Going to college can sometimes seem like a series of difficult decisions. Not only do you have to do standardized tests like ACT or SAT, you also need to decide which colleges to apply and write (practically) a million applications! After all this, choosing your specialization sometimes seems the easy part. But not so fast! Many schools offer a variety of specialization opportunities, including a degree path indicated as a double specialization in which you focus not on one, but on two different subjects. This guide will reveal the mystery of what it means to double the specializations! A brief introduction In a nutshell: a double degree is a degree with two concentrations, more commonly known as majors. But what exactly does that mean? First, you need to understand the differences between a degree and a degree. The University of Bachelor offer a series of undergraduate courses at three different levels: Bachelor's degree, Master's degree and PhD degree. The first degree you get is a three-year degree, which takes about four years to be completed. There are different types of degrees assigned depending on your specialization. The two most common degrees are the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) A Bachelor of Arts is awarded in any field of liberal arts. These include studies such as history, philosophy, English and foreign language. A Bachelor of Science is obtained in science-related fields such as biology, chemistry, physics and mathematics. Some universities offer top-level diplomas, such as Princeton's Bachelor of Science in Engineering (B.S.E) or the Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S) of the University of Pennsylvania. Regardless of how it is called the bachelor's degree, the most important thing to remember is that a degree is how much you earn to complete all the university's requirements for a four-year degree. The Major Una major is a distinct area of study focused within your graduate field. (Now that you know what a degree is, we bet that this makes more sense!) So you can think of a degree as a study area within the purpose of a degree! Here is an example to make it even clearer: We say you go to Harvard because you want to be an engineer. Wait! There are many types of engineering, which require different knowledge and skills. That's why Harvard offers seven different engineering courses: applied mathematics, biomedical engineering, computer science, electrical engineering, engineering, environmental sciences and mechanical engineering, mechanical.If you want to work in cloud computing, you'll probably choose to specialize in computer science... and once you meet all the requirements of the program, you will graduate with a degree in Science! The Double Major When you double your specializations, you will get a single degree/diploma that lists concentrations in two majors. In other words, as a double degree you will complete the bachelor's requirements for two distinct specializations, both in a single degree field. That's what we mean: we say you want to enter politics, and hope to work abroad as part of the US Embassy in France. To do this, you know that you need a degree in political science and that you need to be bilingual in French. Fortunately for her, her university offers a B.A. in French and a B.A. in political science. This could be a difficult situation if you were to choose from one degree and the other, it would be difficult to determine which course of studies is most important! For this reason most universities offer a double specialization: it allows you to meet the requirements for both study addresses, which will both appear on the diploma. So, who has only a Bachelor in Political Science will get a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science, while your double degree will result in a Bachelor of Arts in Political and French Sciences! But what does it look like from a practical point of view? Let's take a look! Meet Sophia, who just got admitted to Cornell University. He decided to double his studies in history and philosophy (both part of the Bachelor of Arts). As part of the College of Arts & Sciences, Sophia's first task will be to complete all the basic college requirements for graduation. After looking at the list, Sophia knows she'll have to take at least sixteen lessons as part of her core. After that, Sophia takes a look at what courses she needs to take to graduate in history and philosophy. The history department will ask you to take nine history courses to earn a degree, and a philosophy degree requires a minimum of eight philosophy courses. To get a double degree, Sophia will have to meet all criteria for each degree and complete its major studies. While earning a double degree might seem daunting, it is definitely an attainable goal. In fact, 12.5% of university students graduated with a double degree in 2015. We will talk a little more about how to decide if a double degree is right for you in a moment, but first, let's take a look at what is a double degree. sboneham/Flickr What is a double degree A double degree is not the only alternative to a "typical" four-year degree offered by most universities. (Yes, this is right, there are even more choices!) While in this article we focus only on double specialization, it is important to have a short understandingalternatives to avoid confusion! A Double Major is not a Double Degree A Double Degree is exactly what it looks like: instead of getting a diploma multiple concentrations, you will get two separate levels in two separate fields! This happens when a student completes the requirements for majors that give separate degrees. For example, we say that a student wants to study history of art and biology. Since the history of art is a Bachelor of Arts and Biology is a Bachelor of Science, this person will earn two separate degrees (a B.A. and a B.S.!) Double degrees are considerably more rare than double majors because a student has to earn two separate degrees that often require different basic courses. If students are interested in another area that falls outside their graduation field, many choose to earn a minor rather than a double degree. A double major is not a minor The best way to think about a minor is like a "mini major" in another area of study that interests you! Minors usually require four or six additional courses, and are specifically designed to help students develop a little more knowledge in another area of interest. That is why minors are sometimes called "secondary" emphasis! For many students, a minor lets them dig in a field that completes their main field of study. For example, someone who studies American history may be minor in African-American studies, especially if they are interested in the civil rights movement. The important thing to remember is that a minor is how to immerse the finger in a subject, while a greater involves acquiring in-depth knowledge. That difference is reflected in your degree. While a double major lists both areas of study likewise, a minor is noticed as such, if it appears on your degree at all. This means that a double greater brings more weight, which can be very important depending on your future career! A double greater is not an emphasis Some majors require a student to choose an emphasis within the major itself. Unlike a minor, which is usually earned as part of a different program, an emphasis is a concentration on a specific subject area within a single major. For example, many English majors are required to choose an emphasis because the field is so wide. These can be a certain period of time, a certain kind, or even a specific skill (such as grammar)! The goal of an emphasis is to offer a more tailor-made study within a major without requiring additional courses. Unlike a minor, which is totally optional, emphasis is often required to earn some degrees. For example, if you're graduating in education, your department may require you to choose an emphasis such as elementary education, secondary education, or even special education. Emphasis areas vary between departments and universities, but keep in mind that an emphasis is adding less of a "typical" degree of four years. In terms of order of importance, a greater carries more weight than a minor, which carries more weight than an emphasis! Put another way, a second major gives you much more in-depth knowledge of a subject than a minor or emphasis.
