Proctoring in Online Courses: A Guide to Balancing Security with Student Comfort The MSU Denver Testing Center offers in-person proctoring services, which can be used as an alternative to ProctorU. However, it is not recommended as a default choice for online classes due to its intrusive nature. To enhance security, quizzes in Canvas can be set up with a password-protected login, allowing students to use an off-site proctoring service. To minimize anxiety and facilitate the experience, instructors should take simple steps such as reassuring students that they are not solely responsible for detecting cheating. Proctoring creates a tense environment, affecting students' performance even if they are honest. It also raises concerns about student privacy, as being recorded and having their homes inspected can be invasive. To balance security with comfort, consider creating open-note quizzes and tests instead of multiple-choice or true/false questions that can be easily looked up. Setting time limits for exams can help deter cheating, but it's essential to avoid imposing undue stress on students. Explain your academic dishonesty policy early in the course, reminding students of the consequences, which might deter some cheaters. The Guardian Browser is a mandatory tool for ProctorU exams, preventing students from accessing unapproved materials and recording session information to detect academic dishonesty. MSU Denver offers various services to support students' academic success, particularly in math placement tests. The MSU Denver Math department uses the Accuplacer Quantitative Reasoning, Algebra, and Statistics (QAS) and Advanced Algebra and Functions (AAF) tests to place students in college-level math courses. Students may use their SAT or ACT math subscores or Accuplacer Math Placement tests for registering in first-year math courses. However, if their scores are too low, they should take an Accuplacer Math placement test. Students who have completed math courses at other institutions can also be placed in math courses with credit. To determine which placement tests are necessary, students can consult with their academic advisor or meet with them via SSC Navigate or set an advising appointment. Testing on campus is the easiest and fastest way to access Accuplacer Math Placement exams, with no fee. Students can take drop-in testing from Monday through Friday from 9am to 3pm in Tivoli Room 347, bringing a photo ID and student ID number. Alternatively, they can test online using Meazure Learning's virtual proctoring service for \$28.00. Additional study resources are available at the Student Academic Success Tutoring Center. Accuplacer math Placement Tests for students from other schools: Non-MSU Denver students must pay a \$15.00 proctoring fee, testing is open Monday through Friday between 9am and 3pm. Virtual proctoring is not available for non-MSU Denver students. The MSU Testing Center is available for your testing needs Monday-Friday from 8:00am to 5:00pm. Other than MSU Denver, submit online exams with a completed Online Exam Cover Sheet. The Testing Center only accepts closed book, closed note, full-length exams. Include reference materials within the exam. Confirm Canvas settings before submitting the cover sheet. For each course, deliver one exam at a time; no overlapping dates allowed. Faculty teaching multiple sections should submit one cover sheet listing each CRN separated by commas. For paper-pencil exams, place one exam per student in a single envelope with the following information: instructor's name, space for student's name, course name, CRN prefix, test instructions, and test number or name. All proctored exams must adhere to guidelines. Testing time may not exceed class time block length, except during finals week when it's two hours. No exam can exceed two hours in length. Include specific instructions on the first page of each exam. The Testing Center does not provide envelopes or make copies of exams. Students must write their name on each exam for security. Faculty should deliver paper exams to TV 347. Do not send exams through inter-campus mail or fax. Students are responsible for scheduling appointments and arriving with appropriate testing materials and a picture ID. No cheating will be tolerated; students without valid IDs may not take an exam. We provide a range of testing services beyond placement exams, including: * Proctoring for online courses * Departmental testing (e.g., CPCE, ISA, Senior Exit Exams) * CLEP testing for the Spring Semester 2025 * Drop-in testing for Accuplacer math placement tests and First Year Writing placements (Monday-Friday, 9am-3pm) - no fee or appointment required. * Placement tests for English and Math available for completion at home by request. For all services except Accuplacer Math placement tests, an advance appointment is required.
