This interstellar object was discovered on July 1st, 2025, by the Asteroid Terrestrial-Impact Last Alert System (ATLAS) at Ro Hurtado, Chile. As it approached the inner Solar System, astronomers were initially unsure whether it was an asteroid or a comet. However, follow-up observations revealed its true nature - an active comet with a nucleus that's likely around 5 kilometers in diameter. The comet's trajectory is hyperbolic, meaning it will never return to our solar system, and its perihelion is expected on October 29th, 2025. 3I/ATLAS was initially given the designation A11pl3Z, but has since been officially recognized as a comet by the International Astronomical Union's Minor Planet Center (MPC). The discovery of this object marks the third time an interstellar comet has been confirmed to pass through our Solar System. Previous encounters include 1I/Oumuamua and 2I/Borisov. As 3I/ATLAS approaches its closest point to the Sun, it will be visible in the sky, albeit briefly. The object's size is uncertain due to the presence of a shell of reflective dust surrounding its nucleus. The comet's speed relative to the Sun is approximately 68 km/s at perihelion, which is quite high. Its distance from Earth will vary, but it will remain within our planet's orbit for a short time. The MPC has collected over 120 observations of 3I/ATLAS so far. ###ARTICLE Observations of the interstellar comet 3I/ATLAS revealed a diffuse tail and cometary activity, with a tail length of at least 25,000 km. The comet's coma had a reddish color indicative of dust, similar to previous interstellar comets like 2I/Borisov. Initial observations showed little variation in brightness, suggesting the comet's dust coma may be obscuring its rotating nucleus. ###ARTICLE Comet ATLAS, designated as 3I/ATLAS or C/2025 N1, was discovered in June 2025. It is the third known interstellar object to enter our solar system. On July 2, 2025, astronomers confirmed its status as an interstellar visitor after analyzing data from several sources. The comet's discovery sparked widespread interest and discussion among scientists and space enthusiasts. Researchers used the JPL Horizons Ephemeris System to track the comet's trajectory and predict its future path. They also utilized various online platforms, including NASA's website, to share information about the comet's existence and characteristics. As of July 4, 2025, astronomers had obtained several measurements of the comet's distance from Earth, with estimates suggesting it would pass within 1.3 astronomical units (AU) by mid-July. Studies indicate that Comet ATLAS is smaller than previously thought, with a diameter estimated to be around 100-150 meters. Its surface temperature was measured at approximately -230C, making it one of the coldest objects in our solar system. The comet's orbital eccentricity is relatively high, which suggests it may have originated from a region with high stellar density. Scientists were excited about the prospect of studying an interstellar object up close, as this would provide valuable insights into the composition and behavior of these enigmatic visitors. However, the comet's small size and distance made it challenging to gather detailed data. As of July 2025, Comet ATLAS was traveling at a speed of approximately 26 kilometers per second (km/s), which is relatively fast compared to other comets in our solar system. Its geocentric distance was predicted to be around 1.3 AU by mid-July, and its closest approach to Earth was estimated to occur on December 19, 2025. The discovery of Comet ATLAS has reignited interest in the study of interstellar objects and their potential for shedding light on the origins of our solar system. Further research is necessary to fully understand this enigmatic visitor and its significance within the context of astrophysics.
