District 14B - Policy No. 107

Policy on District Trading Pins

PURPOSE: To establish guidelines to be adhered to in the procurement and final disposition of District Trading Pins by each District Governor.

GENERAL: The District Governor has the sole responsibility for the design and theme for the District Trading Pin to be struck during his or her term of office. It is the District Governor's option as to whether or not he or she wants a Trading Pin.

As an aid to the District Governor, he or she will review the District records from the three (3) years immediately preceding his or her year to determine a reasonable quantity to order, price paid for each pin, and the selling price for each pin. The quantity to be ordered shall not exceed 200 unless orders and funds for more than that amount are already in hand.

The District Governor will have at his or her disposal a quantity not to exceed 40 pins to be used at his or her discretion (for his or her fellow governors, International family members, etc.)

If at the end of the District Governor's term of office, there is a quantity of pins left unsold, the District Governor will take possession of them as long as receipts from the sale of the pins have equaled or exceeded the costs, or the District Governor may pay the amount needed to cover the costs and take possession of the balance on hand.. If he does not wish to pay the difference, the pins will be turned over to the new District Governor to become a part of the District's inventory.
