

HOW "WE SERVE" AS VOLUNTEERS Governor Marcia Meyers District 1-D

This week I had the opportunity to speak with a local publication about Lionism and the value of volunteering. I began by defining a volunteer as someone who "gives their

time and service to help others—or support meaningful causes—without pay." That simple description reflects the very heart of our organization. Lions clubs, churches, schools, community organizations—none of them could thrive without individuals who are willing to step forward, give of themselves, and make a difference. I sensed that my interviewer was genuinely impressed by the pride I expressed not only for my own Lions Club, but also for the community we serve.

District 1-D is made up largely of small towns, many home to just 200 to 800 residents. Several of our clubs have ten members or fewer. Yet every visit I make leaves me inspired. In each club, I see deep pride—not only in their club identity but in their communities. The projects they undertake are impressive, and their fundraising efforts continually fuel meaningful service. Their commitment makes me even prouder to serve as their Governor.

During many club visits, I ask members a simple but powerful question: "What would happen in your community if your Lions Club closed?" The responses are always eye-opening. Members quickly identify unmet needs, lost programs, and people who would go without support. When we view our service through that lens, the importance of our ongoing work becomes undeniable—our communities truly depend on us.

Service projects and fundraising opportunities look different from one community to another. Larger towns may have more resources and a wider range of needs to address, while smaller towns may need to think more creatively to identify new ways to serve. But rather than being a challenge, this becomes an opportunity. Being a Lion means staying aware, staying flexible, and always being ready to respond with compassion and ingenuity.

Whether large or small, every club makes a meaningful impact. Let us continue to look for new needs, new ideas, and new ways to serve—because when Lions serve, communities grow stronger.
