible, there is still work that needs to be done.

I am hard of hearing and have a vision impairment meaning that I wear hearing aids and glasses. After years of not having an official diagnosis, my family and I found out that I was diagnosed with an extremely rare gene mutation called PRPS1. PRPS1 is a rare gene mutation that causes varying degrees of blindness and hearing loss in women and a death sentence in men. There are only a few women in the world that have this disorder. Currently, there is little to no knowledge or research being done on PRPS1. This is why we need your help!

FFB serves as a beacon of hope for those with vision loss and their families. One of the biggest ways that FFB raises funds for research is through its signature fundraiser, VisionWalk.






MICHIGAN CENTER LIONESS LIONS


