I've 2 problems. 1) This game has zero graphic optimisation. Even on medium settings I drop down to 15fps at the city centers. So stupid. I think that's because of the game engine being too old. Because that GPU was able to make me play portal 2, dishonored, left for dead, etc. on high settings. 2) I've somewhat managed to connect my DS4 to my PC and steam thankfully recognized it. However, as the game itself tries to see my controller as an XB360 controller, I can't assign keys to different buttons. Or may be I'm doing something wrong. Just because it is a nice town and home of BMW. I read somewhere later, that best way to start are cities with 5 companies. They are supposed to give you best possibilities to develop your hired drivers. I did a bit of testing and research and found out, that there is something to that. My hired drivers in those cities were developing their skills faster than drivers in city with less companies. So based on my research the best cities to start are: Berlin, Milano and Paris. And right after them (very close) are Praha, Lyon, Salzburg and Strassbourg. These 7 are your best starting point for upgrading hired drivers. The 2nd best are Birmingham, Bratislava, Bremen, Brno, Liege, Liverpool, Manchester, Nurnberg, Plymouth, Rotterdam. The 3d best group is Dresden, Frankfurt, Geneve, Glasgow, Hannover, London, Mannheim, Osnabruck, Poznan, Swansea, Torino, Verona, Wien, Wrocław. Little below are Dortmund, Reims, Sheffield. 4th group are Aberdeen, Bern, Brussel, Calais, Cardiff, Carlisle, Dijon, Dover, Dusseldorf, Edinburgh, Erfurt, Felixstowe, Grimby, Groningen, Hamburg, Innsbruck, Kiel, Leipzig, Lille, Linz, Luxemburg, Magdeburg, Metz, Newcastle, Rostock, Southampton, Stuttgart, Szczecin, Zurich, Cambridge. I tried this, finally got enough money together to borrow a large sum and buy a truck, and there were NO deliveries available to me from Kassel - I may have fared differently with a couple of differently placed skill points. I also factor in depots within city limits, and I don't like starting in cities with a quarry nearby - even though those diggers are pure gold, getting them out of the quarry with a limited HP truck can be a bit of a struggle in the early going, not to mention time to/from the site. Once chosen, they can only access countries belonging to the same group as their choice (there's only one truck dealer in each group of countries). If players wish to expand their access to other countries, they must pay a fee (ranging from €30,000 to €52,000), and they can only expand to countries connected to those they already have access. Another difference between countries is that the fuel price varies between countries. List of featured countries[] Euro Truck Simulator 2[] With Euro Truck Simulator 2, Luxembourg and Slovakia were added to the game, while Spain and Portugal were omitted, as well as a major part of France and Italy. The map, on the other hand, became more detailed, and new cities were added to most countries. Seven map expansions have been released for Euro Truck Simulator 2, which expand specific countries or add new ones: Going East! Includes the rest of Poland, Czechia and Slovakia, and Hungary. Scandinavia: Includes Denmark, Norway and Sweden. Vive la France! Includes the rest of France, new roads in southeast of northern Italy. Italia: Includes the rest of Italy. Germany is central to most of Europe so it's a good even base. England is favoured by the English, but you have to contend with the Left side driving, differeng from the rest of Europe. Scandnavia, France and Italy are very pretty, but the roads are more complicated since they were developed later for the game.
