

It all starts with a puppy!

The Lions Project for Canine Companions Foundation was established as a 501© (3) non-profit foundation in 1983, dedicated to raising awareness and providing vital support for Canine Companions. This remarkable organization provides service dogs free of charge to assist individuals with disabilities, ensuring high-quality partnerships that enhance their clients' independence and confidence.

Lions Project is comprised of an all-volunteer Board of Directors, Area Directors and Trustees who devote their time to sharing the mission of Canine Companions with Lions across the United States. The foundation

has grown with Lions Clubs from California to Maine, and has resulted in over \$5.1 million in contributions to support this life-changing mission. Currently Lions Clubs and individual Lions in 34 states support the program. The goal is to have Lions Clubs in every state participate in this worthwhile program.

I took this project on as my Governor's Project for the year. I would like to raise some money for Canine Companion but more important to raise awareness for those with disabilities and Veterans with physical disabilities, hearing loss or post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

I first was introduced to this organization when I picked up a brochure at a USA/ Canada Forum years ago. I have a friend with disabilities that I thought would benefit! I'm proud to say that after applying, Vicki now has Gabel! This addition to the family has made a world of difference to her!


