We are deciding on our induction range and have narrowed it down to: Bosch Industrial 800 series induction HIS8055C OR Smeg SPR30UIMX OR Bertazzoni PROF304INSXT Looking for feedback on any of these. Thank you! I have heard from some contractors/handyman that the faucets, toilets, tools you buy at lowes/HD have inferior parts to make them cheaper than the identical model at a plumbing supply center or hardware store. does anyone know if this is true for appliances as well? if I buy a bosch 800 dw is it the same everywhere or cheaped out for lowes Hi all. Why are BSH products so much cheaper in Germany? Keep in mind, their prices included 19% tax already. US websites don't display sales tax we have to add it extra. The same coffee machine CVA7840 costs 3.2k without tax but in the USA it's over 5k without tax. If we compare cars MB, BMW, VW/Porsche are way cheaper in the US.... Hello - Doing a major home reno in Canada. Looking for a >\$3,500 30" gas range (potentially dual-fuel but may need panel upgrade). I use the burners about 2xs/day in a variety of ways and the oven about 4 x/week. I've purchased a Bosch fridge and dishwasher. Love their look but not pleased with the look of Bosch's range. Noticed Zline makes a handsome and affordable model but haven't seen one "live". Which would you choose in gas - the Bosch or Zline and why? Open to other suggestions. Thanks! Bosch - HG18056UC (can get deal on a retired 54UC): Zline: I tried searching but I'm still unclear on which Bosch dishwashers are still in fact German made. Trying to match up where it stands in price to an entry level Miele and maybe Asko. Bosch. Bosch dishwashers are made in North Carolina, even though they're based in Germany. Bosch is part of the BSH group (Bosch and Siemens Home Appliance Group), the 3rd largest home appliance company in the world. Keeping this in view, who makes Bosch appliances? BSH Corporation Subsequently, question is, is Bosch a good brand? Bosch is considered one of the best affordable luxury brands. They are part of the BSH Corporation along with Thermador and Gaggenau. You can also match the style of Bosch and it's affiliated luxury brands, like Thermador and Gaggenau, for an upscale package for a fraction of the price. Bosch has attractive styling. Beside this, are Bosch and Neff the same company? The company is owned by BSH Home Appliances Ltd, based in Germany. Its 4 UK kitchen appliance brands are Bosch, Siemens, Neff and Gaggenau. What is the best brand of appliances? Best Appliance Brands #1 Whirlpool. #2 LG. #3 Samsung. #4 Frigidaire. #5 KitchenAid. #6 Bosch. #7 Miele. I was told yesterday that Miele makes Bosch (at least, their dish washers). This was a huge surprise to me. Is that accurate? If it is, has it been a recent merger? Thanks. Hi, Were shopping appliances for a kitchen refurbishment, and have been doing a lot of research. We were of the mind (at first at least) of going with a Bosch dishwasher, and then we saw their slide-in stove. They don't offer a counter-depth refrigerator with french doors and ice, so we started looking and Samsung seems to offer some great elements that none of the others we have been able to see (not many CD refrigerators out there to see). In our research we caught up with some folks who recently redid their kitchen, and got all new appliances, of which they got a matched set of all Samsung, and couldn't say enough good about them. But most review rankings IMO often bring out just the worst, and often can't be trusted for alignment to the specific product I'm looking at. So... Obviously Bosch has a great name in dishwashers. But what about other stuff? Like the actual Bosch-made (not the lower end ones apparently made by Electrolux) ranges? Are they reliable? Good? High quality? Similarly, I know Samsung gets high JD Power marks, but how do their refrigerators, dishwashers and ranges stand up in terms of reliability and quality? Granted, our 7 year old GE refrigerator has needed service twice, but our 60 year old GE electric range has needed nothing, ditto for our 20+ year old Kitchen Aid dishwasher. It seems like all new appliances are showing lack of reliability and issues with common things like melting knobs, bad circuit boards and broken ice machines. But at the end of the day, are the full range of appliances from Bosch or Samsung anything to write home for, or to avoid? Are we better off saying to forget matching stuff and buy brand x for a range, brand y for a dishwasher, and brand z for a refrigerator? Even CR and online reviews are confusing, so hoping the smart folks on here can help shed some updated insight. I've enjoyed reading all the discussion from older threads I've brought up by search. Thanks! I have read of new models that were brought out this year with more capacity than the original 800 plus models that are made in Germany, but when I went to their site I could not find them. Only the German 800 plus models that have been around for a year or more. I tried to check dealers but when I did a search for one that I thought existed (SHE68E15UC) I was told that it was an older model that was replaced by the top of the line German models. Does anyone here know which models are the new three rack models made in the USA? Hello to all, We sold all our appliances with our past house and are shopping for new ones. We are looking at a 36" counter depth fridge, a 30" induction range and a dishwasher with custom panel. For kitchen appliances, so far, we are tempted to go with all Bosch for the overall quality, not opened to go anymore expensive than this.
