Attending local summer and fall festivals – connecting with communities.


Navigating conflict resolution – always a challenge, but essential.



We are proud to celebrate the establishment of a new branch club serving the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community, marking the first new club in District 1F in more than 15 years and a true milestone in our district's history. District 1F has been awarded a Membership Development Grant from Lions Clubs International Foundation. These grants are designed to help districts strengthen their base, recruit new members, and charter new clubs. For us, this funding will directly support the rollout of service carnivals, which are dynamic community events that showcase the full range of Lions service while also providing an opportunity to connect with potential new members.

Service carnivals bring together vision screenings, diabetes awareness, childhood cancer education, hunger initiatives, and environmental projects in one visible and interactive event. With support from the Membership Development Grant, clubs will receive resources to plan, promote, and execute these events so that community members not only see Lions in action but also feel invited to join.

We are equally excited to share that District 1F has been approved for a Lions Quest Program Grant. Lions Quest is one of the world's most widely used social and emotional learning programs, providing young people with tools to make healthy decisions, resist negative peer pressure, and strengthen academic performance.

In our district, the Lions Quest Grant will allow us to link youth education directly to the service carnival model. By partnering with schools and educators, we can incorporate Lions Quest activities into carnival events, bringing workshops, demonstrations, and materials directly to families. Teachers trained through the program will also be able to extend this work into classrooms, creating a lasting connection between our clubs and the youth we serve.

The Membership Development Grant ensures that service carnivals will not only showcase the impact of Lions projects but also serve as powerful membership drivers. New members will join after seeing firsthand the energy and purpose of our clubs. The Lions Quest Grant ties our youth outreach into these same carnivals, making them true community hubs. Families will come for fun, resources, and education, and leave with stronger connections to Lions and to one another.

This year has just begun, but District 1F is already building momentum and laying the groundwork for long term growth and service excellence. With our clubs' dedication, and the promise of these grants, we are ready to deliver more service, more connection, and more impact for the people we serve. 
