Using a USB cable This option is the best for big file transfer, but transfer times depend on how it is what the USB type is. We have a list of available corrections for when your USB is not recognized or is not displayed. To transfer files from the iPhone using a USB cable, do the following: 1. Make sure that iTunes are updated. 2. Connect your iPhone to your PC or Mac using the USB cable. 3. Open iTunes and select your iPhone in the list. 4. Choose [Apple icon](#) > file sharing. 4. 5. During the transfer from iPhone: Select the files you want to transfer, then choose [Apple icon](#) > HAVE TO. [Apple icon](#) > and choose where to save the file and confirm. 6. During the transfer to iPhone: select [Apple icon](#) > Add. [Apple icon](#) > Click the files you want to transfer, then confirm. How to transfer files from iPhone without iTunes as we said, before the Catalina update, Mac users have also had to go through iTunes to transfer files from their iPhone to their Macs. With the update, though, only PC users have to go through that problem. iTunes is not the only way to Transfer files from the iPhone as you can use many different apps, including Airdrop and Google Photos depending on the type of file you are looking for to transfer. 1. Using the finder This option is only available for Mac users on MacOS versions Catalina and new MacOS. Using the Finder is similar to how Android phones connect with PC using USB cables. 1. Connect your iPhone with Mac using a USB cable. 2. Select yours From the side bar of the Finder. You may need to click [Apple icon](#) > trust [Apple icon](#) - if this is the first time that connects this device to your Mac. 3. Drag the files you want to copy between the iPhone window and the App window for iPhone. 4. Confirm if your files have been transferred. 2. Using e-mail You can transfer smaller files as documents and photos from your iPhone attaching attachment to e-mails. This works for any type of e-mail app like Gmail or Yahoo Mail or on a browser. Those who use Gmail can also export their iPhone contact list from your device. 1. Start your e-mail app or go to your web-based browser and log in. 3. Compose a new e-mail and connects the files you want to transfer. Most e-mails have file limits and can only manage smaller files. 4. Save the e-mail as a draft or send it to your email. 5. Open your email to your Mac or PC, then download the file from the saved or sent folder. 3. Using Bluetooth You can use Bluetooth to transfer files from iPhone to Windows PC until the computer has a Bluetooth adapter. Those who wish to transfer files into wireless mode to Mac must instead examine the guide for airdrop. 1. Activate Bluetooth on your iPhone and PC. Make sure your iPhone is set to [Apple icon](#) > Discoverable. [Apple icon](#) > 2. Right-click the Bluetooth icon on the desktop taskbar. 3. Move the mouse over "Bluetooth device, [Apple icon](#) > then select everything. 4. Select your iPhone on the list and enter the one-off passport (OTP) if it requires it. 5. You can now select files What you want to transfer from your iPhone to the Windows PC via Bluetooth. 4. Using the AIRPROP photo from Apple Support Airdrop is similar to the Bluetooth connection for iPhone when it comes to Mac. Use the Apple owner technology to transfer files via Bluetooth or Wi-Fi on associated devices or those on the same network. We have a more thorough guide to use AirProp from iPhone to Mac. There is also a guide on the use of Airdrop for Android file transfers for iPhone available. 1. Turn on Bluetooth or Wi-Fi of the devices you want to connect. 2. Click the Share button for the files you want to transfer. 3. Select the MAC computer from the list and confirm the transfer to your iPhone. 4. Confirm the between Switching on your Mac and accept the file sent. 5. Wait for the transfer to the end. 5. Using Google photos This file transfer method from an iPhone only works for photos and not for documents and other files. You can use this method for Mac and PC until you have a Gmail account. To start, you must first download the Google Photos app from Apple App Store. Google offers only limited space for most free users (15 GB starting from August 2021) shared between all apps on a Google account. Keep it in mind when you keep your Google photos synchronize to your iPhone. 1. On your iPhone, open the Google Photos app and select the profile icon. 2. Choose the settings and then turn on [Apple icon](#) > back up & sync. [Apple icon](#) > 3. On the computer, go to the Google Photos website and log in. 4. Select the photo you want to transfer, then click the three points at the top right corner and press the download. 6. Using iCloud Photo from Apple iCloud is the Apple product to compete against cloud storage services such as Dropbox, OneDrive and Google Drive. You don't simply use it to transfer files from iPhone to computers (PC and Mac), but you can use it to transfer contacts between iPhone and back up Apple devices. iCloud binders are connected to your Apple ID, which you will need when you do this option. 1. Make sure your icloud is turned on by going to the settings page and slide the iCloud button. 2. Log in to iCloud.com using the Apple ID you registered on your iPhone. 3. To use this option to transfer files from iPhone, you need to have a Dropbox account, which you can activate using a Google account or an Apple ID. You should also download, install and activate the Dropbox app on your iPhone. 1. Upload the Dropbox app. 2. Open the Dropbox folder you like your chosen files. 3. Press the Big Plus sign in the bottom of the screen. 4. Choose to upload files and locate the files you want to upload. 5. Select the file and click Upload. 6. Access the Dropbox website and download the files to your computer. 8. Using OneDrive You can take another path to transfer iPhone files to PC or Mac is to use OneDrive. This Microsoft's cloud storage service is available for both Android and iOS platforms. To use this option, you need to download, install and activate the app OneDrive on your iPhone and create an account using a Microsoft account. 1. Open the app OneDrive. 2. Click on the Blue Plus button in the top of the screen. 3. Select the file / s you want to transfer from your iPhone. 4. Select Done and confirm your decision. 5. Go to the OneDrive website. 6. Download the files you want to transfer. For a practical tutorial, we have a guide on how to use OneDrive to back up files. 9. Using other third-party app there's a myriad of other third party apps that offer to help you transfer files from iPhone to Mac and PCS. Among them there are others from Imobie, Mobimover Eyeus and Dr.Fone of Wondershare. If the above options do not work for you, this app might be worth trying at their own risk. Final words with the release of the iPhone 12 series and new versions of IOS, there may be more or less the ways in which you can transfer files from iPhone to other devices due to modifications and system limitations.
