Prisons are divided into three basic safety levels: maximum, medium and minimum. Minimum security prisons often resemble campuses or university campuses. They are reserved for non-violent criminals with relatively clean criminal records, or prisoners who have served most of their term in a higher security structure and displayed an exemplary behavior. An average security prison limits the daily movements of prisoners to a greater extent, but instead of cells usually have dorms, and prison is usually enclosed by a razor fence. The safety prisons of the razors are what they think most people think of prison. However, only a quarter of all prisoners in the United States is hosted in a maximum security structure. These types of prisons are reserved for violent offenders, those who have escaped (or have tried to escape) or prisoners that could cause problems in more low security prisons. They are surrounded by high walls seasoned with razor thread, and armed guards in the observation towers shoot anyone to do it "over the wall".
