"As they were eating, he took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them, and said, "Take, this is my body." And he took a cup, and gave thanks, and gave it to them, and they all drank of it. And he said unto them, "This is my blood, the blood, and the soul, and the divinity of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God. This belief distinguishes Catholics from other Christian communities and is fundamental to our identity and practice of faith, because we believe that it is Jesus Christ Himself. The first opportunity to receive Holy Communion must be memorable and solemnly celebrated, but unlike other Baptisms and Confirmation, Communion must be repeated throughout the course of one's life. The normal age for children who have received Baptism as infants is the age of reason á about 7 years old, usually in the 2nd grade. For children who receive catechism classes in the parish, this means enrolling them in classes during the first and second year for proper education. For children attending Catholic elementary school, they must enroll in the parish during their 2nd year of Grade. The sacraments are vital expressions of who we are as Catholic Christians. Every time we receive a sacrament we respond more deeply to Jesus' call to discipleship. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists the sacraments as follows: "The whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Eucharistic sacrifice and the sacraments. There are seven sacraments in the Church: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Marriage. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is intended to confer a special grace on the Christian who experiences the difficulties inherent in the condition of serious illness or old age. Baptism is the first sacrament celebrated in the process of becoming a full member of the ecclesial community. It is the first of the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. The forgiveness of sins committed after Baptism is conferred by a particular sacrament called the sacrament of conversion, confession, penance or reconciliation. Every winter there is a weekly program to prepare 10th grade teenagers for the sacrament of Confirmation. Any Catholic parishioner, aged 18 or over, who wishes to be confirmed, may participate in the formal sacramental preparation, which begins in the autumn. The Eucharist is described by the Church in Canon Law 897: "The Most Holy Eucharist is the most august sacrament, in which Christ the Lord himself is contained, offered and received, and through which the Church lives and grows constantly." Marriage is a very important sacrament in as such there are necessary requirements to have a marriage in the Church. What is graduation? "Holy Baptism is the foundation of all Christian life, the door of life in the Spirit, and the door that gives access to the other sacraments. As the great Anglican poet and divine John Donne wrote, "The Church is catholic, universal, so are all her actions; everything she does belongs to everyone. When he baptizes a child, that action concerns me; that is why the child is so connected to that head that is also my head, and engraved into the body of which I am a member.á The process is different for young children (0-6) and older children and adults. BAPTISM of YOUNG BAMBINIEN (0-6 years) We celebrate the baptisms of young children during the monthly celebrations on Saturdays or at one of our weekend Masses. Parents/Guardians and godparents are asked to attend a Baptism Preparation Class to update their understanding of baptism and the important responsibilities of Christian parenthood, and to learn more about the many ways our parish supports families. Parents/Guardians are required to be registered parishioners in St. Andrew or have a personal connection with a registered parishioner (e.g. grandparents are members of the parish). If a family belongs to another parish, a letter must be received by their parish granting permission for baptism stating that they are registered and have attended the baptism preparation class of that parish. The law of the Church requires that there be at least one god for the baptized child. The godparents must be active, practicing and confirmed Catholics, at least 16 years of age. Sponsors must present written proof of registration from their parish and attend a baptism preparation class. Only Catholics can be godparents because they are called to promise to help support the child in the Catholic faith. A non-Catholic Christian can witness baptism as long as there is a Catholic god. An unbaptized person cannot be a god or a witness. The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), is a process of initiation into the Catholic Community of Faith for people who are experiencing a conversion in their lives and are seeking Christian baptism in the Catholic Church or full communion with the Catholic tradition, the Eucharist and Confirmation. It is a process that allows the study of the Gospels, of Catholic Christian teaching, of acceptance of Christian values and andthe development and deepening of a life of prayer and action with the support and involvement of the local Christian community. The RCIA is more than an education course. This is a conversion process, designed to meet the unique and individual needs of participants. In the Eucharist, Christ nourishes the believer with essential food, which is a sign of faith and bread of life. The celebration of Mass forms our local Church, connects us with the apostolic faith and unites us with the universal Church. The whole parish life revolves around the Sunday celebration of the paschal mystery of the Lord in the Eucharist. The reverence with which we offer this sacrifice of praise is an external manifestation of the holiness of God that has become our flesh. The Eucharist is holy manna, food for the whole Christian journey. In our devoted participation in the Mass we are given a taste of the heavenly banquet and we are hungry for the invitation to join the Lord, angels and saints around his heavenly table. Because of these powerful fruits or effects of the Eucharist, the Church "recommends strongly" that Catholic faithful receive communion whenever they participate in the Mass, if they have the required provisions, that is, if they are not in a state of grave sin (CCC 1380). Whoever realizes that he has sin must celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation before receiving Holy Communion. All Catholics should celebrate the sacrament of reconciliation at least once a year. In addition: Catholics are required to attend Mass every Sunday and holy day, unless serious or justifying causes such as illness, travel or time do not impede it. Catholics who are not prevented from age or medical conditions must fast from food and drink, except for water (or medicine) for an hour before receiving Holy Communion. Because of the divisions in the Body of Christ, Christians of other denominations (except for some Orthodox Churches in communion with the Roman Catholic Church) cannot receive Holy Communion in the Catholic Church. Let us pray for the day when we can all be united around the only table of the Lord. At about 7 years, children can start preparing to receive the communion, body and blood of Christ, for the first time. Together with the new archdiocesan guidelines, preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion is a two-year process that includes preparation for First Reconciliation and culminates with the celebration of First Communion, usually in May. For adults, the reception of the Eucharist is the culmination of their Christian initiation through the RCIA Process. The sacrament of Confirmation is, together with Baptism and the Eucharist, one of the three sacraments of initiation; the complete confirmation and "confirm" the grace of Baptism.
