To access your photos stored in iCloud on various devices, simply sign into the iCloud account using the Apple ID and password, then navigate to the iCloud Photo Library. If you prefer not to use the Photos app to view your pictures and videos, you can also use the iCloud Drive feature to manage them. Accessing iCloud from a Windows PC is easier than it looks, and allows you to download pictures from an online library without much hassle. In iOS 16 or earlier, go to Settings / [Your Name] / iCloud / Photos, then turn on Sync this iPhone to automatically download photos. This option can be disabled, but using it means that all of your media will be stored in the cloud and saved at a lower resolution than if you choose not to use this feature. On iOS 15 or earlier, go to Settings / [Your Name] / iCloud / Photos and turn on iCloud Photos to sync media. The iPhone can also be set to optimize storage space by reducing the quality of images and videos stored on it, but keep in mind that high-quality pictures take up a lot of space. To access your media from an Android device or Mac computer, you'll need to download the respective apps Safari for Android or Chrome for Mac then sign into iCloud using your Apple ID. On both iOS and macOS devices, you can also download and upload files to iCloud Drive without any issues. Once your account is signed in, navigate to [icloud.com](https://icloud.com) and find the media that you've uploaded from your iPhone. Selecting a picture or video will cause it to be downloaded to the Files app. For those using Windows PCs and want to access their pictures stored online, go ahead and sign into iCloud with your Apple ID. The Pictures folder in the File Explorer can be accessed by opening any photo stored in that location, but make sure you're connected to a reliable network for this process. To make changes or view a picture or video from a Windows app, you can use [icloud.com](https://icloud.com) in Microsoft Edge or other browsers. First, log into [icloud.com](https://icloud.com) and click on a picture, then select download from the more menu at the bottom-right corner. Alternatively, you can open the Photos app, choose Photos > Settings, select iCloud, and click Download Originals to this Mac. You can also download photos directly from iCloud using the Shared Albums folder in the Photos app or by signing in to your Apple Account on [iCloud.com](https://icloud.com). To set up automatic sync between your iPhone, Mac, and Windows PC, go to the Settings app, tap your name, then tap iCloud, and select Photos. Enable Download and Keep Originals, then open the Photos app, choose Photos > Settings, select iCloud, and click Download Originals to this Mac. If you want to download individual photos or videos from iCloud, sign in to your Apple Account on [iCloud.com](https://icloud.com), click one or more photos or videos, hold down the command key on your Mac or control key on PC, and then click the Download button. You can also choose from options like Unmodified Originals, Highest Resolution, or Most Compatible. To download and save copies of your photos from [iCloud.com](https://icloud.com) to your Apple device, first ensure that iCloud Photos is turned on it should have a green background. If not, meaning it has a gray background, tap on it to enable the feature. Turn on iCloud Photos syncing. On your iPhone, iPad, or iPod Touch: 1. Open Safari on your device. 2. Go to [icloud.com](https://icloud.com) and log in using your Apple ID. 3. Tap Photos. 4. Tap Select in the top right corner of Safari. 5. Tap the desired photo or video. You can also select multiple photos and videos by tapping multiple thumbnails. 6. Tap the more icon the three vertical dots in the bottom right corner to open additional options. 7. Tap Download. On your Mac or PC: 1. Go to [icloud.com](https://icloud.com) and log in using your Apple ID. 2. Click Photos. 3. Click to choose your desired photo or video. Quick tip: Hold the Command key on a Mac or the Ctrl key on a PC to select more than one photo or video at a time. 4. Click and hold the Download button it looks like the cloud symbol combined with a down arrow located on the right side of the top toolbar. 5. Choose whether you want to download the Unmodified Original or Most Compatible versions and then click Download. To MacDo you want to transfer your iPhone photos to your Mac computer? Perhaps you want to create a backup of your photos on an external hard drive? With iCloud Photos, it's easy! First, ensure iCloud Photos is enabled on both your iPhone and your Mac. On your iPhone, go to Settings > Photos > iCloud Photos. On your Mac, click the Apple icon at the top left of the screen. Go to System Preferences > iCloud. Ensure the Photos option is switched on, then click Options. Next, ensure iCloud Photos is switched on. Click Done, then close the iCloud options box. With iCloud Photos enabled on both devices, the Photos app on your iPhone and Mac will be synced. Any time you take a new photo with your iPhone, it automatically appears in the Photos app on your Mac. From your Macs Photos app, you can download full-resolution images to the hard drive (or an external drive). To download all iCloud Photos to your computer using a keyboard shortcut, open [icloud.com](https://icloud.com) on your Windows Computer and login to your iCloud Account by entering your Apple ID and Password. Once signed-in, click on Menu Icon and select the Photos icon. Switch to Photos Tab and click on the First Photo, then press and hold Shift + Ctrl + Alt Keys and press the Down Arrow Key to select All iCloud Photos. Click on the Download icon to begin downloading all iCloud Photos to your computer. Unless you have changed the default settings, all iCloud Photos will be downloaded to 'Downloads' Folder on your computer. To download more than 1,000 Photos at once from iCloud to PC, download and install iCloud For Windows program on your computer and follow the on-screen instructions to Install iCloud For Windows. When prompted, Sign-in to your iCloud Account by entering your Apple ID and Password, select Photos option, and then select iCloud Photo Library option. To make it easy for you to open iCloud, add iCloud icon to the Taskbar by clicking on the Start button > right-click on iCloud > More > Pin to Taskbar. If you are planning to disable iCloud Photos, make sure that you copy all the Photos from Downloads to another Folder. Another method to download photos from iCloud to iPhone is to enable iCloud Photos on your iOS device and then select to download full-size copies of photos from iCloud to iPhone. However, this method will transfer all photos and videos from iCloud to your iPhone at once, and you have no chance to download pictures selectively. To download photos from your iPhone to your computer via [iCloud.com](https://icloud.com), follow these steps: Step 1: Open Safari and visit [icloud.com](https://icloud.com). Step 2: Sign in with your Apple account and tap "Photos." Step 3: Choose "Albums" and select the photo or video you want to transfer. Tap the "Share" button and then choose "Save Image" or "Save Video." Alternatively, if you have Shared Albums set up, you can download photos directly from the Photos app. To access iCloud photos on your iPhone: 1. Finally, scroll down and tap on "Save [Number] Images" in the sharing options, and voila! Those shared album photos will be saved right to your iPhone's Library. To transfer your existing images from iCloud Photo Library to your iPhone using iCloud, go to "Settings," then select "iCloud" and navigate to "Photos." For a more detailed process, follow these steps: Activate iCloud Photo Library by swiping the toggle switch to the right in "Settings" > "iCloud" > "Photos." Or tap More Download Options to see your other download options: Unmodified Originals (format as captured or imported), Highest Resolution (best quality for your device, typically HEIC or H.265), or Most Compatible (JPEG or MP4/H.264). Tap Download. Accessing and Downloading Photos from Shared Albums on iCloud to iPhone for Easy Viewing To download photos from shared albums on the iCloud to your iPhone's Camera Roll, follow these steps: Begin by opening the Photos app and navigating to the "Albums" tab. Locate the section for Shared Albums and select the desired album you wish to transfer from. Choose a photo you want to save, tap on the "Share" button, then select "Save Image" to save it from iCloud to your iPhone.
