Apple announced the iPhone months before the device went on sale, something the Cupertino, Calif. society never does. Then Apple cut the price of a third-party iPhone only two months after launch. Apple is not exactly famous for cutting prices. And last week, the company overthrown beans on the new feature of the iPhone business and launched independent software developers tools need to write third-party applications for Apple's hardware.
